- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1661.
- 2. By-law No. 203, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by deleting from the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, under the heading "Electrical—", the reference to—
 - "Speaker units &c." but Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies to such goods provided they are

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS Nos. 30483-31226 UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honorable Kenneth McColl Anderson, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1963, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.
