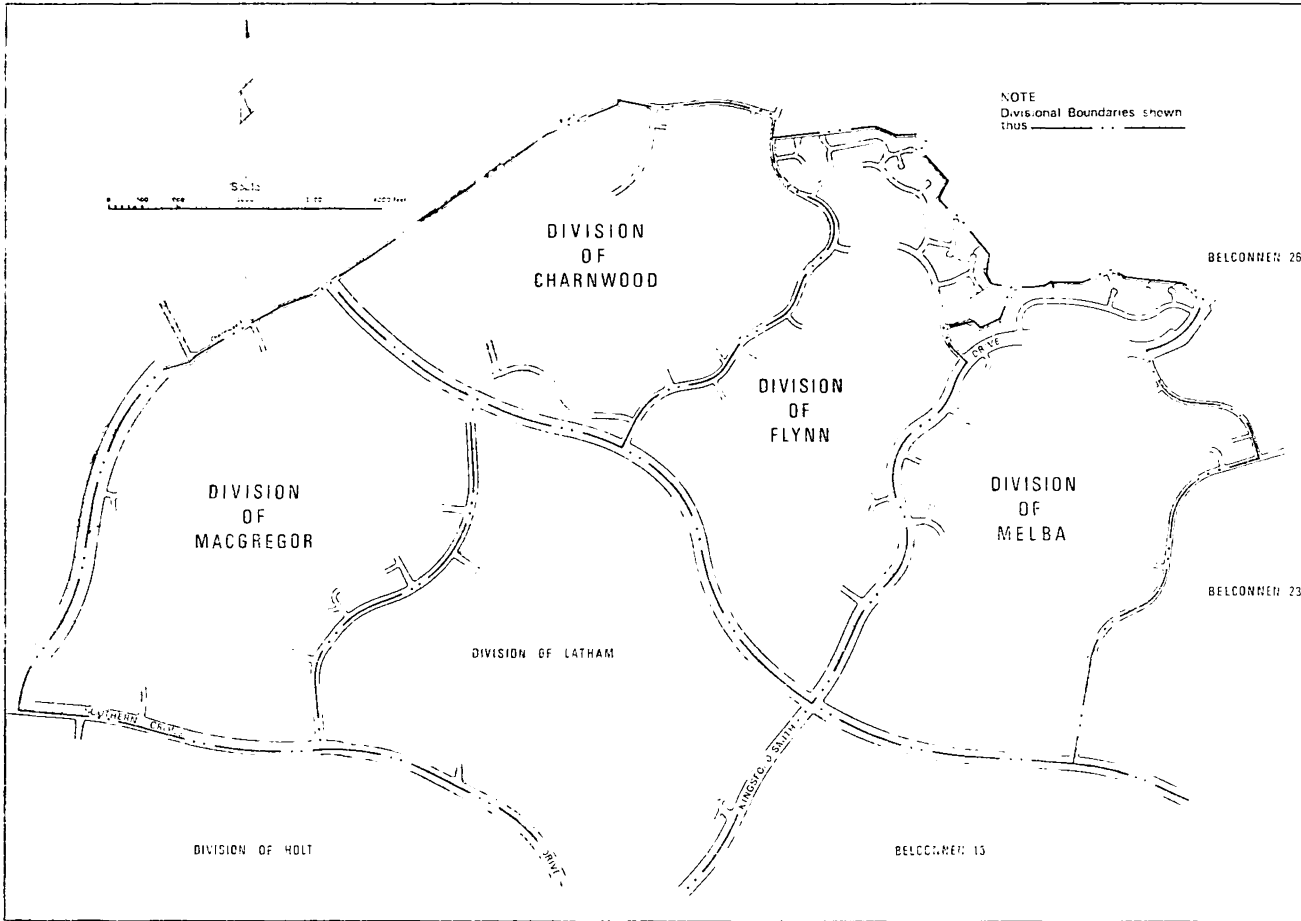

28.1.2 Representatives of Branches on the Council shall be the President of each Branch, provided that in the event of a President of a Branch being unable to attend a meeting of Council he may appoint in writing a proxy with full rights for that particular meeting, and provided that where the Corporate Membership of the Branch exceeds twenty-five per cent of the total Corporate Membership of the Institute, such Branch shall appoint an additional representative who may be a member of a Branch other than that by which he is appointed.

