I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 103 of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* of the Northern Territory of Australia, reserve the land described in the Schedule hereto for marine and passenger landing purposes.

THE SCHEDULE

Reserve No. 1491

All that area being partly within the Hundred of Bray County of Palmerston and partly within Port Darwin Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 5.03 hectares more or less: commencing at a point being 90 degrees 21.03 metres from the north eastern corner of section 19 Hundred of Bray thence by lines bearing 90 degrees 220.35 metres; 180 degrees 259.26 metres; 270 degrees 248.41 metres; 34 degrees 20 minutes 158.87 metres; 352 degrees 28.42 metres; 330 degrees 2 minutes 50 seconds 115.33 metres to the point of commencement.

PURSUANT to section 49 of the *Surveyors Ordinance 1967-1970*, the Surveyors Board of the Australian Capital Territory did, on the thirteenth day of August 1974, determine that the fees and charges set out in the Second Schedule hereto shall be the scale of fees and charges payable to registered surveyors in the Australian Capital Territory and that the general remarks and definitions set out in the First Schedule hereto shall apply in respect to the application of the said fees and charges. The scale of fees and charges in the Second Schedule hereto shall apply on and from the date of publication of this Determination in the *Australian Government Gazette*.

FIRST SCHEDULE

1. The fees and charges shown in the Second Schedule to this Determination are payable in respect of surveys, the purposes of which are contained in section 34 of the *Surveyors Ordinance 1967-1970*.

2. Registered surveyors may supply an estimate of probable fees and charges but, on the completion of work, fees and charges payable shall be in accordance with the relevant clauses of this Determination.

3. In the interpretation of the scale of fees and charges shown in the Second Schedule to this Determination, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have the meaning set against each, respectively:

'City survey' means a survey for the definition of boundaries of city land.

'Reference mark' means a concrete block, a galvanized iron pipe, or drill hole and wing or like mark on a structure or tree.

'Rural survey' means a survey for the definition of boundaries of rural land.

SECOND SCHEDULE**Part 1—Miscellaneous****1. Daily and Hourly Rates**

(a) Charges for professional services at daily rates shall only be made in the following circumstances, viz:

- (1) Where specified in this scale; or
- (2) Where no other part of this scale is applicable; or
- (3) By arrangement with clients, provided that fees so charged shall not be less than those prescribed under the appropriate part of this scale;
- (4) Where unusual difficulties arise, for which the fees prescribed are not commensurate with the work involved.

(b) Daily rates for a survey party shall be \$176.50-218 per day clear of all directly incidental expenses and shall be dependent upon the nature of the work and experience of the Surveyor.

- (3) First class fare, for travel by rail or air, by a Surveyor and economy class fare, if available, for assistants.
- (4) Time spent, in excess of one hour in travelling to and from the survey shall be charged for at one-sixth of the daily rate per hour.

(b) Accommodation Charges

- (1) Where a Surveyor and/or assistants are obliged to live away from home, a minimum accommodation allowance of \$15.50 per person per day shall be charged.
- (2) In cases where the client provides board and/or lodging for the party, the charges shall be by arrangement.

(c) Plan Preparation and Supply of Copies

- (1) Charges for plan preparation shall be made at the rate of \$9.25 per hour.
- (2) Where copies of plans, additional to the numbers prescribed in this scale are supplied, the charge, in respect of the additional copies, shall be cost plus 20 per cent.

3. Partial Services

(a) A survey shall be deemed to be complete and the fees due and payable when the Surveyor has furnished, or is in a position to furnish, his client or his client's agent with such survey documents as are necessary for the particular transaction, notwithstanding, that additional survey work may be necessary to satisfy requisitions by examining or registering Authorities. This shall not be interpreted as relieving a Surveyor of his obligation to attend to requisitions.

(b) When additional survey work is required to verify information, other than compiled information supplied by a Surveyor, the cost of such extra work shall be borne by the Surveyor.

(c) If for any reason, an instruction for survey work is cancelled, terminated or suspended, the Surveyor shall be entitled to fees for such portions of the work completed at the date of termination, in accordance with the relevant parts of this Scale.

4. Interviews

(a) Where necessary interviews, relevant to the survey, are conducted by a Surveyor on behalf of a client, or at his request, the charge shall be as follows:

- (1) Duration up to thirty minutes—\$10.00.
