AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

Cemeteries Ordinance 1933-1966

WHEREAS by section 18 of the Cemeteries Ordinance 1933-1966 it is provided that the Minister of State for the Interior may by notice in the Gazette order that, after a time specified in the notice not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in any cemetery shall be wholly, discontinued or discontinued subject to such exceptions and qualifications as the Minister thinks fit:

AND WHEREAS by notice published in the Gazette dated the twenty-ninth day of April, 1937, the Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of that section, ordered that burials in the cemetery known as St John the Baptist's Church Cemetery, at Reid in the Australian Capital Territory, be discontinued on and after the thirty-first day of July, 1937, provided that any person who was the holder of an exclusive right of burial, at that date, could exercise his right in that regard at any time thereafter:

AND WHEREAS by notice published in the Gazette dated the sixth day of February, 1961, the Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of that section, ordered that, from that date, the first-mentioned order have effect subject to the additional exception that the body of the late William Shepherd, Viscount Dunrossil, could be buried in that Cemetery:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to provide further exceptions to the abovementioned Orders;

NOW THEREFORE, I, RALPH JAMES DUNNET HUNT, Minister of State for the Interior, in pursuance of section 18 of the Cemeteries Ordinance 1933-1966, HEREBY ORDER that the abovementioned Orders shall, from the date on which this Order is published in the Gazette, have effect subject to the additional exceptions that the bodies of such persons as are described in the Schedule to this instrument may also be buried in the cemetery known as St John the Baptist's Church of England Cemetery, at Reid in the Australian Capital Territory.

THE SCHEDULE

The body of a person who dies while holding the office of Rector of the Parish of St John the Baptist in the Australian Capital Territory or Bishop of the Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn;

The body of the wife of a Rector of the said Parish or of a Bishop of the said Diocese who dies while those persons are holding the respective said offices;

the body of a person who dies while in retirement immediately ensuant on the holding of either of those offices;

the body of the wife of a person where the said wife dies while that person is in retirement or dies while in retirement immediately ensuant on the holding of either of those offices;

the body of a person who has held the office of Rector of the said Parish or Bishop of the said Diocese whose deceased wife is buried in that cemetery may also be buried in the same grave.

SECOND SCHEDULE

By-laws Nos S2210 to S2217

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1971, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto-

(i) 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which that by-law item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned; and

- (ii) a reference to:
 - (a) an item;
 - (b) a sub-item;
 - (c) a paragraph; or
 - (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1971 as amended or proposed to be amended.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1971 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1971 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

- (c) mechanical driving units and apparatus for transmitting power from the driving units to the driven units and parts therefor or for use therewith being goods for or for use with machines specified in a succeeding clause;
- (d) apparel of any kind;
- (e) capstans, with or without power take-offs;
- (f) cranes;
- (g) davits;
- (h) earthmoving machines, machinery or vehicles;
- (i) goods for use in connection with-
 - (i) raising of petroleum to the well head; or
 - (ii) controlling, treating, storing or conveying petroleum raised to the well head;

- (k) natural barium sulphate;
- (l) road vehicles of general purpose kinds;

SECOND SCHEDULE

By-law No. S2207

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1971, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which that by-law item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned.

THE SCHEDULE By-law No. S2207

Item No. 15 Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. \$2207.
- 2. Part I. of the Table to Customs By-law No. S2070, published in Gazette No. 100 dated 9 November 1970, as amended, is further amended, by omitting clause 14 and inserting the following clause:-
- "(14) Vehicles, or a proportion by In respect to clause (14) value as provided in column 2 of a vehicle, imported by a passenger, viz.:-
 - (a) motor cars, vans, trucks or motorised caravans
 - (b) non-motorised caravans
 - (c) box, boat or similar trailers, non-motorised
 - (d) vessels of a kind designed principally for use in waters sheltered sport or recreation, being vessels conforming to one of the following specifications:
- 1. (i) Not more than one article specified in each of the four classes (a), (b), (c) and (d) will be allowed per family per three years;
 - (ii) In each case the Collector shall be satisfied that-
 - (a) the passenger has come to Australia with the intention of forthwith taking up permanent residence;

- (i) boats of a kind propelled by manual or pedal power;
- (ii) sailing boats that—

 (a) in the sailing condition do not exceed 8 feet in width at any section;
 - (b) do not exceed 1,000 kilogrammes unladen weight;
 - (c) do not incorporate any device for propelling the boat by power, for example an auxiliary motor; and
 - (d) are not of the deep keel type; or
- (iii) powered boats that—
 - (a) do not exceed 22 feet in length, overall;
 - (b) do not exceed 8 feet in width at any section; and
 - (c) do not exceed 1,250 kilogrammes unweight laden when imported driving with units and transmissions or, 800 kilogrammes unladen weight when imported without driving units and transmissions

