AND WHEREAS it is provided in sub-section (2.) of section two of the said Service and Execution of Process Act that, for the purposes of that Act, the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea shall be deemed to be one Territory of the Commonwealth:

NOW THEREFORE, I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby declare the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea to be a proclaimed Territory for the purposes of Part IV A of the Service and Execution of Process Act 1901-1963, and I also declare Norfolk Island to be a proclaimed Territory for the purposes of that Part.

GIVEN under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this eighth day of January in the year of Our (L.S.) Lord, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, and the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

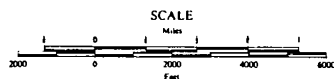
VARIATION OF THE PLAN OF LAYOUT OF THE CITY OF CANBERRA AND ITS ENVIRONS.

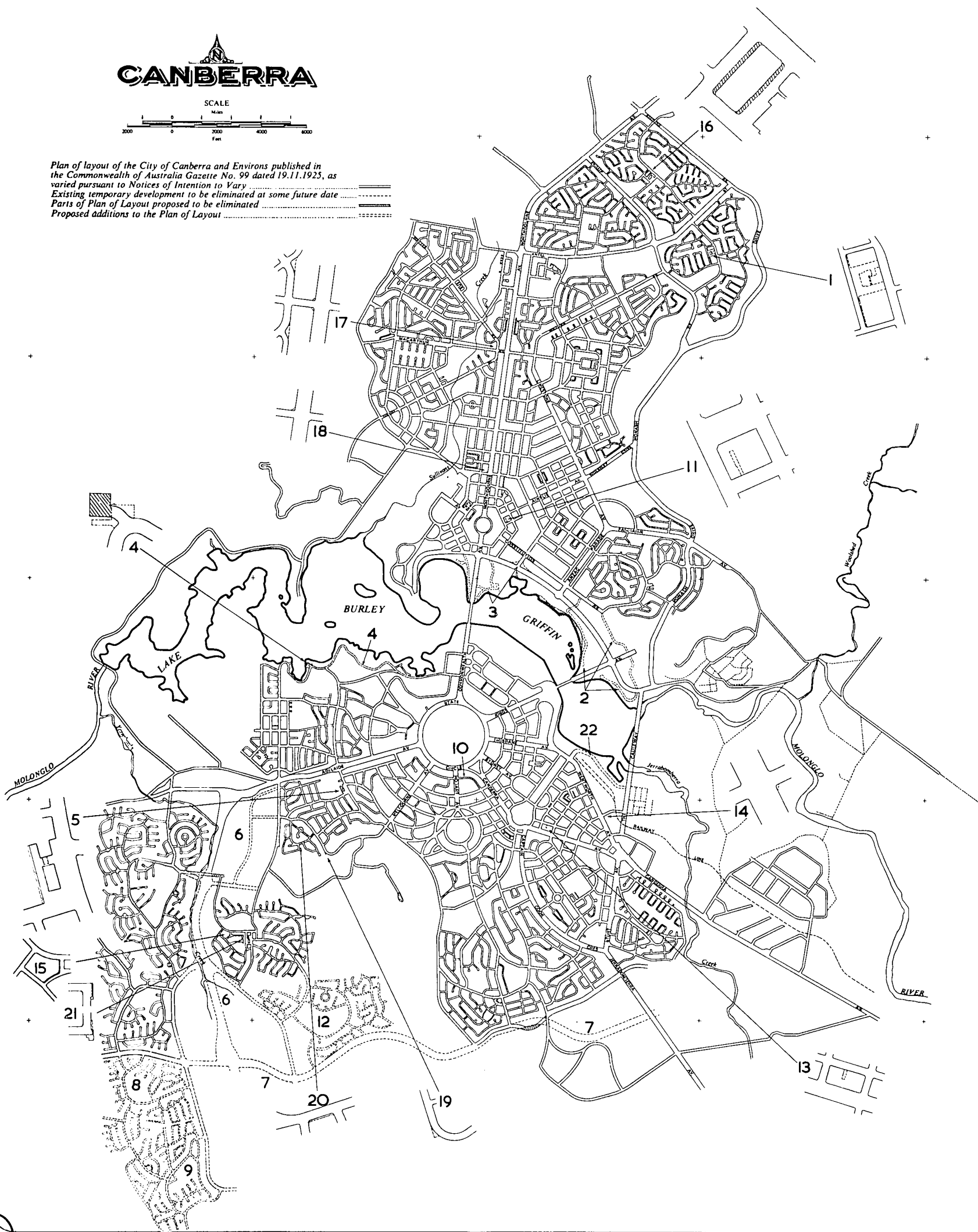

- (d) declare that, where there is an ester or ether of a substance that is, by reason of either of the last two preceding paragraphs, a narcotic drug such an ester or ether is, for the purposes of that Ordinance, a narcotic drug;
- (e) declare that, where there is a salt of a substance that is, by reason of one of the last three preceding paragraphs, a narcotic drug, such a salt is, for the purposes of that Ordinance, a narcotic drug; and
- (f) declare that a preparation or admixture containing any proportion of a substance that is, by reason of one of the last four preceding paragraphs, a narcotic drug (other than a preparation or admixture containing, where a proportion is stated in relation to such a substance, a proportion that is less than the proportion so stated) is, for the purposes of that Ordinance, a narcotic drug.
