Customs Act 1901-1963.

CUSTOMS BY-LAW No. 1725.

I, KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of Section 271 of the Customs Act 1901-1963, hereby make the following By-law.

By-law No. 1725.

Item 449 (A) (1).

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1725.
2. By-law No. 203, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by—
 - (a) deleting from the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, the reference to "Glassware, laboratory and scientific, etc."
 - (b) deleting from the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, under the heading "Textile goods—Yarns—Man-made fibres—", the reference to "Triacetate, etc."
 - (c) adding to the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, the following:—

Glassware, laboratory, hygienic and pharmaceutical, otherwise classifiable under Tariff Item 246 as follows:—

Articles of fused silica or fused quartz

Articles, other than of fused silica or fused quartz, viz.:—

Acidimeters, butyrometers, cryoscopes, galactometers, lactobutyrometers and similar instruments for testing dairy products

Bottles, specific gravity, with built in thermometers

Burettes, Schellbach

Ebullioscopes

Glasses, being solid shapes of coloured glass designed for use as reference standards

Slides, microscope

Tubes—

Electrically conducting coated
Melting point

Tubes and cells—

Having one or more faces optically ground or polished

Specially matched and graded for use in connection with scientific apparatus for measuring or comparing colour, fluorescence, or turbidity

Volumetric, low actinic amber

CUSTOMS (INTERMEDIATE TARIFF) ORDER No. 154.

I, KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section nine A of the Customs Tariff 1933-1964, hereby declare that, on and from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, the rate of duty set out in the column headed "Intermediate Tariff" in the Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1933-1964 (being that Schedule as proposed to be amended by Customs Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the eighth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five) in relation to an item in that Schedule the number of which is specified in the Schedule to this Order shall apply to goods included in that item that are the produce or manufacture of a country specified in the Second Schedule to the Customs (Intermediate Tariff) Order No. 142 made on the second day of September, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, and published in the Gazette on the tenth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four.

CUSTOMS TARIFF (PRIMAGE DUTIES) ORDER No. 184.

Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 7.

IN pursuance of Section 7 of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961, I, Kenneth McColl Anderson, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, hereby notify that, after inquiry and report by the Tariff Board, I am satisfied that Continuous Filament Secondary Acetate Yarn has been or is being sold to an importer in Australia at an export price which is less than the normal value of the goods at the date of exportation and that injury may thereby be caused or threatened to an Australian industry.

This notice may be cited as "Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 29" and shall have effect in relation to all such goods entered for home consumption on and after the 8th February, 1965.
