 - (b) Aeronautical Principles—Mathematics, Maps and Charts, Air Navigation, Meteorology, Radio and Radar Aids, Altimetry, General Aviation knowledge.
 - (ii) Practical field training of approximately twelve weeks duration at selected Air Traffic Control Centres.

The Director-General of Civil Aviation may extend the period of practical training in individual cases, if he considers that a trainee will successfully complete his practical training in the extended period.
