Loan (Drought Bonds) Act 1969

REVOCATION OF DECLARATIONS OF DROUGHT AREAS IN RELATION TO PART OF THE DROUGHT AREAS

IN pursuance of sub-section (2.) of section 18 of the Loan (Drought Bonds) Act 1969, I, John Douglas Anthony, the Minister of State for Primary Industry, being satisfied that the area described hereunder, being part of the areas in the State of Western Australia specified in declarations made by me under sub-section (1.) of that section on the third day of November, 1969, and published in the Gazette on the sixth day of November, 1969, and on the fifteenth day of January, 1970, and published in the Gazette on the fifteenth day of January, 1970, has ceased to be experiencing drought, revoke the declarations in relation to the area so described.

Description of Area

## **Actual Salaries**

Salaries shown in the provisional promotions section of this Gazette are expressed as current actual salaries. Where two salary ranges are shown, the rate appearing in brackets is the current actual salary payable by virtue of a determination of the Public Service Arbitrator or the Public Service Board. The salary scale first appearing and not in brackets (shown for legal purposes), is the rate of pay currently prescribed in the Public Service Regulations.

## **Equal Pay**

As from 9.10.69, 'equal pay' applied to certain designations. The designations which attract 'equal pay' and those which do not attract 'equal pay' were notified in separate lists in Gazettes published during November 1969 and also in Board Circular 1969/35.

Females occupying offices which attract 'equal pay' will be subject to 'equal pay' adjustments on a phased basis until the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after 1.1.72, when the full rate applicable to the office will be paid.
