DUMPING AND SUBSIDIES ACT NOTICE No. 12 (1972)

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by sub-section (1) of Section 17 of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965 and all other enabling powers hereby specify:

synthetic nitrogenous substances including ammonia or goods containing synthetic nitrogenous substances including ammonia, being goods for use as fertilizers or for use as supplements for stock food, where the difference between the export price and normal value of the goods is greater than the amount of subsidy which would be payable under the Nitrogenous Fertilizers Subsidy Act 1966-1969 on such goods produced in Australia, other than goods—

- (i) in direct transit to Australia on the sixteenth day of August 1972, and which are entered for home consumption within 21 days after importation; or
- (ii) in bond in Australia on the sixteenth day of August 1972, and which are entered for home consumption within 21 days;

which are entered for home consumption on and after the sixteenth day of August 1972, to be goods to which Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 107 published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No. 94 of 27 October 1970 does not apply.

This Notice may be cited as Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 12 (1972).

SECTION 7

Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 13 (1972)

WHEREAS it is provided in sub-section (1) of section seven of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965 that

the Minister for Customs and Excise may, after inquiry and report by the Tariff Board, cause a notice to be published in the Gazette specifying the goods as to which he is satisfied that—

- (a) the export price of any of these goods that have been exported to Australia is less than the normal value of the goods so exported; and
- (b) the exportation of those goods is causing or threatening injury to an Australian industry producing or manufacturing like or directly competitive goods or may hinder the establishment of an Australian industry in connexion with the production or manufacture of like or directly competitive goods; and

WHEREAS inquiry and report by the Tariff Board in respect to the goods specified in this Notice has been made

NOW, therefore, I, Donald Leslie Chipp, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of sub-section (1) of Section seven and sub-section (1) of Section sixteen of the Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1965, and all other enabling powers, specify, subject to the next succeeding paragraph:—

synthetic nitrogenous substances including ammonia or goods containing synthetic nitrogenous substances including ammonia, being goods for use as fertilizers or for use as supplements for stock food

which are entered for home consumption on or after the sixteenth day of August 1972 to be the class or kind of goods as to which I am so satisfied.

This Notice does not apply to goods—

- (i) in direct transit to Australia on the sixteenth day of August 1972, and which are entered for home consumption within 21 days after importation; or
- (ii) in bond in Australia on the sixteenth day of August 1972, and which are entered for home consumption on or before the sixth day of September 1972.

This Notice may be cited as Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 13 (1972).
