FIRST SCHEDULE

By-law No. F306

I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the following by-law.

By-law No. F306

Sub-item 48.01.2

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. F306.
2. This by-law shall be deemed to have taken effect on and from 6 February 1969.
3. Sub-item 48.01.2 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1968 applies to:
 Paper and paperboard, having a substance exceeding 22 grammes per square metre, as follows:
 The produce or manufacture of New Zealand, for use in the manufacture of paper patterns, under security.
4. In this by-law 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which this item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned.

- (g) any other place outside Australia, the Chairman, Promotions Appeal Committee, 6th Floor, T and G Building, Hobart Place, Canberra City 2601.

NOTE: The addresses of Public Service Inspectors are included in the Index of Addresses at the end of the 'Notification of Vacancies' section of this Gazette.

Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Grounds of Appeal

The grounds of appeal are:

- (i) (a) Superior efficiency or (b) Equal efficiency combined with seniority.
- (ii) That the appellant is senior to the officer provisionally promoted and is efficient, where promotion is made to one of these positions: Assistant, Grade 1; Assistant, Grade 2; Assistant Storeman; Clerical Assistant, Grade 1; Hospital Assistant (Female), Grade 2; Labourer, Grade 1; Lift Attendant; Lineman, Grade 2; Mail Officer; Monitor; Monitor (Female); Orderly, Grade 1; Postal Assistant; Postal Officer; Postman; Quarantine Assistant, Grade 1; Storeman; Telephonist.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE RECRUITMENT, TRAINING AND PROMOTION OF TRAINEE ENGINEERS, DEPARTMENT OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT

THE Public Service Board hereby notifies the conditions governing the recruitment and training of Trainee Engineers, Department of Shipping and Transport.

1. **Eligibility**—Persons eligible to apply for selection as Trainee Engineer are officers of the Third and Fourth Divisions of the Commonwealth Service who:

- (a) have the necessary pre-requisite qualifications for admission to the approved course of study shown in Table I and have passed the appropriate subjects shown in Table II (or possess exempting qualifications); and
- (b) (i) have had at least four years' satisfactory technical or drafting experience and/or training, or
- (ii) have progressed to the stage of the course shown in Table III or hold exempting qualifications up to that stage;

provided that the qualifications referred to in Tables II and III were obtained within a reasonable period preceding the closing date of applications.

An officer who has previously been selected for training for an office of Engineer or Draftsman and whose course of training has been terminated because of unsatisfactory progress will not be eligible for selection.

2. **Conditions of Transfer or Promotion**—(a) Upon selection, officers of the Commonwealth Service will be transferred or promoted as Trainee Engineer (\$1,475-2,833) (S), Third or Fourth Division, Marine Services Branch, with headquarters at the capital city of the State in which they are to receive their training.

(b) The promotion of an officer to an office of Trainee Engineer, Third or Fourth Division, is subject to the right of appeal under section 50 of the Public Service Act 1922-1968. The transfer of an officer to an office of Trainee Engineer, Third or Fourth Division, shall be subject to a right of appeal in the same manner as if section 50 applied.

Note—The office of Trainee Engineer shall, while occupied by an officer who has been appointed, promoted or transferred to the Third Division, be included in that Division and while not so occupied shall be included in the Fourth Division.

3. **How to Apply for Selection**—Applications should be made in response to a notice published in the Commonwealth Gazette.

4. **Selection**—The following factors will be taken into account when selections are made:

- (a) academic qualifications;
- (b) relevant experience, including technical or drafting experience; and
- (c) aptitude for the position of Engineer Class 1.

5. **Course of Training**—The period of training will be determined by the stage of entry to the approved course and the minimum time ordinarily required for completion of the course, subject to the conditions in paragraph 14 hereunder. During vacations trainees will be given departmental training.

Where a trainee's rate of salary falls within two or more of the above ranges in a calendar year, the percentage of fees to be refunded will be that shown in relation to the rate of salary received for the greater portion of the year.

8. Fares—Excess fares which are involved in attending the university, technical college or other educational institution will be paid by the department.

9. Meal Allowances—While attending the university or technical college, trainees will be eligible for meal allowance in accordance with the approved conditions.

10. Salary While in Training—Officers will be paid the appropriate salary within the range (\$1,475-2,833) (\$). An officer whose salary before transfer or promotion was more than \$2,833 (\$) will receive remuneration in accordance with General Order 2/C/2.

11. Hours of Duty—Hours of duty of trainees shall be the hours of duty observed at the establishment where they are currently undergoing training.

12. Promotion under Section 53B—Upon satisfactory completion of the required course, a trainee will be promoted as Engineer Class 1. Promotion will be subject to trainees satisfying all educational requirements for admission to Grad.I.E.Aust. and will be at the salary payable for the qualifications obtained, except that an officer whose remuneration during training was in excess of this salary will receive the next sub-division within the range above the remuneration he received during training.

Qualified officers may be required to take up duty as Engineer, Class 1, in any State.

Promotion is made under the provisions of section 53B of the Public Service Act 1922-1968 and is not subject to appeal.

13. Contract of Service—Each trainee will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth and to be guaranteed by an approved or personal surety for \$1,000 that he will pursue to completion the approved course of training (including examinations) unless permitted by the Board to relinquish it, and continue in the employment of the Commonwealth for a period of three years after completing the training course.

14. Candidates must obtain 60 per cent of the total marks allotted to pass the examination.

Officers who pass an examination under these conditions gain part-qualification for promotion or transfer as Senior Technician (Radio). To complete the qualification, officers must pass the examination for part-qualification as Senior Technician (Radio) (Oral and Practical Examination).

4. Exemption Provisions—Candidates who have passed an examination under these conditions will not be required to sit again, and should not apply for exemption from re-examination.

EUROPEAN SPACE VEHICLE LAUNCHER DEVELOPMENT ORGANISATION
