FISHERIES NOTICE No. 20.

EQUIPMENT FOR TAKING WESTERN CRAYFISH.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 8 of the Fisheries Act 1952-1959, I, Charles Frederick Adermann, the Minister of State for Primary Industry, hereby prohibit the taking from the area of proclaimed waters specified in the First Schedule to this Notice of fish of the species specified in the Second Schedule to this Notice by means of a crayfish pot that does not contain in its side or in a side, immediately above its base, an unobstructed escape gap, as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape, measuring not less than two inches across from any point on the edge of the gap that is generally parallel to the base of the pot to any point on the opposite edge and not less than twelve inches across from any point on an edge of the gap that is perpendicular or nearly perpendicular to the base of the pot to any point on the opposite edge.

THE SCHEDULES.

First Schedule.

All that area of proclaimed waters, other than waters that are within the territorial limits of a State, contained within the area bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the parallel 34 degrees south latitude with the western shore of Australia at high-water mark; thence proceeding westward along that parallel to its intersection with the meridian 110 degrees 41 minutes east longitude; thence proceeding in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 25 degrees 50 minutes south latitude with the meridian 108 degrees 40 minutes east longitude; thence proceeding in a straight line to the intersection of the parallel 24 degrees south latitude with the meridian 109 degrees 35 minutes east longitude; thence proceeding eastward along that parallel to its intersection with the western shore of Australia at high-water mark; thence following the western shore of Australia at high-water mark to the point of commencement.

Species of Fish.

Crayfish of the species *Panulirus cygnus* (commonly known as Western crayfish.)
