#### PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit CASEY Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation published in the Gazette of the first day of September, 1955, it was proclaimed that the electoral divisions of the State of Western Australia shall be divided into subdivisions as set out in the Schedule to the said Proclamation.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the Electoral Division of Fremantle of the said State shall be divided into subdivisions differing from those set out in the Schedule to the aforesaid Proclamation.

NOW THEREFORE I, Richard Gardiner, Baron Casey, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council and in pursuance of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1966 do hereby proclaim that the Electoral Division of Fremantle in the State of Western Australia shall be divided into subdivisions as set out in the Schedule to this Proclamation in lieu, to the extent they differ, of the subdivisions as set out in the Schedule to the Proclamation published in the Gazette of the 1st September, 1955.

# **SCHEDULE**

Commonwealth of Australia STATE OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA Subdivisions of Electoral Division of Fremantle

# Subdivision of Applecross.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of the Swan River with the prolongation northerly of the centre line of North Lake Road and extending generally north-easterly along the centre line of the Swan River aforesaid to a point situate east of Point Currie (Pelican Point); thence generally southerly, upwards, to and along the centre line of the Canning River and Bull Creek to a point

situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of Canning Location 27; thence southerly to and along that boundary to the centre line of High Road; thence generally westerly along that centre line to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre line of Clements Road; thence northerly to and along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Davy Street; thence westerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Barnard Street; thence northerly and north-westerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Doney Street; thence north-easterly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Canning Highway; thence generally westerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of North Lake Road aforesaid and thence northerly along the prolongation northerly of the centre line of North Lake Road to the starting point.

# Subdivision of Melville.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of a line joining the south-western corner of Swan Location 73 and the intersection of the centre lines of Stevens Street and Carrington Street with the centre line of Stock Road and extending generally northerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Canning Highway; thence generally easterly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Doney Street; thence south-westerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Barnard Street; thence south-easterly and southerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Davy Street; thence easterly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Clements Road; thence southerly along that centre line and its prolongation southerly to the centre line of High Road; thence generally westerly along that centre line to the eastern boundary of Swan Location 73 and thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the starting point.

## Subdivision of Palmyra.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre line of the Swan River with the prolongation northerly of the centre line of North Lake Road and extending southerly along that prolongation to the centre line of Canning Highway; thence generally westerly along that centre line

to its intersection with the centre line of Stock Road; thence generally southerly along that centre line to a line joining the south-western corner of Swan Location 73 and the intersection of the centre lines of Stevens Street and Carrington Street; thence westerly to that intersection; thence northerly along the centre line of Carrington Street aforesaid to its intersection with the centre line of High Street; thence westerly along that centre line to its inter-section with the centre line of Robinson Street; thence northerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Marmion Street; thence westerly along that centre line to its intersection with the centre line of Petra Street; thence northerly along that centre line and onwards to its intersection with the centre line of the Swan River aforesaid and thence generally northeasterly and generally south-easterly along that centre line to the starting point.

## ORDER APPROVING AMENDMENT OF THE BYE-LAWS OF THE AUSTRALIAN ACADEMY OF SCIENCE

WHEREAS by Letters Patent of Her Majesty the Queen bearing date the second day of February, 1954, the Australian Academy of Science was by Charter passed under the Great Seal constituted into a body corporate:

AND WHEREAS by clause 14 of the Charter it is provided that a majority of not less than three fourths of the Fellows of the said Academy present in person or by proxy and voting at a General Meeting of the Fellows of the Academy specially called for the purpose of which due notice has been given or the like majority of the Fellows voting by means of a postal ballot as provided in the Charter shall have power from time to time to make such Bye-laws as shall seem requisite and convenient for the regulation, government and advantage of the Academy, its members and property and for the furtherance of its objects and purposes and from time to time to revoke or amend any Bye-law or Bye-laws previously made but so that the same be not repugnant to the provisions of the said Charter or to the laws and statutes of the Commonwealth of Australia or any State or Territory thereof:

AND WHEREAS it is futher provided by the said clause 14 that no such Bye-law, revocation or amendment shall take effect until approved by His Excellency the Governor-General in Council of the Commonwealth of Australia:

AND WHEREAS certain Bye-laws were made in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter on the twelfth day of November, 1954, and were approved by the Governor-General in Council on the sixth day of April, 1955:

AND WHEREAS amendments were made subsequently to the Bye-laws of the Academy in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter by a majority exceeding three-fourths of the Fellows present in person ir by proxy and voting at a General Meeting of the Fellows of the said Academy specially called for the purpose of which due notice was given or by the like majority of the Fellows voting by means of a postal ballot as provided in the said Charter, which amendments were approved by the Governor-General in Council on the fourth day of Febuary, 1959, the ninth day of September, 1961, the twenty-fifth day of October, 1962, the

twenty-second day of August, 1963, the nineteenth day of February, 1965, the tenth day of December, 1965, and the twenty-eighth day of July, 1966;

AND WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter a majority exceeding three-fourths of the Fellows voting by means of a postal ballot recently amended the Bye-laws of the Academy by:-

- (a) inserting at the end of Chapter I the following: 'A person may be deemed to be normally resident in Australia if his absence from Australia is due to his holding an academic or other appointment of a short-term or temporary character':
- (b) inserting in paragraph b of Section 3 of Chapter II, immediately after the words 'Subject to', the following: 'paragraph c of this Section, and to';
- (c) inserting at the end of Section 3 of Chapter II the following new paragraph:
  - 'c At any Annual General Meeting one Fellow may be elected under this paragraph in addition to those elected under paragraph b of this Section, if
  - (i) At the time of his election the number of Fellows of the Academy who are not normally resident in Australia exceeds the number of Fellows (still living) who have been elected under this paragraph.
  - (ii) having been normally resident outside Australia, he has resided in Australia for not less than eighteen months nor more than four years immediately preceding the time of his election and at that time holds an academic or other appointment in Australia (not being an appointment of a short term or temporary character); and
  - (iii) the provisions of Sections 5, 6, 7 and 8 have been complied with in respect of him; and
- (e) inserting in paragraph a of Section 8 of Chapter II immediately after the words 'for ordinary election' the words 'under that paragraph' and by inserting at the end of the same paragraph

'At any such meeting the Council may also resolve upon the name of a candidate (being a candidate recommended by the Sectional Committees for election under paragraph c of Section 3) to be recommended by it for ordinary election under that paragraph':

AND WHEREAS the said amendments are not repugnant to the provisions of the said Charter or to the laws and statutes of the Commonwealth of Australia or any State or Territory thereof:

NOW THEREFORE, I, RICHARD GARDINER, BARON CASEY, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, DO BY THIS ORDER APPROVE the said amendments of the Bye-laws of the Australian Academy of Science.

# INSTRUMENT OF EXEMPTION FROM THE DUMPING DUTY

- I, KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, the Minister of State for Customs and Excise, being satisfied, with respect to the goods specified in the Schedule to this instrument, that—
  - (a) the tariff classification in the First Schedule to the Customs Tariffs 1966 that applies to the goods, or, where the goods are goods to which section twenty-one of that Act applies, the item in Part I of the Second Schedule to that Act that applies to the goods, is expressed to apply to goods, or to a class or kind of goods, as prescribed by by-law; and
  - (b) suitably equivalent goods the produce or manufacture of Australia are not reasonably available,

hereby, in pursuance of sub-section (4.) of section 7 of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965, exempt the goods so specified from the Dumping Duty.
