QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION No. 63P

Commonwealth of Australia to wit CASEY By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

Governor-General.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1.) of section thirteen of the Quarantine Act 1908-1966, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, declare any ports in Australia to be ports where imported animals and plants or any particular kinds of imported animals or plants may be landed:

NOW THEREFORE I, Richard Gardiner, Baron Casey, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby declare the port situated at Ballina in

the State of New South Wales to be a port where imported sawn timber (not being logs) may be landed.

(b) Not exceeding 205 grammes per square metre:

Coated, not exceeding 67 grammes per square metre, for use in the production of newspapers, periodicals, posters and other printed matter of a kind that, if imported, would fall within Chapter 49 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968, being paper that contains more than 55 per centum mechanical pulp, under security

Coated, exceeding 67 grammes per square metre but not exceeding 205 grammes per square metre, for use in the production of newspapers, periodicals, posters and other printed matter of a kind that, if imported, would fall within Chapter 49 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968, being paper that contains not less than 70 per centum mechanical pulp, under security Imitation book-cloth

Impregnated, containing more than 75 per centum by weight of asbestos, having a substance not exceeding 110 grammes per square metre

Oiled, the produce or manufacture of New Zealand Wax impregnated, water absorbent, single ply, having a substance not exceeding 25 grammes per square metre, for use in the manufacture of sanitary napkins, under security

(c) Exceeding 205 grammes per square metre:

Coated, for use in a factory licensed under the Excise Act 1901-1968, in the manufacture of playing cards, under security

Having a substance not less than 500 grammes per square metre, consisting of at least two layers composed of a mixture of chemical and mechanical wood pulp pasted together and lined on both sides with paper composed of chemical wood pulp one of which lining papers being mineral coated and glazed Oiled

3. In this by-law 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which this item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned.

4. Customs By-law No. F296 published in Gazette No. 110 dated 31 December 1968 and Customs By-law No. F301 published in Gazette No. 5 dated 16 January 1969, are revoked.

PROMOTIONS—SECTION 50 AND REGULATION 109

THE following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. For this purpose the appropriate officer is—if the provisional promotion is made to an office in—

- (a) a State, the Public Service Inspector in that State;

Note: The addresses of Public Service Inspectors are included in the Index of Addresses at the end of the 'Notification of Vacancies' section of this Gazette.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Grounds of Appeal

The grounds of appeal are:
