SECTION 23

SUBSTITUTES AND IMITATIONS NOTICE No. 6 (1972)

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 23 of the Customs Tariff 1966-1972 and all other enabling powers—

- (a) declare that I am of the opinion that goods of a kind specified in the first column of the table hereunder—
- (i) are a substitute for goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods;
 - (ii) are intended to be or can be used as a substitute for goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods;
 - (iii) can be used for any purpose for which goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods can be used; or
 - (iv) are an imitation of goods of another kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods; and
- (b) direct that the duty in respect of each kind of goods specified in the first column of the table hereunder is the duty that would be applicable in respect of them, if they were goods of the kind specified in the second column of that table opposite those goods.

2. In this notice "First Schedule" means the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972.

3. Unless the context otherwise requires in this notice in ascertaining whether goods fall within the terms of a reference or whether a reference applies to goods, regard shall be had to:

- (a) the Rules for the Interpretation of the First Schedule set out in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972; and
- (b) the notes to a Division of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972 or to a Chapter of such a Division that has application to the goods under their tariff classification in Part II. of that First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972.

4. This Notice may be cited as Substitutes and Imitations Notice No. 6 (1972) and shall take effect on and from the eighteenth day of August 1972.

5. Substitutes and Imitations Notice No. 5 (1971) published in Gazette No. 116 dated 10 December 1971 and Substitutes and Imitations Notice No. 4 (1972) published in Gazette No. 54 dated 30 June 1972 are hereby revoked.

Customs Tariff 1966–1972

SEPARATE ARTICLES DIRECTION No. 4 (1972)

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of Section 25 of the Customs Tariff 1966–1972, direct that the duty in respect of goods, being goods that consist of or are capable of being separated into separate articles, included in a class of goods specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Direction shall be such duty as would be payable if:

- (a) each of the separate articles comprising the goods being articles specified in the second column of that Schedule and opposite those goods or that class of goods; and
 - (b) the remainder of the goods, if any,
- had been imported separately.

2. Separate Articles Direction No. 2 (1972), published in Gazette No. 54 dated 30 June 1972 is hereby revoked.

3. In this Direction "First Schedule" means Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966–1972.

4. This Direction may be cited as Separate Articles Direction No. 4 (1972) and shall take effect on and from the eighteenth day of August 1972.

CUSTOMS TARIFF 1966–1972
SECOND SCHEDULE
By-laws Nos S2306 and S2307

I, DONALD LESLIE CHIPP, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the Customs Act 1901–1971, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item;
- (b) a sub-item;
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966–1972 as amended or proposed to be amended.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II. of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1972 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

Second Schedule

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2306.

2. The Second Table of Customs By-law No. S2010, published in Gazette No. 60 dated 20 July 1970, as amended, is further amended, as follows:

(a) Omit:

'Item 84.45 Benders, hand, portable, for tubes, rods and bars, but not including such benders with provision for attachment to floor or bench

84.45 Circular sawing machines to which sub-paragraph 84.45.211 applies, as follows:

(a) Machines, not being friction sawing machines, the FOB price of which exceeds \$500 each

(b) Friction sawing machines, the FOB price of which exceeds \$1,000 each

84.45 Nut tapping machines, automatic

84.45 Pointing appliances, hand operated, for pointing wire prior to threading it through wire drawing dies

84.45 Ring enlarging tools, jewellers'

84.45 Routers, high speed, combined with frequency changers to give speeds of 18,000 or more revolutions per minute, incorporating electric motors and cutter spindles on common shafts, including such machines incorporating a drill head at the opposite end of the radial arm'.

(b) Omit:

'Item 84.48 Equipment, comprising essentially pneumatic actuators regulated from a pre-set sequence control panel, for the automatic control of capstan lathes

84.48 Feeding attachments, automatic, for use with spindle moulding machines

84.48 Heads, die, self-opening, but not including chasers

THE SCHEDULE—continued

84.48 Heads, facing and boring, universal, having one or more self acting slide feeds, adjustable stop and automatic end release and having an operating accuracy plus or minus 0.0002 inch (plus or minus 0.005 millimetre) as used in metal-working machines for boring, facing, recessing, under-cutting and taper and form turning operations

84.48 Heads, profiling, inserted template type, for the repetition production of both internal and external profiles, being an attachment for metal-working machines

84.48 Heads, tap, collapsible, including taps but not including chasers

84.48 Healds, flat steel or wire type, of a kind used in connection with wire weaving looms

84.48 Jigs, but not including drill jigs or drill jig bushes

84.48 Parts of a kind used solely or principally with goods to which item 84.45, 84.46 or 84.47 applies and which, if imported, would be dutiable under item 19 in the Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1966-1970

84.48 Trimmers, laminated plastic board'.

By-law No. S2307

Item No. 20
Second Schedule

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2307.

2. The Second Table of Customs By-law No. S2011, published in Gazette No. 60 dated 20 July 1970, as amended, is further amended, as follows:

Omit:

'Item 84.45 Engraving machines, for the rapid reproduction of printing plates, in which an original is photo-electrically scanned to produce a control current which, after amplification, is applied to a stylus which reproduces the original by engraving, dot by dot or line by line, on a suitable blank, a half-tone or line engraved printing plate

84.45 Looms, weaving, round mesh, fully automatic, incorporating a special attachment for Jacquard netting, for the production of round mesh wire netting of a width up to and including 2 metres, of a kind used in wire mattresses

84.45 Re-toothed machines, manually or power operated, for hand saws

84.45 Setters, saw, automatic'.
