Banking Act 1959-1967

ORDER OF EXEMPTION

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Banking Act 1959-1967 it is provided that, where any person desires to carry on any banking business in Australia but does not desire to carry on the general business of banking, the Treasurer may, by order published in the Gazette, exempt that person from compliance with such of the provisions of that Act as are specified in the order:

 - (a) by deleting from Group F in the Schedule the following words:

and substituting in their stead the following words: 'Amev Life Assurance Company Limited.'; and

(b) by adding at the end of Group H in the Schedule the following words:

CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1969

SECOND SCHEDULE

By-laws Nos S1177 to S1180

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE By-law No. S1177

Item No. 19 Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1177.
- 2. Unless the context otherwise requires in this by-law in ascertaining whether goods fall within the terms of a reference or whether a reference applies to goods, regard shall be had to:
 - (a) the Rules for the Interpretation of the First Schedule set out in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969; and
 - (b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their Tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.
 - 3. For the purposes of this by-law:
 - (a) clutch assemblies include driving and driven plates and covers and parts therefor, but do not include clutch operating linkages and remote control mechanisms;
 - (b) transmission gear box assemblies include gear box housings and covers, gear shift parts for assembly within such housings and clutch housings cast with gear box housings, but do not include gear change linkages and remote control mechanisms:
 - (c) differential assemblies and driving axle assemblies include differential units and companion flanges, differential carriers, driving axle casings and axle shafts, but do not include brake drums, brakes or other brake operated mechanisms;
 - (d) bodies include all that portion, being the passenger or goods carrying structure, commencing at and including the cowl, windscreen and dashboard, and, in particular, include pressings, panels or stampings being filler pieces, strengthening brackets or fixtures for use in connexion therewith, cabs, front mounted or not, floor pans, rear fenders, running boards and protection for rear mounted engines;
 - axle systems include axles and hubs including spoke spiders where necessary, but do not include brake drums, brake backing plates, brake parts and wheels;

- (f) the term 'motor car or station wagon derivatives' includes utilities, pickups, panel vans, ambulances, hearses, or any other kind of vehicle that, in the opinion of the Minister, is derived from a motor car or station wagon in that it has an engine or front end body contour similar to a particular motor car or station wagon, but does not include four wheel drive vehicles of a kind used solely or principally in rural or undeveloped areas:
- the term 'brake equipment' comprises all components used for or in connexion with the operation of brakes from the brake pedal to the brake drum (both inclusive) and includes, inter alia, power assistors, boosters and air compressors, all ancillary equipment and control, storage and indicating equipment for use in connexion therewith;
- (h) 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which this item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned;
- (i) steering gear assemblies include steering wheels, steering columns and pitman or drop arms;
- (j) suspension systems include all structures, mechanisms and components, including springs, torsion bars and spring hangers, used for the purpose of connecting chassis or bodies to axle systems or driving axle assemblies.
- 4. Item 19 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 applies, subject to paragraph 5 of this by-law, to:
 - Vehicle parts of a kind used in vehicles of a kind to which sub-item 87.01.1, 87.02.1 or 87.03.9 or paragraph 87.14.11 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 applies, for use otherwise than:
 - (a) as original components in the assembly or manufacture of vehicles of a kind to which sub-item 87.01.1, 87.02.1 or 87.03.9 or paragraph 87.14.11 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 applies; or
 - (b) in motor cars, station wagons or motor car or station wagon derivatives,

under security, as follows:
Cotters and washers, when specially designed for use only in connexion with vehicle components covered by this by-law

Clusters of instruments, with or without clocks

Cylinders for locks (including ignition locks) and keys therefor

Emblems, proprietary insignia

Engines, crude oil, high speed, of the compression ignition type or of the controlled (spark plug) ignition type, for replacement of internal combustion engines, which, in the opinion of the Minister, have rendered reasonable service in Australia

Gauges, fuel

Locks, gear or steering, designed for permanent installation in vehicles

Pumps (other than hydraulic pumps), compressors and exhausters designed for use only with vehicle components covered by this by-law

Taps, cocks and valves designed for use only with vehicle components covered by this by-law

Parts to which paragraph 87.06.99 or 87.14.29 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 applies, as follows:

When imported not fitted to any other component: Cowls, with or without header bars or header panels Dashboards or dash panels, including insulators Fenders, rear, with or without lampware

Floor pans

Instrument panels, without instruments, clocks or cigarette and cigar lighters

Running boards

Springs, air or rubber

Other parts when imported separately or otherwise

5. This by-law does not apply to:

brake equipment

drive screw assemblies of a kind ordinarily used in axle shift units for two speed axles, when imported separately

electrical wiring harness, sometimes called looms, whether or not fitted to any other component

electrical cables and straps, whether or not fitted to any other component, as follows:

battery to earth battery to starter

engine to earth

solenoid switch to starter

exterior decorative mouldings, including radiator grilles and wheel trim (but not including proprietary insignia emblems), whether or not fitted to any other component

flashing direction indicating kits, complete or incomplete

hinges, not fitted to any other component

lampware, front or rear, not fitted to any other component tipping gear, hydraulic, and parts therefor, whether or not fitted to any other component

components, listed in the following Table, and parts therefor unless specifically indicated:

