Imperial Merchant Shipping Act 1894, as amended

## FIRST SCHEDULE

# By-laws Nos F1102 and F1103

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item:
- (b) a sub-item;
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1970 as amended or proposed to be amended.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1970 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1970 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

# THE SCHEDULE By-law No. F1102

Sub-paragraph 39.01.191

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. F1102.
- 2. Sub-paragraph 39.01.191 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1970 applies to:

Goods to which sub-paragraph 39.01.199 otherwise applies, other than:

- (a) preparations being moulding compounds;
- (b) polypropylene glycols;
- (c) polyurethane synthetic resins obtained by reacting isocyanates with modified fatty oils;
- (d) brake fluids; or
- (e) terpene resins
- 3. Customs By-law No. F1036 published in Gazette No. 60 dated 20 July 1970 is hereby revoked.

# By-law No. F1103

Sub-paragraph 39.01.191

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. F1103.
- 2. Sub-paragraph 39.01.191 in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff  $1966{\cdot}1970$  applies to:

Goods to which sub-paragraph 39.01.199 otherwise applies, being terpene resins that are:

- (i) in direct transit to Australia on 7 April 1971 and are entered for home consumption within 21 days after importation; or
- (ii) in bond in Australia on 7 April 1971 and are entered for home consumption within 28 days after that date

# CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1970 SECOND SCHEDULE

#### By-Laws Nos S2139 to S2143

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1968, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1970 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1970 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

# AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE TO SCHEMES IN RELATION TO THE STATES AND THE NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of section 7 of the States Grants (Petroleum Products) Act 1965-69, and of section 7 of the Petroleum Products Subsidy Ordinance 1965-69, publish hereunder a copy of an amendment of the schedule to each of the schemes formulated under that Act in relation to the States of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania and of the schedule to the scheme formulated under that Ordinance in relation to the Northern Territory.

The schedule in each case is the schedule, a copy of which was published in Gazette No. 101, 8 December 1969 for the States as amended and Gazette No. 8, 6 February 1970 for the Northern Territory as amended. The amendments were made by me on the eighteenth day of March 1971 and took effect on and from that date.

#### **Actual Salaries**

# Equal Pay
