ORDER OF EXEMPTION

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Banking Act 1959-1967 it is provided that, where any person desires to carry on any banking business in Australia but does not desire to carry on the general business of banking, the Treasurer may, by order published in the Gazette, exempt that person from compliance with such of the provisions of that Act as are specified in the order:

And whereas the Treasurer, by Banking (Exemption) Order No. 14, published in the Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of March 1965, exempted Commercial Bills Australia Limited from compliance with certain provisions of that Act:

And whereas the Treasurer, by Banking (Exemption) Orders Nos 19, 42 and 51, published in the Gazette on the eighteenth day of November, 1965, the tenth day of July, 1969, and the eighth day of July, 1971, varied that Order:

And whereas it is desired to vary Banking (Exemption) Order No. 14, as varied by Banking (Exemption) Orders Nos 19, 42 and 51:

Now therefore I, Billy Mackie Snedden, the Treasurer of the Commonwealth, hereby make the following Order:

- (1) This Order may be cited as Banking (Exemption) Order No.
- (2) Banking (Exemption) Order No. 14, as varied by Banking (Exemption) Orders Nos 19, 42 and 51, is varied by adding at the end of the Schedule the following words: 'Citinational Securities Corporation Limited.'.

CUSTOMS PROCLAMATION NO. 1239

Commonwealth of Australia to wit PAUL HASLUCK Governor-General. By His Excellency, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section fifteen of the Customs Act 1901-1971 it is enacted that the Governor-General may by proclamation establish ports and fix their limits:

AND WHEREAS section eighteen of the said Act provides that all ports in actual use by authority at the commencement of the Act shall continue as if established under the Act;

AND WHEREAS the port at Port Hedland in the State of Western Australia was in actual use by authority at the commencement of the Act and by virtue of the said section eighteen continued as if established under the Act;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that a port of other bounds should be established at Port Hedland pursuant to section fifteen of the said Act;

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Paul Meernaa Caedwalla Hasluck, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council hereby:

- (i) establish as a port for the purposes of the said Act the waters within an arc of radius of ten nautical miles from a point of latitude 20 degrees 18 minutes 11 seconds South and longitude 118 degrees 34 minutes 16 seconds East (in the vicinity of the southernmost extremity of Hunt Point); and
- (ii) fix as the limits of the said port the arc hereinbefore mentioned and the coastline of Western Australia at mean high water between the points at which it is intersected by the arc.

- (a) appoint as a wharf for the purposes of the said Act, the wharf premises of 13 acres 1 rood 2 perches more or less known as 'Berth No. 4 White Bay' situated at Balmain in the Municipality of Leichhardt, Parish of Petersham, County of Cumberland, in the State of New South Wales and being the premises the subject of the plan catalogued 'PM.579XL' in the offices of the Maritime Services Board of New South Wales; and
- (b) fix as the limits of the said wharf the bounds thereof as shown in the said plan.

Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1971

PROCLAMATION

Commonwealth of Australia to wit PAUL HASLUCK Governor-General. By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 103 of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1971 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, revoke wholly or in part any reservation of land;

AND WHEREAS by section 103 of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1931-1971 of the Northern Territory of Australia it is provided that the Governor-General may at any time, by Proclamation, reserve for such purpose in relation to the Northern Territory as he thinks fit, any unalienated Crown land;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to reserve the lands described in the Schedule hereto for educational purposes; NOW THEREFORE I, SIR PAUL MEERNAA CAEDWALLA HASLUCK, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby—
