CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1971

SECOND SCHEDULE

By-Laws Nos S2272 to S2275

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1971, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto-

- (i) 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which that by-law item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned; and
- (ii) . a reference to:
 - (a) an item;
 - (b) a sub-item;
 - (c) a paragraph; or
 - (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1971 as amended or proposed to be amended.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1971 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1971 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

- 2. The Second Table of Customs By-law No. S2010, published in Gazette No. 60 dated 20 July 1970, as amended, is further amended, as follows:

Item 70.19 Glass grains (that is to say, ballotini) having a refractive index in excess of 1.66 and for reflective purposes, under security'.

NOTIFICATION IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 73 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT 1953-1971 OF REGISTRATION AS A REGISTERED MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL BENEFITS ORGANIZATION

- (a) Name of Organization: Queensland Teachers' Union Health Society.
- (b) Name of State or Territory to which Registration Relates: Queensland.
- (c) Date of Registration: 13th March 1972.
- (d) The registration is subject to the conditions set out in section 73B of the National Health Act 1953-1971.
- (e) Other terms and conditions of Registration-
 - (i) the organization will not enter into a refund agreement as defined in Part VII of the National Health Act or become an agent of a party to a refund agreement for the purposes of the refund agreement;
 - (ii) the organization will keep a record, in a form approved by the Director-General, of the names and addresses, being addresses last known by the organization, of all members of the organization who were and have continued to be parties to refund agreements with registered organizations;
 - (iii) the organization will comply at all times with any relevant laws in any State or Territory in which it operates, except where Commonwealth law provides to the contrary;
 - (iv) the organization will ensure that members can readily ascertain all details of their entitlements to benefits and that new members are automatically provided with such information:
 - (v) the organization will not, without prior approval of the Director-General of Health, enter into an agency, or reinsurance arrangement with a person or a body conducting health insurance business but not registered under the National Health Act.
