Defence Act 1903-1956. AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1956 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section A of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1964 that where, in an Act, the Governor-General is referred to, the reference shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include the person for the time being administering the Government of the Commonwealth and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be read as referring to a person so deemed to be included in the reference acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council:

AND WHEREAS regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Henry Abel Smith, the Administrator aforesaid, in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

Puckapunyal Area.

During the period commencing on the twenty-first day of May, 1965, and ending on the twentieth day of May, 1966.

All those pieces and parcels of land in the County of Dalhousie, Parish of Northwood designated as Lots 22, 22A and 25.

THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA.

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit HENRY ABEL SMITH Administrator. By His Excellency the Adminstrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section on hundred and three of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1964 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided that, subject to that Ordinance, the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, revoke, wholly or in part, any reservation or dedication of lands made in pursuance of any law in force in the Northern Territory at any time prior to the commencement of that Ordinance:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section sixteen A of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1964 that where, in an Act the Governor-General is referred to, the reference shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include the person for the time being administering the Government of the Commonwealth and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be read as referring to a person so deemed to be included in the reference acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council:

CEVELDED CO.

AND WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fourteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and published in the fifty-second Government Gazette of the year, dated the twentieth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, it was proclaimed that the Crown Lands described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation should be reserved for the purposes of the public railways:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the reservation of the said Crown Lands be revoked in part:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Henry Abel Smith, the Administrator aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the reservation of the Crown Lands described in the Schedule to this Proclamation.

THE SCHEDULE.

Description of the land referred to.

All that piece or parcel of land in the Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 6 acres 3 roods and 8 perches more or less the boundaries of which are described as follows:—

Commencing at a point which is at the north-eastern corner of section 728, Hundred of Bagot, thence southerly along the eastern boundary of said section and its production to intersect the production easterly of the southern boundary of section 743, thence easterly by said production for eight chains thence northerly at right angles to the southern side of a closed road south of Lot 3466 Town of Darwin thence westerly to the point of commencement.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

COURTS-MARTIAL—REVOCATION AND DELEGATION.

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of section eighty-seven of the Defence Act 1903-1964 I, Sir Henry Abel Smith, the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the delegation made under the said section eighty-seven of the Defence Act 1903-1956 on the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-two to every officer of the Military Forces who shall be holding the office or performing the duties of Commander, Australian Army Training Team, Vietnam, and do hereby delegate

to every officer of the Military Forces, not below the rank of lieutenant-colonel, who shall be holding the office or performing the duties of—

Commander, Australian Army Force, Vietnam-

- (a) the power to convene courts-martial;
- (b) the power to appoint officers to constitute courts-martial;
- (c) the power to confirm the finding, or finding and sentence, of any court-martial (other than, in the case of an officer, a sentence of death or a sentence of imprisonment, or to be cashiered or dismissed from Her Majesty's Service or from the Defence Force, or in the case of a soldier, a sentence of death or a sentence of imprisonment exceeding a term of two years), or to send back the finding and sentence or either of them for revision;
- (d) the power to mitigate or remit the punishment or any part of the punishment awarded by any sentence or to commute the punishment for any less punishment to which the offender might have been sentenced by court-martial; and
- (e) the power to suspend the execution or currency of any sentence on such terms and conditions (if any) as he thinks fit.

CUSTOMS BY-LAW No. 1744.

KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of Section 271 of the Customs Act 1901-1963, hereby make the following By-law.

By-law No. 1744.

Item 449 (A) (1):

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1744.
- 2. This by-law shall be deemed to have taken effect from 1st January, 1965.
- 3. By-law No. 203, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by-
 - (a) deleting from the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff
 Item 449 (A) (1) applies, under the heading "Textile
 fabrics not otherwise classifiable under Tariff Item 482
 (B)", the reference to—
 - "Woven fabrics of plain weave, &c."
 - (b) adding to the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A) (1) applies, under the heading "Textile fabrics not otherwise classifiable under Tariff Item 482 (B)", the following:—

Woven fabrics of plain weave, not being of terry or other pile weaves or of huckaback or honeycomb weaves, in widths not exceeding 54 inches and not exceeding 8½ ounces per square yard, of cotton or of flax or in chief part by weight of cotton or flax or cotton and flax, bleached or unbleached, not printed dyed or coloured, for use in a factory in the manufacture of tea towels having dimensions not exceeding 36 inches in length and 24 inches in width, under security.
