THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit CASEY Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

- I, RICHARD GARDINER, BARON CASEY, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 111 of the Crown Lands ordinance 1931-1966 of the Northern Territory of Australia:
 - (a) extend, from and including the date on which this proclamation is published in the Northern Territory Government Gazette, the area of the Town of Nightcliff to include the lands described in the Schedule to this proclamation; and
 - (b) set apart as town lands all Crown land within the said extended area.

THE SCHEDULE

All that piece or parcel of land at Nightcliff Hundred of Bagot, County of Palmerston, Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 2965 acres more of less; Commencing at a point being the most eastern south-eastern corner of the existing Town of Nightcliff appearing in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No. 64 of 21 July 1966, such point being on the southern side of McMillans Road; thence northerly by the existing boundary of the Town of Nightcliff to the high watermark of the Timor Sea; thence generally north easterly and south easterly by the said high watermark to a point due north of the north eastern corner of Hundred of Bagot Portion 1374 thence due south to the said corner; thence generally southerly and westerly by the boundaries of the said Portion to the point of intersection with the northern prolongation of the eastern boundary of Hundred of Bagot Portion 1356; thence southerly by that prolongation and by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said Portion to its intersection with an eastern boundary of the Lee Point Road; thence generally south westerly by the eastern boundary of the said road and its prolongation southwesterly to its intersection with the southern boundary of McMillans Road thence westerly by that southern boundary of the point of commencement.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the Commonwealth this fourteenth day of August, in the year of Our (L.S.) Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty seven and in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

SECOND SCHEDULE

By-laws Nos S642 to S644

I, KENNETH McCOLL ANDERSON, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1967, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE By-law No. S642

Item No. 14 Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S642.
- 2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 January 1968.
- 3. Item 14 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1967 applies, unless the contrary intention appears, to Goods, imported by:
 - (a) a passenger aged eighteen years or older; and
 - (b) as determined by the Minister and subject to such exclusions from classes of goods or restrictions as to quantities or value of goods as may be determined by the Minister, other passengers,

being goods as follows:

- (A) Furniture and household goods that have been bona fide in use and possession overseas by the passenger for a period of not less than twelve months immediately preceding his departure for Australia.
- (B) Personal effects, that are the passenger's own exclusive property, are or have been in his possession, are suitable for his own use, and are not intended for commercial purposes, and being goods that are not imported in commercial quantities, as follows:
 - A passenger's own wearing apparel including articles of fur apparel that:
 - (a) have been in the passenger's use and possession for a period of not less than twelve months preceding his departure for Australia; or
 - (b) have a value per article not exceeding \$150,

but not including any other articles of fur apparel

- (2) Articles of personal use of a kind normally carried on the person or in the passenger's personal baggage, including jewellery, brushes, toilet requisites, articles for personal adornment, binoculars and articles of a utilitarian nature, but not including:
 - (a) cigarettes, cigars and tobacco;
 - (b) spirituous liquors and beverages;
 - (c) radio receivers, radio transmitters, television receivers, tape players, tape recorders, dictating machines, gramophones, or any combination thereof, electrically operated;
 - (d) fur apparel; or
 - (e) slide viewers or image projectors
- (3) Radio receiving sets, battery operated, of the kind normally carried in the hand or on the person, not in excess of one article per passenger aged ten years or older, but not including television sets or radio sets incorporating types of sound reproducers other than a gramophone
- (4) Portable battery operated mechanical appliances, not in excess of one appliance specified in one only of the following classes of goods for any one family:
 - (a) gramophones, with or without gramophone records;
 - (b) tape players, withor without prerecorded tapes;
 - (c) tape recorders, with or without recording tapes;
 - (d) dictating machines, with or without recording tapes discs or wire;
 - being appliances that do not incorporate a radio or television receiver
- (5) Tobacco products not in excess of 1 lb weight per passenger aged eighteen years or older. For the purposes of this clause 400 cigarettes shall be deemed to equal 1 lb in weight
- (6) Spirituous beverages not in excess of ½ gallon per passenger aged eighteen years or older

- (7) Films, exposed (or exposed and developed) for cinematographs and recording incidents of the passenger's travels abroad
- (8) Typewriters of a kind designed to be carried in the hand
- (9) Personal sporting requisites including sporting rifles, rifles for range competitions, sporting guns, camp equipment of travelling sportsmen and riding saddles
- (10) Hand instruments of a kind used by the medical, dental or veterinary profession
- (11) Hand tools of a kind used by tradesmen
- (12) Portable equipment of the kind ordinarily owned by employee workers for the carrying out of their particular trades

By-law No. S643

Item No. 15 Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S643.
- 2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 January 1968.
- 3. Item 15 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1967 applies, unless the contrary intention appears and subject to the next succeeding paragraph, to Goods, imported by:
 - (a) a passenger aged eighteen years or older; or
 - (b) as determined by the Minister and subject to such exclusions from classes of goods or restrictions as to quantities or value of goods as may be determined by the Minister, other passengers,

being goods as follows:

- (1) Bicycles and motor cycles, with or without side cars
- (2) Goods not in excess of one article specified in each of the following four classes of goods for any one family:
 - (a) motor cars, vans or trucks,
 - (b) non-motorised caravans,
 - (c) yachts, motor boats, boats and the like, being vessels of a kind:
 - (i) suitable for transportation by road on a boat trailer of a kind readily drawn by a motor car or station wagon; and
 - (ii) designed principally for sporting purposes or recreational use in sheltered waters,
 - (d) box, boat or other similar trailers, non-motorised, being goods in respect of which:
 - (e) evidence is produced to and to the satisfaction of the Collector that:
 - (i) the passenger has come to Australia with the intention of forthwith taking up permanent
 - residence in Australia; and

