SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDY OPPORTUNITIES FOR COMMONWEALTH OFFICERS.

UNIVERSITY FREE PLACES.

A part-time free place covers fees for lectures, practical work, examinations and all statutory fees levied by the universities. However, it does not cover graduation fees. An officer awarded a partfree place will, subject to departmental convenience, be permitted to attend lectures, practical work and examinations on the subjects of his course for up to five hours per week without loss of

CONDITIONS.

The continuance of a free place will be subject to satisfactory progress during the course of study. In the event of examination failure the award will be reviewed to determine whether or not it should be withdrawn. Officers will be required to pay the fees for subjects being repeated. Officers should note that, in general, the Universities now require intending students to make some form of preliminary application. Each officer making an application for a free place should ensure that the preliminary application or enrolment is made at the appropriate time.

Full-time free places provide for full-time study to complete any degree course or to obtain a degree with honours. Where two fulltime years are required by the University as a condition of an honours degree an award may be made for a period of up to two academic years, subject to success in examinations each year.

SELECTION.

Awards will be made by the Public Service Board after considering the recommendations of the Selection Committees in each State.

BENEFITS.

A full-time free place covers fees for lectures, practical work, examinations and all statutory fees levied by the universities but it does not cover graduation fees.