- (b) the goods have been, except as pro-vided in the next succeeding proviso, for the whole of the period period of fifteen months immediately preceding the passenger's departure for Australia, personally owned and used by the passenger in the country in which he was living; and
- (iii) In respect to a vessel specified in sub-clause (d), security shall be given by the passenger to and to the satisfaction of the Collector that the goods will not be sold or otherwise disposed of in Australia by or on behalf of the passenger, or in the event of his prior decease, by or on behalf of his legal personal representative, within two years after the date of its entry for home consumption.
- 2. Where goods have been owned and used as provided in the last preceding proviso for a period not less than 15 months less 14 days the proportion by value of the goods to which clause 14 applies shall be as follows:

Where period Proportion is 15 months of value

less 1 day 983% less 2 days 971% less 3 days 95% less 4 90% days days 85% less 5 80% less 6 days 75% less 7 days 70% less 8 days 60% less 9 days less 10 days 50% less 11 days 40% less 12 days 30% . . less 13 days 20% 10% less 14 days

- 3. That clause does not apply to a vehicle of a kind specified in sub-clauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of clause 14:
 - (c) and (d) of clause 14:—

 (a) imported by a passenger who has entered for home consumption under item 14 or 15 of the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1971 a vehicle of a kind specified in subclause (a), (b), (c) or (d), as the case may be within the three years immediately preceding the importation of the first mentioned vehicle; or
 - (b) imported within that period by a passenger who is a member of the family of that first mentioned passenger".

CUSTOMS (IMPORT LICENSING) REGULATIONS

EXCEPTION NOTICE No. M.15

1, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, the Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me under regulation 17 of the Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations, do hereby—

- (a) revoke all subsisting exceptions made in pursuance of that regulation; and
- (b) except from the application of those regulations the goods specified in the Schedule to this notice.

For the purposes of this notice-

- 'Customs Tariff' means 'The Customs Tariff 1966-1971 as amended from time to time or that Act as proposed to be amended from time to time by a Customs Tariff alteration proposed in the Parliament.'
- 'First Schedule' means the first Schedule to the Customs Tariff.

THE SCHEDULE

Item No. in this Schedule

Description of Goods

- Goods not otherwise excepted from those regulations when imported in the one consignment of which the total value for duty does not exceed \$20.
- Goods which in the opinion of the Collector are not related to any commercial transaction.

- Goods permitted importation temporarily in conformity with the provisions of an intergovernmental agreement to which Australia is a signatory.

 - (a) Earthmoving, or excavating vehicles, machinery or equipment (for example, rock buggies, dumpers, graders, loaders, ditchers, draglines, mechanical sholvels, excavators, scrapers, bull-dozers) and parts thereof.
 - (b) Tractors, road rollers and parts thereof.
 - (c) Materials handling equipment (for example, cranes, forklift trucks) and parts thereof.
 - (d) Other vehicles being used or secondhand four-wheel drive vehicles, excluding public service type passenger vehicles, falling within items 87.02, 87.03 and 87.04 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1971.
 - (ii) goods of a kind falling within item 76.01 in the First Schedule, other than waste and scrap being the produce of and shipped direct from New Zealand.
 - (iii) knitted coats, jumpers, cardigans, sweaters and the like, falling within either sub-paragraph 60.05.121 or sub-paragraph 60.05.129 in the First Schedule, other than these goods when of New Zealand origin and when shipped direct from that country.
 - (iv) men's and boys' knitted shirts falling within subitem 60.04.1. and men's and boys' knitted shirts (so-called) falling within sub-item 60.05.4 in the First Schedule, other than these goods when of New Zealand origin and when shipped direct from that country.

# FELLOWSHIPS, SCHOLARSHIPS, ETC.

### RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS AT THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY

APPLICATIONS are invited from permanent officers of the Commonwealth Service for Research Fellowships in 1972. The Fellowships will entitle Fellows to spend one year in a department of the Australian National University.

Eligibility-Fellowships will be available to senior officers of subtantial experience who would benefit from a period of reading and supervised writing on a research topic. The primary purpose of the Fellowship is not to enable officers to obtain a higher degree but to provide them with the opportunity to make a worthwhile contribution to a particular field of research. The field of research, chosen by the Fellow in conjunction with his Department and the University, must be of interest and benefit to both the University and the Commonwealth Service.

Selection—Applicants for Fellowships must first obtain sponsorship from their Departments. Departments will submit nominations, which will be considered by a selection committee.

