GENERAL

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Australian Government Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at 40c each plus postage or on subscription of \$26.00 (full year), \$15.60 (six months), or \$7.80 (three months).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); *Customs*; *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Forces appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private advertisements*; *Tenders invited*; *Contracts arranged*; *Late notices*. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 25c each plus postage or on subscription of \$17.50 (full year), \$10.40 (six months), or \$5.20 (three months). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names) in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 10c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance and, unless otherwise requested, commence from the first issue of the month following the placement of an order. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

EXEMPTION FROM APPLICATION OF SECTION 18

WHEREAS by sub-section (8) of section 18 of the *Prices Justification Act 1973* the Tribunal has by resolution authorized me to exempt A. J. BUSH & SONS PTY LIMITED AND RELATED COMPANIES listed hereunder from the provisions of section 18 of the Act, NOW I, LINDSAY HALE WILLIAMS, Chairman of the Prices Justification Tribunal, HEREBY, AND UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE, EXEMPT the said A. J. BUSH & SONS PTY LIMITED AND RELATED COMPANIES from the application of section 18 of the *Prices Justification Act 1973*, in respect of:

1. the prices of meat (either fresh or frozen) supplied by the Companies by wholesale sale

Provided that:

- (a) reports are forwarded to the Tribunal at two monthly intervals, the first such report to be for the period ended 31 August 1974, setting out the estimated average purchase price per kilogram of each of the following classes of livestock purchased during the period

cattle
calves
sheep
lamb
pigs

and the estimated average selling price per kilogram for each of the following classes of meat sold during the period

beef
veal
mutton
lamb
pigmeat, and

- (b) there is no increase in the existing processing margins for such livestock, being the difference between the estimated average purchase price per kilogram for each class of livestock and the corresponding estimated average selling price per kilogram for each class of meat referred to in (a) above, calculated as at the date hereof and submitted to the Tribunal;

2. the prices of meat (either fresh or frozen), meat products and shop waste supplied by the Companies by sale through retail outlets

Provided that:

- (a) reports are forwarded to the Tribunal at three monthly intervals, the first such report to be for the period ended 30 September 1974, setting out sales revenue (including shop waste returns) and the estimated gross profit, being the difference between cost of goods and sales revenue expressed as a percentage, for the period, and
- (b) annual gross profit rates established for such retail outlets as at the date of the last audited financial statements are reported to the Tribunal and there is no increase in such rates of gross profit without notification to the Tribunal in accordance with the Act;

3. The prices of smallgoods, cooked meat, ham and bacon and meat products, supplied by A. J. BUSH & SONS (ROCKDALE) PTY LIMITED, other than the following representative lines:

Packaged sliced middle rashers of bacon
Canned hams
Devon
Frankfurts
Cooked corned beef
Sausages
Cooked pressed ham

Provided that:

- (a) the above lines continue to be representative of the Company's product pricing structure;
- (b) current price lists for all products and all future amendments thereto are forwarded to the Tribunal;
- (c) reports are forwarded to the Tribunal at three monthly intervals setting out the sales revenue and estimated gross profit from sales of smallgoods, cooked meat, ham and bacon and meat products, and
- (d) the Tribunal is notified, within 21 days of the date on which the product become available for purchase on the retail market, of the proposed price of any type of smallgoods or meat product not previously supplied by the Company; such notifications to be supported by details of manufacturing and selling costs of the product;
4. increases in the price of goods, other than meat or meat products, supplied by the Companies in the same condition as received from unrelated suppliers provided that such increases are due entirely to and reflect not more than the money amount of the increase in the cost to the Companies of such goods;
5. the prices of hides, calf skins, sheep and lamb skins, fat, bones and other products which are by-products of the slaughtering and processing of

meat animals (except tallow and meat meal) where the price of such goods is the result of a sale by public auction, public tender or competitive quotation to an end user, provided that all such transactions are evidenced in writing;

6. the prices of goods and services supplied to related companies provided that such prices are not greater than those charged to unrelated companies for the same goods and services;
7. the prices charged for food, beverages and miscellaneous items sold to employees of the Companies through cafeterias or canteens operated by the Companies provided that such prices are not in excess of normal retail prices;
8. the prices of goods sold to employees of the Companies provided that such prices are not in excess of normal retail prices, and
9. the prices of surplus and/or obsolete assets, plant machinery, equipment, vehicles, office furniture and other sundry items disposed of by the Companies

Provided further that:

- (a) confirmation of the data supplied under 1 (a), 2 (a) and 3 (c) above is forwarded to the Tribunal at six monthly intervals certifying that the data was arrived at by using the procedures normally followed by the Companies, and
- (b) audited financial statements of each of the Companies, including detailed manufacturing, trading and profit and loss statements are forwarded to the Tribunal annually.
