WHEREAS it is provided in sub-section (1) of section seven of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965 that the Minister for Customs and Excise may, after inquiry and report by the Tariff Board, cause a notice to be published in the Gazette specifying the goods as to which he is satisfied that—

(a) the export price of any of those goods that have been exported to Australia is less than the normal value of the goods so exported; and

(b) the exportation of those goods is causing or threatening injury to an Australian industry producing or manufacturing like or directly competitive goods or may hinder the establishment of an Australian industry in connexion with the production or manufacture of like or directly competitive goods, and

WHEREAS inquiry and report by the Tariff Board, in respect to the goods specified in this Notice, has been made,

NOW, therefore, I, Donald Leslie Chipp, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of sub-section (1) of section seven and sub-section (1) of section sixteen of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965, and all other enabling powers, specify, subject to the next succeeding paragraph, Caustic Soda which has been entered for home consumption on and after 13 October 1969 to be the class or kind of goods as to which I am so satisfied.

This notice does not apply to caustic soda imported for use in the production of alumina and so used.

This Notice may be cited as Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 6 (1972).

NOW, therefore, I, Donald Leslie Chipp, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of sub-section (1) of section seven and sub-section (1) of section sixteen of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965, and all other enabling powers specify toilet units of the recirculating self-contained type which have been exported to Australia on or after 26 August 1971 to be the class or kind of goods as to which I am so satisfied.

SECOND SCHEDULE

By-law No. S2280

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1971, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the following by-law.

By-law No. S2280

Item No. 15 Second Schedule

- 1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2280.
- 2. This by-law shall be deemed to have taken effect on and from 1 May 1972.

- 3. Part I. of the Table to Customs By-law No. S2070, published in Gazette No. 100 dated 9 November 1970, as amended, is further amended by omitting clauses (17) and (18) and inserting the following clauses:
- '(17) Electrical appliances, viz: (1) Only one appliance selec-(A) radio receivers; ted from each of the three

(B) magnetic sound reproducers; and

(C) gramophones, imported by a person aged (2) 18 years or older or by a person aged 10 years or older and less than 18 years who is travelling alone

- (1) Only one appliance selected from each of the three groups (A), (B) or (C) (specified in column 1) will be allowed this concession.
- One appliance, combining any two or all groups (A), (B), (C), shall constitute the allowance for the groups incorporated in the combination.
- (3) Only radio receivers weighing 4 pounds or less and other appliances (whether single or combinations) weighing 12 pounds or less are included.

(4) Excludes appliances incorporating—

(a) radio transmitters;

(b) television receivers or transmitters; or

(c) video equipment.
(1) Restricted to one receiver per passenger.

(2) Only radio receivers weighing 4 pounds or less are included.

(3) Excludes receivers incorporating—

(a) radio transmitters;

(b) television receivers or transmitters;

(c) video equipment;

(d) magnetic sound reproducers; or

(e) gramophones.

## Customs Act 1901-1971 CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966-1972 SECOND SCHEDULE By-laws Nos S2281 to S2284

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901-1971, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto-

- (i) 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which that by-law item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned; and
- (ii) a reference to:
  - (a) an item;
  - (b) a sub-item;
  - (c) a paragraph; or
  - (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972 as amended or proposed to be amended.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.



## THE HARKNESS FELLOWSHIPS OF THE COMMONWEALTH FUND OF NEW YORK

## Awards from Australia—1973

### HARKNESS FELLOWSHIPS

FIVE Fellowships for study and travel in the United States for a period of twelve to twenty-one months are offered annually by the Commonwealth Fund of New York to candidates from Australia and New Zealand.

These awards are characterised by a number of distinctive features: wide latitude of permitted programmes, freedom of choice in selecting a place of study, a period of obligatory travel in the United States, and emphasis on a candidate's personal qualities as well as academic or professional distinction.

The competition is intense and only those with outstanding records will be considered.

### ELIGIBILITY

Candidacy is open to men and women in any profession or field of study who will be not more than 30 years of age on 1 September 1973. (Consideration may be given in exceptional circumstances to a candidate somewhat above this age.)

Candidates must, by 1 September 1973, have a degree or an equivalent qualification conferred by a professional body, or an outstanding record of achievement in the creative arts, journalism or other comparable careers. Candidates who propose an academic career after tenure must have had experience of post-graduate study, and candidates for the M.B.A. must have had substantial full-time administrative experience.

Candidates for the Australian awards must be citizens of Australia or have taken steps to achieve citizenship. Candidates must be either—

- members of the Commonwealth or a State Public Service or a semi-Government authority;
- (2) staff or post-graduate students at an Australian university;

(3) individuals recommended for nomination by the Local Correspondents.

Candidacy is not open to persons who, between their 18th birth-day and 1 September 1973, will have lived in the United States for more than six months.

