PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit
DE L'ISLE Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1964, of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, reserve for such purposes in relation to the Northern Territory as he thinks fit, any unalienated Crown Lander.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to reserve for the purposes of the Postmaster-General's Department the land described in the Schedule hereto being Crown Land which is unalienated:

NOW THEREFORE I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown Land described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of the Postmaster-General's Department to be known as Reserve No. 1148.

THE SCHEDULE.

Description of the land referred to.

All that piece or parcel of land near the Town of Alice Springs, Northern Territory of Australia, containing an area of 5 acres 2 roods 38 perches more or less being Northern Territory Portion 876 and being more particularly delineated on Survey Plan B.308 lodged in the Lands and Survey Office, Darwin.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit DE L'ISLE Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

HEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1964, of the Northern Territory of Australia, it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, reserve for the purposes of national or public parks and gardens any unalienated Crown Lands:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to reserve for the purposes of a national park the land described in the Schedule hereto being Crown land which is unalienated:

NOW THEREFORE I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby reserve the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of a national park to be known as the Glen Helen Gorge National Park and Reserve No. 1147.

THE SCHEDULE.

Description of the land referred to.

All that piece or parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 954 acres and 10 perches more or less being Northern Territory Portion 831 and being more particularly delineated on survey plan A.322 lodged in the Lands and Survey Office, Darwin.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this fifteenth day of February, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

Crimes Act 1914-1960.

THEREAS it is provided by section 80 of the Crimes Act 1914-1960 that, among other places, any place belonging to the Queen or the Commonwealth which is for the time being declared by the Governor-General to be a prohibited place for the purposes of Part VII of that Act on the ground that information with respect thereto, or damage thereto, would be useful to an enemy or to a foreign power, shall be a prohibited place:

AND WHEREAS information with respect to or damage to the places described in the Schedules to this order, being places belonging to the Commonwealth, would be useful to an enemy:

AND WHEREAS the places described in the First Schedule to this order includes the place declared by an order made on the third day of November, 1961, and published in the Gazette on the sixth day of November, 1961, to be a prohibited place for the purposes of Part VII of the Crimes Act 1914-1960:

NOW THEREFORE I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

- (a) revoke the said order made on the third day of November, 1961; and
- (b) declare the places described in the Schedules to this order to be prohibited places for the purposes of Part VII of the Crimes Act 1914-1960 on the ground that information with respect thereto, or damage thereto, would be useful to an enemy.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Defence Act 1903-1956.

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence W Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

AND WHEREAS regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reasons of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

NOW THEREFORE I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

Apollo Bay-Marengo Area.

During the period commencing on the twenty seventh day of March, 1965, and ending on the ninth day of April, 1965.

That portion of the Parish of Krambruk in the County of Polwarth known as the Racecourse Reserve, bounded by a line commencing at a point 7 chains due west of the junction of the airstrip track and the Great Ocean Road and proceeding due west for 50.14 chains, thence on a bearing of 180 degrees for 6.6 chains, thence on a bearing of 270 degrees for 4.1 chains, thence on a bearing of 179 degrees 52 minutes for 13.3 chains, thence on a bearing

CUSTOMS BY-LAWS Nos. 1709-1713.

KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section 271 of the Customs Act 1901-1963, hereby make the By-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

- this examination, provided that failure at these final year examinations will render them ineligible for this examination.

3. Subject and Pass Conditions-

Subject. Written ... Duration.

Candidates must obtain 60 per cent, of the total marks allotted to pass the examination.

Officers who pass an examination under these conditions gain part-qualification for promotion or transfer as Senior Technician (Radio). 3. Subjects and Pass Conditions-

Subject.

- (i) Oral
- (ii) Practical

Candidates must obtain at least 60 per cent. of the aggregate maximum marks for the two subjects to pass the examination, or 60 per cent. of total marks in either subject to pass in that subject.

Officers who pass an examination under these conditions gain part-qualification for promotion or transfer as Senior Technician (Radio). To complete the qualification, officers must pass or have passed the examination for part-qualification as Senior Technician (Radio) (Written Examination).

Subject to exemption provisions under the "old" and "new" conditions, the full qualification may also be gained by obtaining at least 60 per cent, of the aggregate total marks allotted for the three subjects at examinations held within a four year period. Codes, principles of machines, tests and adjustments. Effects of Line faults and distortion.


