SEPARATE ARTICLES DIRECTION No. 3 (1972)

- I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of Section 25 of the Customs Tariff 1966–1972, direct that the duty in respect of goods, being goods that consist of or are capable of being separated into separate articles, included in a class of goods specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Direction shall be such duty as would be payable if:
 - (a) each of the separate articles comprising the goods being articles specified in the second column of that Schedule and opposite those goods or that class of goods; and
- (b) the remainder of the goods, if any, had been imported separately.
 - 2. In this Direction "First Schedule" means Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972.
- 3. This Direction may be cited as Separate Articles Direction No. 3 (1972) and, subject to the next succeeding paragraph, shall have effect on and from 28 July 1972.
- 4. This Direction does not apply to goods that are on firm order overseas or in bond in Australia on 28 July 1972 and are entered for home consumption on or before 30 June 1973.