28.1.3 Representatives of Divisions on the Council shall be the respective Chairman of such Divisions, provided that in the event of a Chairman of a Division being a Corporate Member of the Institute and being unable to attend a meeting of Council he may appoint in writing another Corporate Member as proxy with full rights for that particular meeting.'

(c) By-law 29 is amended to read as follows:

'29 All members of the Council shall, except as hereinafter provided hold office until the conclusion of the ordinary business of the Annual General Meeting to be held in the year following their appointment, whereupon they shall all retire. The Honorary General Secretary and the Honorary General Treasurer and Representatives of Branches and the Honorary General Treasurer shall not vote.' offices until their successors are appointed.'

(d) Delete By-law 30.1 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'30.1 At a meeting of the Council held in each year, at least one month prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Council shall elect the President and the Vice-President for the succeeding year from Corporate Members of the Institute. At this Meeting the Council shall elect the Honorary General Secretary and the Honorary General Treasurer, but for this election the Honorary General Secretary and the Honorary General Treasurer shall not vote.'

(e) Delete By-law 30.3.

(f) Delete By-laws 31.1, 31.2 and 31.3 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'31.1 Any vacancy (due to death or resignation or removal from office) in the office of the President or Vice-President, Honorary General Secretary or Honorary General Treasurer, shall be filled by the Council; but any person so appointed shall retain his office so long only as his predecessor would have retained it if the vacancy had not occurred.

31.2 A member of the Council who is a Branch President or a Division Chairman shall cease to be a member of the Council immediately upon his ceasing to be a Branch President or a Division Chairman and in such case his successor as Branch President or Division Chairman shall forthwith upon his appointment become a member of the Council.

31.3 Any vacancy, due to the death, resignation or removal from office of an additional Branch representative shall be filled by the appropriate Branch Committee, but any person so appointed shall remain a member so long only as his predecessor would have if the vacancy had not occurred.'

(g) Delete By-law 33 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'33.1 There shall be duly constituted each year by the President a Standing Committee of Council which shall be known as the Executive Council and which shall be the Administrative and Executive Body of the Institute and shall be responsible to the Council for the implementation of policy decisions made by the Council on all matters delineated by the Charter and these By-laws except Clause 18 of the Charter.

The Executive Council shall consist of the President, the Vice-President, the Honorary General Secretary, the Honorary General Treasurer and other members appointed from Council.

33.2 Council may also set up further Committees and delegate powers thereto, as it may deem desirable. Such a Committee shall receive its delegation in writing, signed by the President of the Institute and may consist of one or more members of Council. Its powers shall exclude the election or admission of Honorary Fellows, Fellows, Associates or Juniors, the exclusion or suspension of a member from membership, the expenditure of capital moneys of the Institute or other capital expenditure, the selling, mortgaging, encumbering or disposing of any real property, securities or investments of the Institute, or the borrowing of money, and any delegation may contain such limitation as the Council thinks fit and shall be limited accordingly.'

(h) Delete By-law 34 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'34.1 The Council shall meet at least twice annually at such time and place as it shall determine and shall regulate its own proceedings.

34.2 The Executive Council shall meet at least six times annually and a meeting may be called at any time by order of the President.

34.3 A meeting of the Council may be called at any time by order of the President or on the requisition of three or more Branch Presidents and such meeting shall be held not less than ten and not more than thirty days after the receipt of the order of the President or the requisition of the third Branch President at the office of the Registrar.

34.4 The travelling and living expenses of the members of the Council shall, whenever determined by, the Council be defrayed from the funds of the Institute.

34.5 For the transaction of business one half of the total members of the Council shall constitute a quorum, except that at any meeting called for the sole purpose of admission of applicants to Associate or Junior membership the quorum shall be five members of Council.'

(i) By-law 35.1 is amended to read as follows:

'35.1 Resolutions of the Council shall be passed or amended only by the concurring vote of a majority of the votes cast by members of the Council entitled to vote and present at any meeting of which notice outlining generally the business to be transacted has been given in writing to every member of the Council and to every Honorary Branch and Division Secretary seven days at least before the day of such meeting.'