Benefits—Fellows will receive full salary for the period of Fellowship. The University will pay costs of the Fellow's travel to Canberra, and may provide accommodation at normal charges for Fellows not resident in Canberra. If possible, single Fellows will live at University House, and married Fellows with families will be provided with furnished houses or apartments. Fellows engaged in research are entitled to attend seminar groups and discussions within the University in their general fields of interest. Successful officers will take up the Fellowship at the beginning of the academic year in March 1972.

Conditions-A Fellow will be required to produce a paper on his year's work at the University and to enter into an agreement to remain in the Commonwealth Service for a period of three years from the date of resumption of duty.

#### APPLICATIONS AND CLOSING DATE

Applications for Fellowships are to be submitted on application forms which may be obtained from the offices of the Common-wealth Public Service Inspectors in the States or the Public Service Board in Canberra.

They must be forwarded through and with the recommendation of the Fellow's Department.

Applications should reach the Secretary of the Public Service

Board, Canberra, on or before 29 October 1971.

#### **Education Research Unit**

Mr D. S. Anderson, Dr G. Harman, Dr C. S. Smith—The main research interests in 1972-73 will centre around education for the professions including a study of the teaching profession, allocation of resources and cost-benefit analyses of education, pressure groups and educational policy, and Commonwealth-State relations in education. It is intended that some comparative studies be made with overseas countries. Specific areas likely to be of interest to Commonwealth Officers including the analysis of data pertaining to the recruitment and progress of students in higher education, economic analyses of education systems and studies of educational planning.

#### **Economic History**

Professor Butlin-Areas likely to be of most interest to Commonwealth Officers include quantitative analysis of economic growth and development in Australia, including the comparative study with overseas countries. The work is at 3 levels covering the preparation of statistical series of historical social accounting data, the interpretation of the data, and its use in analytical studies. The statistical data include employment and unemployment, quantum estimates of industry product, capital stock, public authority transactions, and analysis of foreign trade and investment since the First World War. Interpretative work is mainly devoted to quality change in price and quantum series and use of figures of aggregate output for welfare and productivity comparison. Analytical studies cover a wide field, including particular studies of the effect of a government activity on the character and direction of economic development of selected industries, the association between economic growth and capital inflow and the labour capital productivity in Australia. There is also opportunity for traditional and descriptive studies in economic history, including business and institutional histories.

#### Economics

Professor Swan—A suitable research project in many instances would be to take some episode or problem of public policy from the recent past or the present and to analyse its background and implications.

#### History

Professor La Nauze—Current research is concerned with Australia, modern British and Indian history. The most relevant field is the early history (1901-14) of the Australian Commonwealth—political, administrative or diplomatic.

#### Law

Professor Sawer—Federal Constitutional Law; Administrative Law; Private and Common Law (contracts, torts, etc.); Criminology.

# Philosophy

Professor Passmore—Higher education, problems in political and social philosophy, history of philosophy.

# History of Ideas Unit

Dr Kamenka—Relations between political, social, philosophical and literary ideas.

#### Political Science

Professors Parker and Burns-Historical development of a selected function of the Commonwealth Government; modes and problems of Commonwealth-State participation in one of the concurrent functions of government; recruitment and composition of senior administrative staff in public services; how the Statutory Corporation form affects policy making and administration in any corporation; the formulation and administration of Australian tariff policy; legal and administrative aspects of 'extra-Constitutional' activities of the Commonwealth, e.g., in research, education, civil aviation control and facilities, regional development, labour relations, e.g., implementing of ILO conventions, employment and vocational guidance services; public health administration; regional structure and administration of selected Commonwealth departments, e.g., is the State unit the most convenient? Possible scope for delegation to departments of staffing functions under the Public Service Act; administrative problems arising from Public Service Arbitration.

#### Sociology

(Vacant)—Occupational and social structure and mobility, urbanisation, the professions, social institutions (e.g., social services, education) and the sociology of religion.

#### **Statistics**

Professor Moran—Mathematical statistics, probability theory, and their applications in physical and biological science.

#### Urban Research Unit

Dr Neutze—Urban land market, private development and redevelopment, public authorities (e.g., Housing, Water and Sewerage Authorities) and local government as they operate in urban areas; and traffic accidents.

#### Prehistory

Professor Golson-Research into the prehistory of Australia and New Guinea, the Pacific Islands and South-East Asia.

#### Research School of Chemistry

#### Organic Chemistry

Professor Birch, Mr Rickards, Dr MacLeod-Structure determination and biosynthesis of natural products, including antibiotics and other biologically-active compounds, mould metabolites, and plant and marine products; insect chemistry, total synthesis involving new reactions; organic aspects of organometallic chemistry. Mass spectrometry including deuteriumlabelling studies of specific fragmentation processes; combined g.c.-m.s. analyses of biological mixtures.

