Navigation Act 1912-1966

ORDER OF EXEMPTION UNDER SECTION 422A

IN pursuance of section 422A of the Navigation Act 1912-1966, I, Richard Gardiner, Baron Casey, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, being satisfied, as regards the following class of ships, namely, ships:

(a) registered in Australia;

(b) of less than 150 tons gross registered tonnage;

(c) normally engaged on voyages between any of the following ports:

(i) Townsville;

(ii) a port in the State of Queensland that is north and west of Townsville; and

(iii) Daru in the Territory of Papua; and

(d) the masters of which are persons having such qualifications as the Minister for Shipping and Transport approves,

that circumstances exist as render compliance, by that class of ships, with the requirements of sections 14, 14a, 41, 43, 44, 45, 45a and 138a of the Navigation Act 1912-1966 impracticable, hereby direct, by this Order, that that class of ships shall not, except when engaged on a voyage other than a voyage referred to in paragraph (c) above, be required to comply with the requirements of those sections.



 - (a) there being in force at the time of the issue, offer or invitation in relation to any interest in that Fund a deed containing all provisions an approved deed for the purposes of the said sub-section (1.) of section eighty-three must contain, except that such a deed need not comply with sub-paragraphs (ii), (iii) and (iv) of paragraph (b) of sub-section (1.) of section eighty of that Ordinance, or with sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph (f) or sub-regulation (1.) of regulation 12 of the Companies Regulations of the Australian Capital Territory:
