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ORDER APPROVING AMENDMENT OF THE BYE-LAWS OF THE AUSTRALIAN ACADEMY OF SCIENCE

WHEREAS by Letters Patent of Her Majesty the Queen bearing date the second day of February, 1954, the Australian Academy of Science was by Charter passed under the Great Seal constituted into a body corporate:

AND WHEREAS by clause 14 of the Charter it is provided that a majority of not less than three-fourths of the Fellows of the said Academy present in person or by proxy and voting at a General Meeting of the Fellows of the Academy specially called for the purpose of which due notice has been given or the like majority of the Fellows voting by means of a postal ballot as provided in the Charter shall have power from time to time to make such Bye-laws as shall seem requisite and convenient for the regulation, government and advantage of the Academy, its members and property and for the furtherance of its objects and purposes and from time to time to revoke or amend any Bye-law or Bye-laws previously made but so that the same be not repugnant to the provisions of the said Charter or to the laws and statutes of the Commonwealth of Australia or any State or Territory thereof:

AND WHEREAS it is further provided by the said clause 14 that no such Bye-law, revocation or amendment shall take effect until approved by His Excellency the Governor-General in Council of the Commonwealth of Australia:

AND WHEREAS certain Bye-laws were made in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter on the twelfth day of November, 1954, and were approved by the Governor-General in Council on the sixth day of April, 1955:

AND WHEREAS amendments were made subsequently to the Bye-laws of the Academy in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter by a majority exceeding three-fourths of the Fellows present in person or by proxy and voting at a General Meeting of the Fellows of the said Academy specially called for the purpose of which due notice was given or by the like majority of the Fellows voting by means of a postal ballot as provided in the said Charter, which amendments were approved by the Governor-General in Council on the fourth day of February, 1959, the ninth day of September, 1961, the twenty-fifth day of October, 1962, the twenty-second day of August, 1963, the nineteenth day of February, 1965, the tenth day of December, 1965, the twenty-eighth day of July, 1966, and the twenty-eighth day of March, 1967:

AND WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter a majority exceeding three-fourths of the Fellows voting by means of a postal ballot recently amended the Bye-laws of the Academy in the manner set forth in the Schedule to this instrument:

AND WHEREAS the said Amendments are not repugnant to the provisions of the said Charter or to the laws and statutes of the Commonwealth of Australia or any State or Territory thereof:

THEREFORE I, RICHARD GARDINER, BARON CASEY, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, DO BY THIS ORDER APPROVE the said amendments of the Bye-laws of the Australian Academy of Science

SCHEDULE

(a) Chapter I

After "year" means calendar year insert "the Secretaries" means the Secretary (Physical Sciences) and the Secretary (Biological Sciences)'.

(b) Chapter III, Section 1a

(i) Replace clause (i) by the following-

- '(i) five Officers, namely, the President, the Treasurer, the Secretary (Physical Sciences), the Secretary (Biological Sciences), and the Secretary (International Relations)'.
- (ii) For 'four ordinary members' substitute 'five ordinary members' where twice occurring.

(c) Chapter III, Section 1f

For 'three members' substitute 'four members'. For 'seven members' substitute 'nine members'.

(d) Chapter III, Section 2

(ii) For 'four offices' substitute 'five offices'.
(ii) For 'eight ordinary seats' substitute 'ten ordinary seats'.

(e) Chapter III, Section 3a For 'four ordinary members' substitute 'five ordinary members'.

(f) Chapter III, Section 3c

For 'four Fellows' substitute 'five Fellows'.

(g) Chapter III, Section 4d For 'six' substitute 'eight'.

(h) Chapter III, Section 11

At the end of the first paragraph after 'finance' insert 'and to international relations'.

(i) Chapter III, Insert a new Section 11A

'The Secretary (International Relations).

11A The Secretary (International Relations) shall be re-sponsible, subject to the direction of the Council, for the international relations of the Academy and for the conduct of the relevant correspondence.' 2300

(i) Chapter VII, Section 3c

Delete the existing sub-section and substitute:

'c The Executive Secretary shall be responsible to the Treasurer in matters of a financal nature; to the Secretary (International Relations) in matters concerned with international relations; and to the Secretary (Physical Sciences) and the Secretary (Biological Sciences) in all other matters'.


