PROMOTIONS—SECTION 50 AND REGULATION 109.

THE following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals.

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. For this purpose the appropriate officer is—if the provisional promotion is made to an officer in:—

- (a) a State, the Public Service Inspector in that State;

- (f) the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, the Public Service Inspector, Perth;
- (g) any other place outside Australia, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, Canberra.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Grounds of Appeal.

The grounds of appeal are—

- (i) (a) Superior efficiency or (b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority.
- (ii) That the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient, where promotion is made to one of these positions, Assistant, Grade 1; Assistant, Grade 2; Assistant Storeman; Clerical Assistant, Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female), Grade 2; Labourer, Grade 1; Lift Attendant; Lineman, Grade 2; Mail Officer; Monitor; Monitor (Female); Orderly, Grade 1; Postal Assistant; Postal Officer; Postman; Preventive Officer, Grade 1; Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Storeman; Telephoneist.
