IT is hereby notified, for general information, that his Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, did, on 15th August 1968, in pursuance of 4x of the Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910–1968, declare his assent to the undermentioned Ordinance passed by the Legislative Council for the Northern Territory and reserved by the Administrator of that Territory for the Governor-General's pleasure:

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS UNDER PART XVI

THE Minister of State for Customs and Excise, Senator the Honourable Malcolm Fox Scott, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901–1968, notifies that Determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the Table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective Determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier Determination is concerned, the Table lists, in the following order, the number of the Determination in the 68/- series, the kind of goods,

the date on or before which the goods shall be entered for home consumption, if such is a condition of the Determination, further conditions, if any, and the Item of the First or Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff applying to the goods. Where a seven figure item is shown it is an item of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff and where a two figure item is shown it is an item of the Second Schedule. All goods, being machines, machinery or machine tools are, unless otherwise indicated, subject to the provisions of Separate Articles Direction No. 21.

Wherever appearing in the Table, P.V.C. means polyvinyl chloride and T.V. means television.

This notice is for public information only. The Determination itself provides the legal authority which is limited to the importer named in the Determination enabling that importer to enter the goods at the rates of duty applicable to the item mentioned in the Determination.

The Common Rule shall not apply to employers in the space-tracking industry in the Australian Capital Territory who are respondents to the Space-tracking Industry Award, 1966, as varied, and their employees who are performing watching, caretaking, cleaning and lift driving duties in the Australian Capital Territory.

The Common Rule shall come into operation as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing on or after the twelfth day of September, 1968.

PROMOTIONS—SECTION 50 AND REGULATION 109

THE following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. For this purpose the appropriate officer is—if the provisional promotion is made to an office in—

- (a) a State, the Public Service Inspector in that State;
- (b) the Australian Capital Territory, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, 6th Floor, T and G Building, Hobart Place, Canberra City 2601;
- (c) the Northern Territory, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, Darwin;
- (d) Norfolk Island, the Public Service Inspector, Sydney;
- (e) the Territory of Papua or the Territory of New Guinea, the Public Service Inspector, Brisbane;
- (f) the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, the Public Service Inspector, Perth;
- (g) any other place outside Australia, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, 6th Floor T and G Building, Hobart Place, Canberra City 2601.

NOTE: The addresses of Public Service Inspectors are included in the Index of Addresses at the end of the 'Notification of Vacancies' section of this Gazette.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Grounds of Appeal

The grounds of appeal are:

- (i) (a) Superior efficiency or (b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority.
- (ii) That the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient, where promotion is made to one of these positions: Assistant, Grade 1; Assistant, Grade 2; Assistant Storeman; Clerical Assistant, Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female), Grade 2; Labourer, Grade 1; Lift Attendant; Lineman, Grade 2; Mail Officer, Monitor; Monitor (Female); Orderly, Grade 1; Postal Assistant; Postal Officer; Postman; Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Storeman; Telephonist.

Form of Appeal

There is no standard form of appeal. However, the appeal must show:

Positions having either Third or Fourth Division Status

For the purposes of appeal against provisional promotions to positions of Assistant Chief Drafting Officer, all grades; Chief Drafting Officer, all grades; Chief Technical Officer; Drafting Assistant, all grades; Drafting Officer, all grades; Postal Clerk; Principal Technical Officer; Senior Drafting Officer, all grades; Senior Technical Officer, all grades; Supervisor, Grades 1 and 2; Supervisor-in-Training (Mail); Technical Assistant, all grades; Technical Officer, all grades; Telegraphist; Traffic Officer-in-training; and Trainee Engineer, seniority of Third Division officers in relation to Fourth Division officers shall be determined in accordance with General Order 4-A-3, i.e. according to the earliest seniority date held by the officer since his appointment whether in the Fourth or the Third Division.

Salaries, etc.

The annual rates of salary are increased as follows, unless otherwise indicated in P.S.B. Circular No. 1967/24:

Adult Males	Increase of \$157 per annum
Adult Females	Increase of \$131 per annum

Minors—Proportionate increases apply in accordance with the abovementioned Circular, except that married minors (males) may be eligible for an allowance under regulation 87a.

Where an arbitration determination awards a higher rate or scale of rates than the classification of the vacant position that rate or scale of rates is shown in brackets beside the classification.

