TLIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom, Australia and Her other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith:

To Our Trusty and Well-beloved—William Henry Johnston, Esquire, Deputy Crown Solicitor for the Commonwealth at Canberra in Our Australian Capital Territory.

GREETING:

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Judiciary Act 1903-1960 it is enacted that indictable offences against the laws of the Commonwealth shall be prosecuted by indictment in the name of the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth or of such other person as the Governor-General appoints in that behalf and that any such appointment shall be by Commission in the Queen's name and may extend to the whole Commonwealth or to any State or part of the Commonwealth:

AND WHEREAS by section seventy-one of the said Act it is enacted that when any person is under commitment upon a charge of an indictable offence against the laws of the Commonwealth, the Attorney-General or such other person as the Governor-General appoints in that behalf may decline to proceed further in the prosecution, and may, if the person is in custody, by warrant under his hand direct the discharge of the person from custody:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to appoint some person to prosecute indictable offences against the laws of the Commonwealth triable within Our Australian Capital Territory, and to exercise the powers described in section seventy-one of the said Act:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section sixteen A of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1964 that where, in an Act, the Governor-General is referred to, the reference shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include the person for the time being administering the Government of the Commonwealth and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be read as referring to a person so deemed to be included in the reference acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council:

NOW, THEREFORE, We do hereby appoint you to prosecute by indictment in your name indictable offences against the laws of the Commonwealth triable within Our Australian Capital Territory as fully and as effectually to all intents and purposes as Our Attorney-General of Our Commonwealth of Australia could prosecute those offences:

AND We do further appoint you as a person who may exercise the powers described in section seventy-one of the said Act:

PROVIDED that nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect the powers conferred by sections sixty-nine and seventy-one of the said Act upon Our Attorney-General of Our Commonwealth of Australia or the powers of any other person appointed by Us in pursuance of those sections.

WITNESS Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Henry Abel Smith, Administrator of the Government of Our Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, and in the fourteenth year of Our Reign.

Customs Act 1901-1963.

CUSTOMS BY-LAW No. 1740.

KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for L. Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section 271 of the Customs Act 1901-1963, hereby make the following By-law.

By-law No. 1740

Item 449(A)(1).

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. 1740.
- 2. This by-law shall be deemed to have taken effect from 10th May, 1965.
- 3. By-law No. 203, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, is further amended by:
 - adding to the list of goods in Section 3 to which Tariff Item 449 (A)(1) applies, the following-
 - Film, roll film, sheet or strip of non-cellular regenerated otherwise classifiable under Tariff Item cellulose, 365 (A)(4).

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honorable Kenneth McColl Anderson, in pursuance of section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1963, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Schedule appended hereto and limited to quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier Determination is concerned, the Schedule lists, in the following order, the number of the Determination in the 65/- series, the kind of goods, the date on or before which the goods shall be shipped to Australia for entry for home consumption on arrival or be entered for home consumption (whichever applicable), if such is a condition of the Determination, further conditions, if any, and the Tariff Item applying to the goods. SUBSTITUTE NOTICE No. 33.

KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for L, Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 139 of the Customs Act 1901-1963, hereby direct that the Schedule to Substitute Notice No. 1, published in Gazette No. 23, dated 10th March, 1961, as amended, be further amended by adding to the goods listed in the first and second columns of that Schedule the following:-
