WHEREAS by section fifteen of the Customs Act 1901-1967 it is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamation, amongst other things, appoint wharfs and fix their limits:

- (a) appoint Barney Point Wharf, in the port of Gladstone, in the State of Queensland, to be a wharf within the meaning of that Act; and
- (b) fix the limits of that wharf in accordance with the description set out in the schedule to this proclamation.


