Crossing railways

"47.—(1.) A person shall not cross, or permit a vehicle or animal of which he is in charge to cross, a railway at any place other than an authorised crossing place.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.

"(2.) A person shall not cross or permit a vehicle or animal of which he is in charge to cross a railway at any place on the level unless it is safe to do so and, if a warning device is situated at or near that place, while the warning device is operating unless otherwise directed by an employee or a police officer.

Penalty: One hundred dollars

"(3.) A person in charge of a vehicle or animal approaching a railway on the level at a place at or near which a sign containing the word "STOP" is erected and facing in the direction from which the vehicle or animal is approaching shall, before crossing, or permitting the vehicle or animal to cross, the railway, cause the vehicle or animal to stop as near as is safely practicable to the sign unless otherwise directed by an employee or a police officer.

Penalty: One hundred dollars

"(4.) A person shall not, without lawful excuse, permit a vehicle of which he is in charge to be driven upon a railway.

Penalty: One hundred dollars.

"(5.) For the purposes of this clause, a person shall be deemed to be in charge of a vehicle or an animal if he is driving or riding the vehicle or animal or otherwise causing the vehicle or animal to move."

Additional amendments

4. By-law No. 47, as amended by By-law No. 73, by By-law No. 93 and by By-law 94 is amended as follows:—

The following definition is inserted in clause 3 after the definition of "employee", namely:—

"Police Officer" means a police officer of the Commonwealth or of a State or Territory of the Commonwealth.
