PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of
Australia to wit
CASEY
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-
General in and over the Common-
wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section fifty-four of the Lands Acquisition Act 1955-1957 it is provided, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, revoke or alter the setting apart or dedication for or to a public purpose of land which is vested in the Commonwealth, whether set apart or dedicated in pursuance of the section or otherwise:

AND WHEREAS the lands described in the Schedule to this Proclamation are lands which are vested in the Commonwealth and are reserved for the purpose of the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organization:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the setting apart of the said lands be revoked:

NOW THEREFORE I, Richard Gardiner, Baron Casey, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby revoke the setting apart of the lands described in the Schedule to this Proclamation.

THE SCHEDULE.

Description of the land referred to.

Firstly: All that piece or parcel of land in the Katherine Area, containing an area of 14 acres 2 roods 20.7 perches more or less, being part of Northern Territory Portion 275; part of Northern Territory Portion 584 and part of Northern Territory Portion 796: Commencing at a point at a distance of 335.62 links on a bearing of 58 degrees 3 minutes from the most northern corner of Northern Territory Portion 796 and bounded thence by lines bearing 355

degrees 45 minutes 12 seconds 1947.25 links; 107 degrees 30 seconds 817.9 links; 180 degrees 15 minutes 1529.3 links; 211 degrees 47 minutes 1071.3 links; 354 degrees 48 minutes, 740.5 links to the point of commencement.

Secondly: All that piece or parcel of land in the Katherine Area, containing an area of 8 acres 24.6 perches more or less, being part of Northern Territory Portion 796: Commencing at the most northern corner of the said Northern Territory Portion 796 and bounded thence by lines bearing 174 degrees 48 minutes 987.5 links; 197 degrees 3 minutes 1264.7 links; 325 degrees 30 seconds 778.2 links; 25 degrees 4 minutes 30 seconds 1717 links to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this seventh day of October in the year of Our (L.S.) Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI.

THE Minister for Customs and Excise, the Honourable Kenneth McColl Anderson, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1965, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI. of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier Determination is concerned, the Table lists, in the following order, the number of the Determination in the 65/- series, the kind of goods, the date on or before which the goods shall be entered for home consumption, if such is a condition of the Determination, further conditions, if any, and the Item of the First or Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff applying to the goods. THE following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals.

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. For this purpose the appropriate officer is—if the provisional promotion is made to an office in:—

Grounds of Appeal.