The Table

when imported not fitted to any other component:

axle shafts

bushings of bronze steel or white metal

chain or sprocket wheels

king pins, king pin sets or assemblies

shackle assemblies

spring gaiters, except of metal

worms or worm wheels, not being parts for differential assemblies, driving axle assemblies or transmission gear box assemblies

when imported separately or otherwise:

axle systems (other than steering or driving axles) having a rated load capacity of not less than 12,000 pounds

bodies

bumper bars

chassis frames, when commercially usable on dump trucks of more than 65,000 pounds gross vehicle

chassis members, longitudinal (also known as chassis siderails), including those for semi-trailers for articulated motor vehicles

clutch assemblies, when commercially usable on vehicles of less than 22,400 pounds gross vehicle weight

coupling devices, known also as fifth wheels or turntables, for attaching semi-trailers to prime movers differential assemblies

Item No. 19 Second Schedule

 - (b) in bond in Australia on 5 March 1970, and are entered for home consumption on or before 3 April 1970.

 - (a) the Rules for the Interpretation of the First Schedule set out in Part I, of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969; and
 - (b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their Tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.
 - 3. For the purposes of this by-law:

(a) axle systems include axles and hubs including spoke spiders where necessary, but do not include brake drums, brake backing plates, brake parts and wheels:

(b) bodies includes all that portion, being the passenger or goods carrying structure, commencing at and including the cowl, windscreen and dashboard, and, in particular, include pressings, panels or stampings being filler pieces, strengthening brackets or fixtures for use in connexion therewith, cabs, front mounted or not, floor pans, rear fenders, running boards and protection for rear mounted engines;

- (f) radiator assemblies include radiator cores, upper and lower tanks, side members, anchorages, inlet and outlet sections, over-flow pipes, baffles, filler necks, filler caps and drain cocks, but do not include radiator shells;
- (g) transmission gear box assemblies include gear box housings and covers, gear shift parts for assembly within such housings and clutch housings cast with gear box housings, but do not include gear change linkages and remote control mechanisms;
- (h) the term 'motor car or station wagon derivatives' includes utilities, pickups, panel vans, ambulances, hearses, or any other kind of vehicle that, in the opinion of the Minister, is derived from a motor car or station wagon in that it has an engine or front end body contour similar to a particular motor car or station wagon, but does not include four wheel drive vehicles of a kind used solely or principally in rural or undeveloped areas;
- (i) the term 'brake equipment' comprises all components used for or in connexion with the operation of brakes from the brake pedal to the brake drum (both inclusive) and includes, inter alia, power assistors, boosters and air compressors, all ancillary equipment and control, storage and indicating equipment for use in connexion therewith;

Vehicle components and parts therefor that are for use as original components in the assembly or manufacture of vehicles (other than motor cars, station wagons or motor car or station wagon derivatives) to which sub-item 87.01.1, 87.02.1 or 87.03.9 or paragraph 87.14.11 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 applies, under security, as follows:

Bearings, ball, other than precision ground steel, when not fitted to any other component

Bearings, roller, other than tapered roller, when not fitted to any other component

Clocks, instruments or clusters thereof, when not fitted to any other component

Cylinders for locks (including ignition locks) and keys therefor, when not fitted to any other component

Lampware, front, of a kind used exclusively for parking or direction indicating or both, whether or not fitted to any other component not being a head lamp

Lampware, rear, whether or not fitted to any other component

Springs, air or rubber, when not fitted to any other component

Other components:

When for incorporation with body parts which if imported are unassembled:

Front end contour structure that is:

- (a) not fitted to body or cab or parts of body or cab; and
- (b) not commercially usable with dump trucks of more than 65,000 pounds gross vehicle weight

When imported not fitted to any other component:

Cowls with or without header bars or header panels Dashboards or dash panels including insulators

Fenders, rear, with or without lampware

Floor pans

Instrument panels, without instruments, clocks or cigarette and cigar lighters

Running boards

When not elsewhere provided for in this by-law.

5. This by-law does not apply to:

batteries to which paragraph 85.04.99 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 applies, whether imported separately or otherwise

bearings, ball, precision ground steel, when imported separately bearings, tapered roller, and parts therefor, when imported separately

bolts and nuts (including screws of a kind suitable for use with nuts, bolt ends and screw studs), whether or not threaded or tapped, when imported separately

brake equipment

camshaft timing gears or blanks

chain, timing, roller, 0.375 inch pitch

commutators and parts therefor, when imported separately electrical wiring harness sometimes called looms, whether or not fitted to any other component electrical cables and straps, as follows:

battery to earth battery to starter

engine to earth

solenoid switch to starter

whether or not fitted to any other component

elements, filter, oil or fuel

engine bearings and bushings

exterior decorative mouldings, including radiator grilles and wheel trim (but not including proprietary insignia emblems), whether or not fitted to any other component lamps, to which sub-paragraph 85.20.111 in Part II. of the

First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 applies, when imported separately

oil filters and fuel filters with or without elements, not fitted to any other component

oil seals

plugs, sparking, whether imported separately or otherwise radio and television receivers and transmitters, whether imported separately or otherwise

seals, water pump

tipping gear, hydraulic, and parts therefor, whether or not fitted to any other component

tyres and tubes, whether imported separately or otherwise other components, whether imported separately or otherwise, listed in the following Table, and parts therefor:



Equal Pay
