WHEREAS by section one hundred and three of the Crown W Lands Ordinance 1931-1964 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, reserve for such purposes in relation to the Northern Territory as he thinks fit, any unalienated Crown Lands:

Commonwealth of Australia to wit DE L'ISLE Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the Customs Act 1901-1963 it W is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamation, amongst other things, appoint wharfs and fix their limits:

AND WHEREAS by Customs Proclamation No. 909 published in the Gazette No. 59, dated the eleventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, the wharf formerly known as Messagerie Wharf but now known as Messageries Wharf at the port of Brisbane, in the State of Queensland, was appointed to be a wharf and its limits were fixed:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke that proclamation and to make other provision in its stead:

NOW THEREFORE I, William Philip, Viscount De L'Isle, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby-

THE following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals.

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. For this purpose the appropriate officer is—if the provisional promotion is made to an officer in:—

- (a) a State, the Public Service Inspector in that State;
 (b) The Australian Capital Territory, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, Canberra, unless the provisional promotion is to an office in the Department of Civil Aviation or the Postmaster-General's Department, when the appropriate officer is the Public Service Inspector, Sydney;

 (c) the Northern Territory. the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, Darwin;

 (d) Norfolk Island, the Public Service Inspector, Sydney;

 (e) the Territory of Papua or the Territory of New Guinea, the Public Service Inspector, Brisbane;

- (f) the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, the Public Service Inspector, Perth;
 (g) any other place outside Australia, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, Canberra.

 Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Grounds of Appeal.

The grounds of appeal are-

(i) (a) Superior efficiency or (b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority.

(ii) That the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient, where promotion is made to one of these positions, Assistant, Grade 1; Assistant, Grade 2; Assistant Storeman; Clerical Assistant, Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female), Grade 2; Labourer, Grade 1; Lift Attendant; Lineman, Grade 2; Mail Officer; Monitor; Monitor (Female); Orderly, Grade 1; Postal Assistant; Postal Officer; Postman; Preventive Officer, Grade 1; Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Storeman; Telephonist.
