COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

ORDERED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I, SIR PAUL MEERNAA CAEDWALLA HASLUCK, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby order that the following administrative arrangements come into operation on the first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two:—

1. The matters dealt with by a Department of State of the Commonwealth specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order include the matters specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to the name of that Department in the first column of that Schedule and other matters arising under the Acts administered by the Minister of State for the Commonwealth administering that Department.

2. The Acts of the Parliament of the Commonwealth administered by the Minister of State administering a Department of State of the Commonwealth specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are the Acts specified in the third column of that Schedule opposite to the name of that Department in the first column of that Schedule and any Act (whether passed before or after the date of this Order), not being an Act specified in the third column of the Schedule to the Administrative Arrangements Order made on the sixth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two, or in the third column of the Schedule to this Order opposite to the name of any Department, that relates to a matter dealt with by that Department.

3. The administrative arrangements set out in the Administrative Arrangements Order made on the sixth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two, continue in force, by virtue of this Order, except in relation to the Department of Foreign Affairs and the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.
