Defence Act 1903-1966

AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 69

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section sixty-nine of the Defence Act 1903-1966 it is enacted that the Governor-General may give a general or particular authority to the Defence Forces, or any part thereof, to enter upon and survey any lands or use them for training, manoeuvres, or other naval, military or air force exercises or purposes and that compensation shall be made, in the manner prescribed, for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of the lands, by reason of such entry survey or use:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section sixteen A of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901-1966 that where, in an Act, the Governor-General is referred to, the reference shall unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include the person for the time being administering the Government of the Commonwealth and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be read as referring to a person so deemed to be included in the reference acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council:

AND WHEREAS regulation 816 of the Australian Military Regulations prescribes the manner in which compensation shall be made for any damage or loss sustained by the owner or occupier of lands by reason of any entry survey or use of the lands under an authority and provides, by sub-regulation (1) of that regulation, that all claims for compensation shall be submitted to the officer indicated for that purpose in the authority within seventy-two hours of the occurrence of the damage or loss:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Edric Montague Bastyan, the Administrator aforesaid, in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby authorise such members of the Military Forces as are directed in writing by the officer for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Commander of the Command in which are situated the lands described in the Schedule of this Authority, to enter upon the said lands and use them for training, manoeuvres or other military exercises or purposes for the period specified in the said Schedule, and hereby designate the Commander of the Command concerned as the officer to whom all claims for compensation for any damage or loss by reason of that entry and use shall be submitted.

Puckapunyal Area

During the period commencing on the first day of June 1967, and ending on the thirty-first day of May, 1968.

All those pieces and parcels of land in the County of Dalhousie, Parish of Northwood designated as Lots 22 and 25.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI

THE Minister of State for Customs and Excise, Senator the Honourable Kenneth McColl Anderson, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1966, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Each of the contracts of insurance insures the person against any such monetary loss and other monetary detriment arising during the period of fifteen years commencing on the sixteenth day of March, 1967.

One contract insures against loss and detriment resulting from expropriation of property, the extent of the liability under the contract being limited to \$135,000. The second contract insures against loss and detriment resulting from damage to or destruction of property caused by a warlike operation, the extent of the liability being limited to \$90,000. The third contract insures against loss and detriment resulting from inability to transfer money to Australia from another country, the extent of the liability being limited to \$135,000.



- (e) Fainting
- (f) Haemorrhage (e.g. epistaxis)

Bandaging

 - Infection; mode of transmission.
 - Prevention of spread of infection and barrier nursing.
 - General nursing care of the patient with pulmonary tuberculosis.
 - Disease and social importance, and information relating to tuberculosis, venereal disease and cancer.
- 2. Nursing care of sick children, observations, routine nursing care, bathing, clothing and toilet needs.

3. Nursing care of the geriatric patient.

Some lectures will be given during the month in Preliminary School. Frequent visits will be made to wards during this time. Lectures not given in Preliminary School will be given over the next 6 months. The written examination will be held 3 months later after which time certificates will be issued to the successful aids.

8. General—Training Course:—Hospital Assistants Grade 1, Orderlies Grade 1, and unqualified persons designated as Nursing Aides, enter a twelve months' course of training at the end of which they contest an examination under these conditions.

The course consists of actual on-the-job training, lectures and practical demonstrations.

The Nursing Aide Training Course Certificate will be issued to successful trainees after they have satisfactorily completed twelve months' actual practical training.

A candidate who is unsuccessful at the end-of-course examination will be reverted to his/her former position. However, he/she may contest the next examination and if successful will qualify for the position of Nursing Aide.
