THE Minister of State for Customs and Excise, Senator the Honourable Malcolm Fox Scott, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1968, notifies that determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective determinations.

CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1969

SECOND SCHEDULE

By-laws Nos S1121 and S1125

I, MALCOLM FOX SCOTT, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE

By-law No. S1121

Item No. 19 Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1121.
- 2. Unless the context otherwise requires in this by-law in ascertaining whether goods fall within the terms of a reference or whether a reference applies to goods, regard shall be had to:
 - (a) the Rules for the Interpretation of the First Schedule set out in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969; and
 - (b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their Tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.
- 3. Item 19 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969, applies to goods described in the second column of the Table hereunder that are goods to which the item in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969, listed in the first column of that Table opposite those goods, applies.

THE following promotions are provisional and are subject to appeal by officers to the Public Service Board, and where consequent upon another provisional promotion, are dependent upon the latter being confirmed. The date of promotion is the date of this Gazette, except where otherwise specifically indicated. Where an officer desires to appeal against two or more provisional promotions a separate appeal should be lodged for each one.

Where to Lodge Appeals

Appeals should be lodged either by letter or telegram so as to be received in the office of the appropriate officer by the close of business on the twenty-first day after the date of this notification. Appeals not lodged with the appropriate officer within the prescribed period will not be accepted.

Grounds of Appeal

The grounds of appeal are:

RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS AT THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY

APPLICATIONS are invited from permanent officers of the Commonwealth Service for Research Fellowships in 1970. The Fellowships will entitle Fellows to spend one year in a department of the Australian National University.

Eligibility—Fellowships will be available to senior officers of substantial experience who would benefit from a period of reading and supervised writing on a research topic. The primary purpose of the Fellowship is not to enable officers to obtain a higher degree but to provide them with the opportunity to make a worthwhile contribution to a particular field of research. The field of research, chosen by the Fellow in conjunction with his Department and the University, must be of interest and benefit to both the University and the Commonwealth Service.

Selection—Applicants for Fellowships must first obtain sponsorship from their Departments. Departments will submit nominations, which will be considered by a selection committee.

Benefits—Fellows will receive full salary for the period of Fellowship. The University will pay costs of the Fellow's travel to Canberra, and may provide accommodation at normal charges for Fellows not resident in Canberra. If possible, single Fellows will live at University House, and married Fellows with families will be provided with furnished houses or apartments. Fellows engaged in research are entitled to attend seminar groups and discussions within the University in their general fields of interest. Successful officers will take up the Fellowship at the beginning of the academic year in March 1970.

Conditions—A Fellow will be required to produce a paper on his year's work at the University and to enter into a bond to remain in the Commonwealth Service for a period of three years after completion of the Fellowship.

The Australian National University has furnished the following list of suggested research fields for 1970.

INSTITUTE OF ADVANCED STUDIES John Curtin School of Medical Research

Biochemistry (Professor Gibson): Biosynthesis and function of aromatic compounds, the mechanism of enzyme action, active transport, and fundamental aspects of the chemistry of enzymes.

Clinical Science (Professor Whyte): Studies concerned with coronary heart disease—in epidemiology, nutrition, metabolism, obesity and other relevant factors.

Experimental Pathology (Professor Courtice): Experimental investigations concerned with: arteriosclerosis; lipid transport and metabolism; the lymphatic system; immunology, including transplantation immunity; inflammation and wound healing.

Medical Chemistry (Professor Albert): Organic and physical chemistry of heterocyclic molecules; quantitative aspects of binding metallic cations by organic molecules; spectrometry, including n.m.r.; rapid reaction techniques; kinetics; research into microanalytical techniques.

Microbiology (Professor Ada): Structure and role of antigens and animal virology; intact animal and tissue culture studies on the pathogenesis of viral infection, fate of injected antigens, viral multiplication and the structure of viruses and antigens.

Physical Biochemistry (Professor Ogston): Physical chemistry and biochemistry of macromolecular substances and systems; connective tissue: proteins; enzymes.

Physiology (Professor Bishop, Dr Levick): Neuro-physiological investigation of the visual system; (Professor Curtis): Neuro-pharmacology; (Dr Johnson): Neuro-chemistry.

Research School of Physical Sciences

The school can provide facilities for research work in low energy nuclear physics (Professor Titterton), in theoretical aspects of nuclear and particle physics (Professor Le Couteur), in some branches of geophysics and geochemistry (Professor Jaeger and Professor Ringwood), in observational optical astronomy (Professor Eggen), and in selected branches of mathematics (Professor Neumann), in studies of collision processes of electrons in gases (Dr Crompton), in diffusion in liquids (Dr Mills) and in engineering physics (Professor Newstead).