#### **TENURE**

Confirmation of all Fellowship awards is conditional upon: the grant of an Exchange-Visitor visa by the United States consular authorities, a successful health examination, satisfactory arrangements for programme in the United States, and an agreed plan for families.

The Fellowships are tenable for a period of 12 to 21 months, normally commencing in September of the year of the award. Within this range, tenure is adjusted to the programme and personal circumstances of the individual, but all Fellows are encouraged to complete the full period, and younger Fellows are expected to do so.

Fellows are not required to work for an American degree or necessarily to be based at a university, but they must follow a specific programme of study or investigation approved by Fund officers and they are normally expected to be attached to an academic, research, governmental, or similar institution. Instructions concerning 'Admission to U.S. Graduate Schools' which are included with the Harkness Fellowship application material must be strictly observed.

A Fellow is required to spend at least three months travelling within the United States. Travel plans are to be formulated in consultation with the Fund after arrival in America.

A Fellowship is a full-time occupation. Fellows may not perform services for an employer from whom they are on paid or unpaid leave of absence, nor accept any other commission, appointment, or award paid or unpaid.

Fellows must undertake to leave North America at the conclusion of the Fellowship for a period of two years thereafter. This is a binding condition of appointment. Australian Fellows are expected to return to Australia at the conclusion of their Fellowship. (In approved cases, a Fellow who, at commencement of tenure, indicates an intention to study for an American Ph.D. may be permitted to remain in the United States for a limited additional period, provided that at the time of requesting this permission he is assured of other adequate financial support.)

After completion of tenure, a Fellow is required to report on his work and experiences in the United States.

A Fellowship will be terminated by the Commonwealth Fund if, in the opinion of its officers, a Fellow is not observing the obligations of his award.

### **EMOLUMENTS** (In U.S. Dollars)

Fellowship emoluments are intended to cover expenses of travel, residence and study. They are planned to enable a Fellow to participate fully in the life of the community. It is therefore expected that all payments (except those made to a Fellow's family in his home country) shall be expended within the United States.

Fellow's allowance: \$300 per month until the 26th birthday; \$350 per month after the 26th birthday.

Family allowance, if a Fellow has no continuing salary: \$150 per month for a Fellow's wife; \$75 per month each for first and second child. If a Fellow's family remains in the home country, a family allowance of up to \$200 per month will be considered.

The above allowances will be based on a Fellow's age and family status as of 1 September 1973, and will remain unchanged throughout tenure.

To and from the U.S.: for a Fellow, his wife and children (up to four half-fares), travel from home to United States place of study, and return.

In the U.S.: a travel allowance of \$250 per month for periods of approved travel (three months required); a car rental allowance of \$1,200; and an annual contingency allowance of \$250.

Tuition and approved research fees and expenses.

A book and equipment allowance of \$300 for the first year and \$200 for the second year.

Health insurance.

### Payment of Salary-Commonwealth Public Servants

An officer of the Service, who is awarded a Fellowship, will normally be paid full salary during his tenure of the Fellowship.

The officer will be required to enter into an agreement with the Commonwealth to remain in the Service for the period of the Fellowship and for a period of up to four years six months from the date of completing the Fellowship.

#### APPLICATION

Application forms are available only from the Australian Representative of the Fund. Completed applications with referees' reports, typed in duplicate on the prescribed forms, must be submitted in the first instances to the Chief Officer concerned who will forward applications together with departmental comments to the Secretary, Public Service Board, Canberra, not later than 24 July 1972.

#### THE COMMONWEALTH FUND OF NEW YORK

The Commonwealth Fund was incorporated in 1918 as a philanthropic foundation in the State of New York. Its endowment derives entirely from the estates of the founder, Mrs Stephen V. Harkness, and of Mr and Mrs Edward S. Harkness.

Mrs Harkness's choice of the name, 'Commonwealth', reflected her wish that the funds should be used for the common welfare of mankind, an obligation which the Directors have attempted to fulfil by gifts from capital and income of about \$175m, primarily in the fields of health care and medical education.

The Harkness Fellowships, first known as Commonwealth Fund Fellowships, were established in 1925 by Mr Harkness for British university graduates. In 1927, the programme was extended to Australia and New Zealand, in 1952 to certain Continental European countries and, in subsequent years, the terms of eligibility were also widened to include candidates other than graduates. At the present time, 37 awards are annually available to candidates from nine countries. In maintaining this programme, the Directors of the Fund have reaffirmed their belief in the Board's inaugural resolution that 'international understanding can be forwarded in no more practicable way than through the provision of international opportunities for education and travel to young men and women of character and ability. Such men and women, potentially leaders in their own country, becoming familiar through residence and education with the institutions, customs and ways of thinking of the people of another country, cannot but be a force for mutual understanding and good feeling.'
