# Defence Act 1903-1956. AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

AND WHEREAS regulation 816 of Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reasons of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

NOW THEREFORE I, William Philip, Vicount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims of compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

# THE SCHEDULE. New South Wales.

# Martins Mount.

During the period commencing on the eighteenth day of February, 1965, and ending on the nineteenth day of March, 1965.

All those portions of the Parishes of Curreeki and Teleraree in the County of Gloucester bounded by a line commencing in the south at the junction of the north-eastern boundary of Portion 79 in the Parish of Teleraree and the boundary of the Wang Wauk State Forest No. 295, thence due east for approximately 190 chains to the eastern branch of Bunts Creek, thence northerly along the course of Bunts Creek to where it joins Horses Creek, thence west following the northern boundary of Portion 99 in the Parish of Curreeki to where it meets the Myall-Bunyah Road, thence south along this road to the boundary of the Wang Wauk State Forest No. 295, thence along this boundary to the point of commencement.

# Kore Creek

During the period commencing on the eighteenth day of February, 1965, and ending on the nineteenth day of March, 1965.

All those portions of the Parishes of Viney Creek and Coweambah in the County of Gloucester bounded by a line commencing in the south at the junction of the western boundary of Portion 23 in the Parish of Coweambah and the Tea Gardens—Karuah Road, thence north-west along the road to the boundary of the Parishes of Viney Creek and Coweambah, thence north along this boundary and continuing for

approximately 110 chains to the Tea Gardens—Buladelah Road, thence due east for approximately 100 chains to Monkey Jacket Creek, thence due south for approximately 120 chains to the Tea Gardens—Buladelah Road, thence due west for approximately 75 chains to the point of commencement.

#### Baromee Point.

During the period commencing on the eighteenth day of February, 1965, and ending on the nineteenth day of March, 1965.

All those portions in the Parish of Carrington in the County of Gloucester bounded by a line commencing in the north-west at the junction of the north-western corner of Portion DP9939 and the shore of Port Stephens, thence proceeding west by north-west along the northern boundary of Portion DP9939 for a distance of approximately 30 chains, thence proceeding south by south-east to where the boundaries of Portions DP9938, 9939 and 13400 meet, thence due south to the shore of Port Stephens, thence along the shore line to the point of commencement.

### NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honorable Kenneth McColl Anderson, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1963, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier Determination is concerned, the Schedule lists, in the following order, the number of the Determination in the 65/— series, the kind of goods, the date on or before which the goods shall be shipped to Australia for entry for home consumption on arrival or be entered for home consumption (whichever applicable), if such is a condition of the Determination, further conditions, if any, and the Tariff Item applying to the goods. TIME following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

### Where to Lodge Appeals.

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. For this purpose the appropriate officer is—if the provisional promotion is made to an officer in:—