Computer Centre

Computer Centre (Dr Osborne): Numerical analysis; supervisory systems; the structure and application of programming languages.

Research School of Social Sciences

Demography (Professor Borrie): Studies relating to: fertility, marriage and family structure; demographic aspects of workforce; social, economic and cultural aspects of immigration; immigration policy; evaluation and census techniques and vital registration; population structure and trends in high growth areas relating particularly to Australian territories, the Pacific and South East Asia

Education Research Unit (Mr Anderson): The professions and education in universities and colleges of advanced education in Australia.

Economic History (Professor Butlin): Areas likely to be of most interest to Commonwealth Officers include quantitative analysis of economic growth and development in Australia, including the comparative study with overseas countries. The work is at three levels covering the preparation of statistical series of historical social accounting data, the interpretation of the data, and its use in analytical studies. The statistical data include employment and unemployment, quantum estimates of industry product, capital stock, public authority transactions, and analysis of foreign trade and investment since the First World War. Interpretative work is mainly devoted to quality change in price and quantum series and use of figures of aggregate output for welfare and productivity comparison. Analytical studies cover a wide field, including particular studies of the effect of a government activity on the character and direction of economic development of selected industries, the association between economic growth and capital inflow and the labour capital productivity in Australia.

There is also opportunity for traditional and descriptive studies in economic history, including business and institutional histories.

Economics (Professor Swan): A suitable research project in many instances would be to take some episode or problem of public policy from the recent past or the present and to analyse its background and implications.

History (Professor La Nauze): Current research is concerned with Australian, modern British, and Indian history. The most relevant field is the early history (1901-14) of the Australian Commonwealth—political, administrative or diplomatic.

Law (Professor Sawer): Federal Constitutional Law; Administrative Law; Private and Common Law (contracts, torts, etc.).

Philosophy (Professor Passmore): Higher education, problems in political and social philosophy, history of philosophy.

History of Ideas Unit (Dr Kamenka): Relations between political, social, philosophical and literary ideas.

Political Science (Professor Parker): Historical development of a selected function of the Commonwealth Government; modes and problems of Commonwealth-State participation in one of the concurrent functions of government; recruitment and composition of senior administrative staff in public services; how the Statutory Corporation form affects policy making and administration in any corporation; the formulation and administration of Australian tariff policy; legal and administrative aspects of 'extra-Constitutional' activities of the Commonwealth, e.g. in research, education, civil aviation control and facilities, regional development, labour relations, e.g. implementing of ILO conventions, employment and vocational guidance services; public health administration; regional structure and administration of selected Commonwealth Departments, e.g. is the State unit the most convenient? possible scope for delegation to departments of staffing functions under the Public Service Act; administrative problems arising from Public Service Arbitration.

Sociology (Professor Partridge): Occupational and social structure and mobility, urbanisation, the professions, social institutions (e.g. social services, education) and the sociology of religion.

Statistics (Professor Moran): Mathematical statistics, probability theory, and their applications in physical and biological science.

Urban Research Unit (Dr Neutze): Urban land market, private development and redevelopment, public authorities (e.g. Housing, Water and Sewerage Authorities) and local governments as they operate in urban areas; and traffic accidents.

Research School of Pacific Studies

Anthropology and Sociology (vacant): Studies in the social, administrative and judicial development of Papua and New Guinea; the position of aborigines and other ethnic groups in the Northern Territory and in the States.

Biogeography and Geomorphology (Professor Walker): Plant ecology, vegetation history (palynology), quaternary geomorphology, karst studies and morphometry. Australia and New Guinea.

Economics (Professor Arndt): The study of economic growth in underdeveloped areas, with particular reference to South East Asia. Although the Department is primarily interested in building up systematic empirical knowledge of this area, scope exists for theoretical studies and work on Australia's economic relations with these regions.

Far Eastern History (Professor Wang Gungwu): Chinese and Japanese history from the earliest times to the twentieth century.

Human Geography (vacant): Cultural geography and development of tropical areas in the Pacific and South East Asia; urban and transportation studies both in Australia and in the tropical areas to the north.

International Relations (Professors Bull, Miller): Foreign policy of countries connected with Australia, especially the United States of America, the United Kingdom, Japan, China, and other countries in Asia and the Commonwealth of Nations; studies of international organisations, including the United Nations and specialised agencies; Australian diplomatic experience; politics of the Communist block; theories of international politics; problems of foreign aid and the effect of trade on international politics.
