Defence Act 1903-1966

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1966 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry, survey or use:

AND WHEREAS regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reasons of any entry, survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of that occurrence of the damage or loss:

NOW THEREFORE I, Richard Gardiner, Baron Casey, the Governor-General aforesaid in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reasons of that entry and use shall be submitted.

THE SCHEDULE Victoria

Jerusalem Creek

During the period commencing on the first day of March 1967 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1967, the area described as follows:

All that land in the Parishes of Thornton and Darlington within a boundary beginning at a point where the New Jamieson-Eildon road crosses the Big River; thence north along the west bank of the Big River, thence north northwest along the west shoreline of the Big River Arm of the Eildon Weir; thence west, south and north along the shoreline of Jerusalem Inlet on the Eildon Weir to a point where the old Jamieson Road enters the Weir excluding the use of any portion of the Eildon Weir foreshore throughout its length for a distance of 20 chains inland from the high water mark; thence west, south and west along a bush road to its junction with the New Jamieson and Dry Creek road; thence in a south and south easterly direction along this road to the point where it crosses the Big River, the point of commencement.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI

THE Minister of State for Customs and Excise, Senator the Honourable Kenneth McColl Anderson, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1966, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier Determination is concerned, the Table lists, in the following order, the number of the Determination in the 66/- series, the kind of goods, the date on or before which the goods shall be entered for home consumption, if such is a condition of the Determination, further conditions, if any, and the Item of the First or Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff applying to the goods. An officer whose salary before transfer or promotion was more than \$2,833 will be paid an allowance to bring his salary as a trainee to that which he was receiving at the time of transfer or promotion, provided that the total of such salary and allowance does not exceed \$3,743. Any higher duties allowance which trainees were receiving prior to commencing the course will continue throughout the course subject to the following conditions:
