SECOND SCHEDULE

By-laws Nos S1222 to S1225

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE

By-law No. S1222

**Item No. 19
Second Schedule**

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1222.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 23 May 1970.
3. Customs By-law No. S8, published in Gazette No. 17 dated 18 February 1966, is amended as follows:
 - (a) Omit:

'Item 84.18 Hydro-extractors (of a kind used in laundries), of the direct electrically driven suspended girder kind, having a divided basket and an automatic lifting device and a maximum capacity of at least 6 loads per hour'.
 - (b) Omit:

'Item 84.20 Printing mechanisms, for recording weights and associated data, for incorporation in weighing machines, under security'.
 - (c) Omit:

'Item 84.20 Scales, hanging, spring actuated, specially constructed for attaching to crane hooks for weighing loads during the lifting process'.
 - (d) Omit:

'Item 84.20 Weighing machines, actuated by means of an electric load cell'.
 - (e) Omit:

'Item 84.20 Weighing machines, designed for the purpose of accurately determining the wheel weight of commercial vehicles and aircraft'.

**Item No. 19
Second Schedule**

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1223.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 23 May 1970.
3. Unless the context otherwise requires in this by-law in ascertaining whether goods fall within the terms of a reference or whether a reference applies to goods, regard shall be had to—
 - (a) the Rules for the Interpretation of the First Schedule set out in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969; and

- (b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their Tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

4. Item 19 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969, applies to goods described in the second column of the Table hereunder that are goods to which the item in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969, listed in the first column of that Table opposite those goods, applies.

The Table

First column	Second column
Item 84.18 Centrifuges, laboratory, but not including:	(a) centrifuges of a kind used solely or principally in the determination of packed cell volume of whole blood (micro-haematocrit); (b) centrifuges, having a maximum capacity not exceeding 1,600 millilitres, fitted with a swing-out head capable of a head speed not exceeding 5,000 revolutions per minute and developing a relative centrifugal force not exceeding 6,400 x g when loaded to maximum capacity; or (c) centrifuges, having a maximum capacity not exceeding 1,600 millilitres, fitted with an angle head capable of a head speed not exceeding 8,000 revolutions per minute and developing a relative centrifugal force not exceeding 11,800 x g when loaded to maximum capacity
Item 84.18 Centrifuges for clarifying or separating out oils, varnish or other liquids, but not including laboratory centrifuges	
Item 84.18 Hydro-extractors of a kind used in laundries or in the textile industry, having direct electrical drive, false bottom with attached dividers, automatic lifting device, capacity of at least eight loads per hour, and a load capacity of at least 200 lb dry weight	

By-law No. S1224

**Item No. 20
Second Schedule**

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S1224.
2. This by-law shall take effect on and from 23 May 1970.
3. Customs By-law No. S9, published in Gazette No. 17 dated 18 February 1966, is amended as follows:
 - (a) Omit:

'Item 84.18 Separators, designed solely for the separation of cream from whole milk, having a capacity greater than 175 gallons per hour'.

(b) Omit:

'Item 84.18 Separator parts, for use as replacement parts in separators used solely for the separation of cream from whole milk, under security'.

(c) Omit:

'Item 84.20 Scales, precision, high speed, incorporating magnetic damping device, operating on knife edges against a built-in counter-weighted beam, maximum capacity for full scale deflection 30 pounds'.

(b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their Tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969.

4. Item 20 in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969, applies to goods described in the second column of the Table hereunder that are goods to which the item in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1969, listed in the first column of that Table opposite those goods, applies.

The Table

First column	Second column
Item 84.18	Centrifuges, designed solely for the separation of cream from whole milk having a capacity greater than 175 gallons per hour
Item 84.18	Centrifuge parts, for use as replacement parts in centrifuges used solely for the separation of cream from whole milk, under security

5. In this by-law 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which this item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned.