(j) Delete By-laws 35.1.1 and 35.1.2 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'35.1.1 Provided that Representatives of Branches shall be entitled to two votes each and that in the absence of the second representative of a Branch whose membership exceeds 25 per cent of the total Corporate Membership of the Institute, the attending representative may exercise four votes.

All other members of the Council shall be entitled to one vote each.

35.1.2 Provided that no resolution shall be passed or amended unless all representatives of at least half of the Branches vote in favour of it.'

(k) Delete By-law 35.2.

(l) Delete By-law 36 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'36.1 The President of the Institute shall be Chairman of every meeting of the Council or the Executive Council, as the case may be. Provided that—

36.1.1 In the absence of the President, the Vice-President if present shall be Chairman of the meeting of the Council or the Executive Council as the case may be.

36.1.2 If both the President and Vice-President are unable to attend any meeting of the Council or Executive Council a Member of the Council who has been appointed by the President in writing under his signature to act as Chairman for that meeting, shall be Chairman.

36.1.3 If at the time when the Meeting is to commence, neither the President, the Vice-President, or the President's nominee (if any) so appointed by him, is present, or if any of the three being present decline to act as Chairman, another Member of the Council or Executive Council shall be elected Chairman of such meeting.

36.2 Any meeting of the Council or Executive Council may adjourn to such time and place and on such conditions as the majority by resolution decides.'

(m) Delete By-law 37 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'37 Minutes of the proceedings of the Council and of the Executive Council shall be entered in books to be provided for the purpose, together with the names of those present at such Meetings. Copies of such Minutes shall be forwarded to members of the Council, to Branch Committees and to Division Secretaries.'

(n) By-law 38.2 is amended to read as follows:

'38.2 A member who leaves Australia shall remain a member of the Branch to which he belonged when he left Australia, unless he requests otherwise.'

(o) Insert a new By-law 38.5 to read as follows:

'38.5 On and from the dissolution of a Branch, all assets and the management or control of that Branch shall be administered by Council.'

(p) Delete By-law 39 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'39.1 A Branch Committee may with the approval of the Council form or dissolve a Section in any clearly defined area for members resident in that area.

39.2 On and from the dissolution of a Section, all assets and the management or control of that Section shall be administered by the Branch Committee in whose area it was established.'

(q) Delete By-law 40 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

'40.1 The Council may form or dissolve subject divisions in selected technical scientific and professional matters related to Chemistry.

40.2 On and from the dissolution of a Division, all assets and the management or control of that Division shall be administered by Council.'

- 40.3 A Branch Committee, with the approval of the Council, may form or dissolve subject groups in selected technical scientific and professional matters related to Chemistry.
- 40.4 On and from the dissolution of a Group, all assets and the management or control of that Group shall be administered by the Branch Committee by which it was established.'

Part B

(a) Delete By-law 20 and insert the following in lieu thereof:

- '20.1 All annual subscriptions of Corporate Members shall be due on the first day of July in each year for the financial year then beginning. Any Corporate Member whose subscription for any year is not paid by the first day of July next ensuing shall be regarded as being twelve months in arrears.
- 20.2 All annual subscriptions of classes of members other than Corporate Members shall be due on the first day of January of each year. Any member of these classes of members whose subscription for any year is not paid by the first day of January of the next ensuing year shall be regarded as being twelve months in arrears.
- 20.3 A person admitted to any class of membership or a member of any class elected or transferred from one class to another in the first six months in either the calendar or financial year as the class of membership requires shall pay the annual subscription for the current year appropriate to the class to which he is admitted, elected or transferred, less the amount of any annual subscription already paid by him for such year, but a person elected or transferred from one class to another after the first six months of either the calendar or financial year as the class of membership requires shall pay only half of the annual subscription for the current membership year appropriate to the class to which he is admitted, elected or transferred, less half the amount of any annual subscription already paid by him for such year.'

(b) By-law 42.4 shall be amended by substitution of the word 'October' for the word 'August'.

(c) By-law 43 shall be amended by substitution of the word 'October' for the word 'August' wherever it occurs.

(d) By-law 52 shall be amended by substitution of the word 'November' for the word 'September'.

(e) By-law 53 shall be amended by substitution of the word 'October' for the word 'August'.

(f) By-law 55.1 shall be amended by substitution of the word 'November' for the word 'September'.

(g) By-law 67 shall be amended by substitution of the word 'November' for the word 'September'.
