NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROPOSE CUSTOMS TARIFF ALTERATION

NOTICE No. 5 (1972)

IN pursuance of section 273EA, of the Customs Act 1901-1971, I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, hereby give notice that it is intended, within seven sitting days of the House of Representatives after the date of the publication of this Notice in the Gazette, to propose in the Parliament a Customs Tariff alteration in accordance with the particulars specified in the Schedule to this Notice and operating on and from the thirty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two.

Customs Tariff 1966-1972

SEPARATE ARTICLES DIRECTION No. 3 (1972)

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of Section 25 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1972, direct that the duty in respect of goods, being goods that consist of or are capable of being separated into separate articles, included in a class of goods specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Direction shall be such duty as would be payable if:

- (a) each of the separate articles comprising the goods being articles specified in the second column of that Schedule and opposite those goods or that class of goods; and
- (b) the remainder of the goods, if any, had been imported separately.

2. In this Direction " First Schedule " means Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972.

3. This Direction may be cited as Separate Articles Direction No. 3 (1972) and, subject to the next succeeding paragraph, shall have effect on and from 28 July 1972.

4. This Direction does not apply to goods that are on firm order overseas or in bond in Australia on 28 July 1972 and are entered for home consumption on or before 30 June 1973.

NOW, therefore, I, Donald Leslie Chipp, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of sub-section (1) of section seven and sub-section (1) of section sixteen of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965, and all other enabling powers specify, except as provided in the next succeeding paragraph, High Speed Steel Twist Drills which have been or are imported into Australia on or after the eighteenth day of August 1972 to be the class or kind of goods as to which I am so satisfied.

This Notice shall not apply to good which—

- (a) were in direct transit to Australia on the twenty-eighth day of July 1972, and which are entered for home consumption within 21 days after importation; or
- (b) were in bond in Australia on the twenty-eighth day of July 1972, and which are entered for home consumption on or before the eighteenth day of August 1972.