 (ii) the goods were, for the whole of the period of
 fifteen months immediately preceding the passenger's
 departure for Australia, personally owned and used
 overseas by the passenger in the country in which
 he was living; and
 - (f) security is given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector that the goods will not be sold or otherwise disposed of in Australia by or on behalf of the passenger, or in the event of his prior decease, by or on behalf of his legal personal representative, within two years after the date of their importation into Australia
- (3) Machinery, plant and equipment, second-hand, not being goods or goods of a kind named in a preceding subparagraph, being the personal property of a passenger aged eighteen years or older who has come to Australia for the first time and who intends to reside forthwith permanently in Australia, under security, and subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) evidence is produced to the Collector that the goods have been in the passenger's personal use and possession overseas for not less than one year immediately preceding his departure for Australia;
 - (b) the Collector is satisfied that the passenger is or will be in a position to put the goods to his own use;
 - (c) the goods will, for a continuous period of two years, be put to use in Australia by the passenger for the purpose for which they are intended; and
 - (d) the goods will not be sold, leased, hired, mortgaged or otherwise disposed of, by or on behalf of the passenger, or in the event of his prior decease, by or on behalf of his legal personal representative, before the expiration of the two-year period referred to in sub-clause (c)

- (4) Bona fide personal baggage of a passenger being dutiable goods that have a value not exceeding \$100 per passenger aged eighteen years or older
- 4. This by-law, in relation to personal baggage specified in the last preceding sub-paragraph, does not apply to:
 - (1) unaccompanied baggage:
 - (a) in respect of which the Collector is of the opinion that
 it was not in the passenger's possession overseas prior
 to his departure for Australia;
 - (b) that would, had it accompanied the passenger, have not been eligible for admission under the provisions of this by-law; and
 - (c) that has been imported after the arrival of the passenger in Australia after such time as the Collector deems to be reasonable;
 - (2) goods for sale hire or trade;
 - (3) goods in commercial quantities;
 - (4) tobacco products;
 - (5) spirituous liquors and beverages;
 - (6) articles of fur apparel;
 - (7) vehicles of all kinds (not being toys); or
 - (8) radio receivers, radio transmitters, television receivers, television transmitters, tape players, tape recorders, dictating machines, gramophones or any combinations thereof
- 5. In this by-law 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which item No. 15 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1967 applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned

By-law No. S644

Item No. 16
Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S644.
- 2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 1 January 1968.
- 3. Item 16 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1967 applies, unless the contrary intention appears and subject to the next succeeding paragraph, to Goods, imported by:
 - (a) a passenger aged eighteen years or older; or
 - (b) as determined by the Minister and subject to such exclusions from classes of goods or restrictions as to quantities or value of goods as may be determined by the Minister, other passengers.

being dutiable goods that are the bona fide personal baggage of such a passenger and have a value not exceeding \$160 per passenger aged eighteen years or older

- 4. This by-law does not apply to:
- (1) unaccompanied baggage:
 - (a) in respect of which the Collector is of the opinion that
 it was not in the passenger's possession overseas prior to
 his departure for Australia;
 - (b) that would, had it accompanied the passenger, have not been eligible for admission under the provisions of this by-law; and
 - (c) that has been imported after the arrival of the passenger in Australia after such time as the Collector deems to be reasonable;
- (2) good for sale hire or trade;
- (3) goods in commercial quantities;
- (4) tobacco products;
- (5) spirituous liquors and beverages;
- (6) articles of fur apparel;
- (7) vehicles of all kinds (not being toys);
- (8) radio receivers, radio transmitters, television receivers, television transmitters, tape players, tape recorders, dictating machines, gramophones or any combinations thereof; or to the Customs Tariff 1966-1967 applies
- (9) goods to which Item 15 in Part I. of the Second Schedule Dated this second day of November 1967.

Item No. 19 Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S645.
- 2. Item 19 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1967, applies to goods described in the Table hereunder.

The Table

Goods for use in or in connection with the exploration for petroleum and in the development of petroleum wells including replacement parts therefor and mechanical driving units and apparatus for transmitting power from the driving units to the driven units, but not including the following goods and parts therefor:

apparel of all kinds

earth moving machines, machinery and vehicles

foodstuffs including beverages

lubricants and fuels of all kinds

goods used in or in connection with the raising of petroleum to the well head or to control, treat, store or convey such petroleum

natural barium sulphate

ships, boats and other floating structures

tobacco or tobacco products

road vehicles of general purpose kinds

welding materials for use in rebuilding or hard facing, as follows:

agglomerated alloy bearing fluxes

other materials whether bare or flux coated, viz: rods

electrodes of solid drawn wire or cast alloys metal tubes containing metallic granules or

metallic powders wire in continuous form

- 3. For the purposes of this by-law petroleum includes both oil and natural gas.
- 4. Customs By-law No. S480, published in Gazette No. 56 dated 29 June 1967, is revoked.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI

THE Minister of State for Customs and Excise, Senator the Honourable Kenneth McColl Anderson, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1967, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier Determination is concerned, the Table lists, in the following order, the number of the Determination in the 67/- series, the kind of goods, the date on or before which the goods shall be entered for home consumption, if such is a condition of the Determination, further conditions, if any, and the Item of the First or Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff applying to the goods.