The inclusion in brackets after the salary classifications of certain Third Division positions of a 'Class' number relates to the relevant term in Part II of the Fourth Schedule to the Public Service Regulations. It does not form part of the designation and classification of the position and is included to facilitate recognition of the salary level.

3. **Introductory Accounting**—The syllabus for this subject has been revised as shown below:

INTRODUCTORY ACCOUNTING

Introductory Note—An understanding of the theoretical as well as the practical aspects of the subject should be developed. The basis of double entry recording is the accounting equation (Assets equals Liabilities plus Proprietorship). The explanation of criteria for determining the effect of transactions on the accounting equation must be studied:

Debit increase of asset.
Credit decrease of asset.
Debit decrease of liability.
Credit increase of liability.
Debit increase of expense.
Credit decrease of expense.
Debit decrease of income.
Credit increase of income.

The aim of this subject is to ensure that the candidate obtains a sound knowledge of basic accounting methods as applied to simple forms of business enterprises. In particular, candidates will be expected to appreciate the ways in which accounting assists management, especially by the provision of informative reports and the use of modern recording techniques.

To achieve this aim, candidates must become familiar with the format and functions of documents and books commonly found in business enterprises. They must learn how original documents are often used as a basis for compiling the books of originating entry. They must also know how to summarise and transfer the data provided through the books of originating entry to the all-important book in the accounting structure—the ledger, and how the ledger is basic to the preparation of accounting and to many other reports required by management.

Finally, attempting to learn by rote must be avoided at all costs. Candidates must concentrate on learning how and why a particular practice or procedure is adopted.

Introduction to Accounting—

- Functions of Accounting. Recording and reporting.
- The basis of double entry recording; the accounting equation (Assets equals liabilities plus proprietorship); the variations of the accounting equation ($A=L+P$), etc.)
- The effect of transactions on the accounting equation.

- The nature of proprietorship and the meaning of changes therein.
- The profit and loss statement as an expression of proprietorship changes ($\text{Profit} = \text{Income} - \text{Expense}$).

- The forms of the balance sheet and the profit and loss statement.
- The limitations of the balance sheet and the profit and loss statement.

- The difference between a convention and a doctrine.
- Conventions:
 - The Accounting Entity Convention.
 - The Monetary Convention.
 - The Accounting Period Convention.
 - The Continuity of Activity or Going Concern Convention.
- Doctrines:
 - The Doctrine of Conservatism.
 - The Doctrine of Disclosure.
 - The Doctrine of Consistency.
 - The Doctrine of Materiality.

Accounting Evidence and Source Information—

- The nature of accounting evidence.
- The sources of documentary evidence.
- The reliability of accounting evidence.
- Effective measures to ensure accuracy of source data.
- The structure of the accounting system.

- (iv) Senior Technician in any section other than the section for which the examination is held; or
- (v) Technical Instructor, Senior Technical Instructor, Supervising Technician, Technical Assistant, Technical Officer and Senior Technical Officer who already possess Senior Technician qualifications and who desire to extend their qualifications.

3. **Subjects and Pass Conditions—**

Candidates must obtain 60 per cent of the marks allotted in either paper to pass the above examination.

Officers who pass in one of the above subjects under these conditions gain part-qualification for promotion or transfer as Senior Technician (Radio), in the Section concerned. To complete the qualification, officers must pass, or have passed, the examination for part-qualification as Senior Technician (Radio) (Oral and Practical Examination).

Officers who satisfy, or who have satisfied, the conditions for promotion or transfer as Senior Technician (Radio) in either section will be required to pass the written paper only of the other section to qualify fully in that section.

4. **Exemption Provisions**—Candidates who pass an examination under these conditions may claim exemption from re-examination if the subject in question was passed at any of the last three examinations of this type.

If a candidate claims exemption from re-examination in a subject of a particular examination, he will not be permitted to contest the subject at that examination.

Candidates who have passed, i.e., gained 60 per cent, at a previous written examination for part qualification as Senior Technician (Radio) may claim exemption from re-examination in one written paper of his choice, but must pass the other written paper to gain qualification in both sections.

A candidate may not claim full exemption from re-examination merely to extend his eligibility; to do this, he must requalify in either or both subjects as set out above.

5. **Period of Eligibility**—Four years from date of notification in the Gazette that the earliest of the examinations by which he qualified has been finalised.