#### **Physical-Organic Chemistry**

Dr Parker—Solvent effects on rates, equilibria and mechanism of organic and inorganic reactions. Substitution and elimination reactions of carbon compounds, displacements at platinum and sulphur. Calorimetry, 'hydrometallurgy' and electrochemistry in non-aqueous solvents.

#### Inorganic Chemistry

Professor Martin, Dr Sargeson, Dr Buckingham, Dr Bennett-Stereochemistry, synthesis, mechanism of substitution and reactions at co-ordinated ligands, including peptide synthesis and degradation using metal chelates.

Synthesis, stereochemistry and reactions of organometallic complexes, with emphasis at present on metal-olefin, tertiary phosphine and carbonyl complexes, and on the stabilisation of small ring acetylenes on metals.

Magnetochemistry, especially the study of metal-metal interactions in paramagnetic clusters.

Any permanent officer may, within 21 days of the date of such publication, lodged with the Public Service Inspector in the State in which the training course is located, an appeal against his non-selection. Protective appeals are not necessary as the case of a selected officer will be considered as a matter of course, against all appellants and against each of the other officers selected for training.

The Training Course will not commence until the results of all appeals are determined by the Board,

If an officer selected as a reserve is not included in the course, his selection as reserve does not give him any guarantee of selection for a later course.

6. Salary—

- (a) (i) Officers of the Department of Customs and Excise who apply for training in a State other than that in which they are located will, if successful, be temporarily transferred at their substantive classifications (subject to (b) below) for the period of training. Travelling allowance will be paid. On completion of the course officers may be required to accept permanent transfer at departmental expense at their substantive classifications to the State in which training is undertaken;

    (ii) Officers from other Departments who apply will, if selected, and subject to the parent department's agreement, be temporarily transferred at their substantive classifications (subject to (b) below) to the Department of Customs and Excise for the period of training. Endeavours will be made to absorb these officers on completion of the course.
- (b) Officers in receipt of higher duties allowance at the commencement of the course and who would have continued to act but for selection for training will continue to receive that allowance.
- 7. Training—The course of training will include both theoretical and practical segments and be of at least 4 weeks' duration.
- 8. Examinations—Officers will be required to undergo theoretical and practical tests from time to time so that the Department may ensure that they are making satisfactory progress. If the Department of Customs and Excise, at any time in the course of training, considers that an officer is not progressing satisfactorily, he may be removed from the course and placed in his former position or one of similar status.
- 9. Recognition of Training—Officers who complete the course satisfactorily will be regarded by the Department as having attained the minimum standard of efficiency required to perform the duties of Senior Preventive Officer, Grade 2. However, advancement to this level will not be automatic and will depend both on relative efficiencies of qualified officers and on the occurrence of vacancies.

10. Leave and Furlough—Officers selected for training should not expect any period of recreation leave or furlough during the course. #### Part A-Primary Sorting

Primary sorting as prescribed for advancement in the Inland Section, or, at the option of candidates in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide and Perth, the alternative test may be taken.

Alternative Test—Primary sorting of envelopes, containing paper, addressed to:

- (c) The addresses placed on the envelopes in respect of each State to be such as to ensure that each separation in the primary sorting field will be used, but as far as practicable the addresses are to be confined to place names, the memorising of which is necessary for accuracy in primary sorting.

The envelopes to comprise the overseas portion of the test will be addressed to 100 places and/or countries which a Mail Officer is expected to memorise for the purpose of primary sorting. The addresses will be selected on a basis which will ensure that each relative pigeonhole on the press will be used proportionately to the normal volume of traffic handled under working conditions.

In Sydney, the primary sorting test is to be conducted in the following manner:

- (a) The 500 envelopes (interstate and overseas envelopes intermixed) are to be sorted in a maximum time of 14 minutes.
- (b) The 100 overseas envelopes are then to be sorted in a maximum time of 3 minutes.
- (c) Acandidate whose errors in the two primary sorting tests combined have not exceeded twelve is to be recorded at once as having passed; where the errors have exceeded twelve, the examining officer may call over the mis-sorted envelopes to the candidate, who is to be credited with 75 per cent of the correct answers then given. If, after deduction of such credit from the total number of errors, the number of errors is reduced to or below twelve, the candidate will be recorded as having passed in Part A of the examination.

In Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide and Perth, the 500 envelopes are to be sorted in a maximum time of 14 minutes.

Error allowances and other conditions are the same as those prescribed for the Inland Section.
