## NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI

THE Minister of State for Customs and Excise, Senator the Honourable Malcolm Fox Scott, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1967, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective Determinations.



- (g) any other place outside Australia, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, 6th Floor T and G Building, Hobart Place, Canberra City 2601.

Note: The addresses of Public Service Inspectors are included in the Index of Addresses at the end of the 'Notification of Vacancies' section of this Gazette.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

### Grounds of Appeal

The grounds of appeal are:

- (i) (a) Superior efficiency or (b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority.
- (ii) That the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient, where promotion is made to one of these positions:
