QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 68G.

Commonwealth of Australia to wit HENRY ABEL SMITH By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1.) of section thirteen of the Quarantine Act 1908-1961, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, declare any ports in Australia to be first ports of entry for oversea vessels:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1a.) of that section that the power to declare first ports of entry shall extend to authorize the declaration of a port to be a first port of entry for all oversea vessels, or for oversea vessels from any particular place, or for any class of oversea vessels:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section sixteen A of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1964 that where, in an Act, the Governor-General is referred to, the reference shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include the person for the time being administering the Government of the Commonwealth and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be read as referring to a person so deemed to be included in the reference acting with the administrator.

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Henry Abel Smith, the Administrator aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby declare the port situated at Port Hedland in the State of Western Australia, and the port situated at Bundaberg in the State of Queensland, to be first ports of entry for oversea vessels, not being oversea vessels engaged in navigation by air.

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 69G.

Commonwealth of

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by section twenty-six of the Quarantine Act 1908-1961, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may by proclamation fix the position of the quarantine line for any port:

AND WHEREAS by Quarantine Proclamation No. 9g published in the Gazette on the twelfth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, the Governor-General fixed the position of the quarantine line for, amongst other ports, the port of Bundaberg in the State of Queensland:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke that Proclamation in so far as it fixes the quarantine line for the port of Bundaberg and to make other provision in its stead:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section sixteen a of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1964 that where, in an Act, the Governor-General is referred to, the reference shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include the person for the time being administering the Government of the Commonwealth and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be read as referring to a person so deemed to be included in the reference acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Henry Abel Smith, the Administrator aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—

- (a) revoke Quarantine Proclamation 9G in so far as it fixes the position of the quarantine line for the port of Bundaberg in the State of Queensland; and
- (b) fix, as the position of the quarantine line for that port, the line described in the Schedule to this Proclamation.

THE SCHEDULE.

Quarantine Line at the Port of Bundaberg.

A line commencing at the intersection of the parallel 24 degrees 45 minutes 36 seconds south latitude with the meridian 152 degrees 24 minutes 45 seconds east longitude, being the Burnett Head Light at Bundaberg; thence proceeding north (true) for one nautical mile; thence proceeding west (true) to the coast of Australia at high-water mark.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI.
