Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1969

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit PAUL HASLUCK Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

I, SIR PAUL MEERNAA CAEDWALLA HASLUCK, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 103 of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1969 of the Northern Territory of Australia, do hereby reserve the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of a public park.

THE SCHEDULE Reserve No. 1273 Bennett Park

All that piece or parcel of land in the Town of Darwin Hundred of Bagot County of Palmerston Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 3 roods 3 perches more or less being Lot 4820: Commencing at the most southerly southern corner of Lot 4820, thence by lines bearing 314 degrees 38 minutes 89.3 feet, 359 degrees 38 minutes 21.21 feet, 44 degrees 38 minutes 394 feet, 89 degrees 38 minutes 14.14 feet, 134 degrees 37 minutes 30 seconds 75 feet, 224 degrees 38 minutes 40 seconds 65 feet, 314 degrees 37 minutes 30 seconds 60 feet, 224 degrees 38 minutes 110 feet, 134 degrees 37 minutes 50 seconds 79.3 feet, 224 degrees 38 minutes 244 feet to the point of commencement.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATIONS 69/32780-33232, 33258-33592 UNDER PART XVI

THE Minister of State for Customs and Excise, the Honourable Donald Leslie Chipp, in pursuance of Section 273B of the Customs Act 1901-1968, notifies that determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective determinations.

Except where an amendment or revocation of an earlier determination is concerned, the table lists, in the following order, the file number, the kind of goods, the date on or before which the goods shall be entered for home consumption, if such is a condition of the determination, further conditions, if any, and the Item of the First or Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff applying to the goods. FIRST SCHEDULE

Part A

- (i) that sub-by-law 41 (1) (c) (ii) be amended by the deletion of the word 'first';
- (ii) that sub-by-law 16 (1) be rescinded and that the following new sub-by-law be substituted in its place:
 - 16 (1) Not withstanding anything in these by-laws (except Part XII), a member shall not, while any subscription or levy is overdue for payment by him, be capable of holding any office in the Association or in a subordinate body or capable of exercising any of the rights and privileges of a member of the Association;
- (iii) that by-law 17 be rescinded.

That by-law 36 be rescinded and be replaced by the following:

Equal Pay

As from 9.10.69, 'equal pay' applies to certain designations. The designations which attract 'equal pay' and those which do not attract 'equal pay' were notified in separate lists in Gazettes published during November 1969 and also in Board Circular 1969/35.

Females occupying offices which attract 'equal pay' will be subject to 'equal pay' adjustments on a phased basis commencing

on 9.10.69 and extending until the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after 1.1.72 when the full rate applicable to the office will be paid. Minors—Proportionate increases apply in accordance with P.S.B. Circular No. 1968/35, except that married minors (males) may be eligible for an allowance under regulation 87B.

New adult appointees may be paid commencing salaries at any points within a salary range.

At those offices where quarters are indicated, a deduction for rental will be made at the rate of 10 per cent of the minimum salary of the position unless otherwise stated.

The inclusion in brackets after the salary classifications of certain Third Division positions of a 'Class' number relates to the relevant item in Part II of the Fourth Schedule to the Public Service Regulations. It does not form part of the designation and classification of the position and is included to facilitate recognition of the salary level.

PROVISIONAL PROMOTIONS
