CUSTOMS

Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations

EXCEPTION NOTICE No. M20

I, LIONEL KEITH MURPHY, the Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me under regulation 17 of the Customs (Import Licensing) Regulations, do hereby—

- (a) revoke all subsisting exceptions made in pursuance of that regulation; and
- (b) except from the application of those regulations the goods specified in the Schedule to this notice.

For the purposes of this notice:

'Customs Tariff' means the *Customs Tariff 1966-1973* as amended from time to time or that Act as proposed to be amended from time to time by a Customs Tariff alteration proposed in the Parliament.

'Schedule 1' means Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff.

THE SCHEDULE

Item No.

Schedule Description of Goods

1. Goods not otherwise excepted from those regulations when imported in the one consignment of which the total value for duty does not exceed \$20.
2. Goods which in the opinion of the Collector are not related to any commercial transaction.
3. Goods the produce or manufacture of and shipped direct from a Territory of Australia.
4. Goods permitted importation temporarily in conformity with the provisions of an inter-governmental agreement to which Australia is a signatory.

5. Goods other than—

- (i) used, secondhand or disposals machinery or equipment of the following class or kind:
 - (a) Earthmoving, or excavating vehicles, machinery or equipment (e.g. rock buggies, dumpers, graders, loaders, ditchers, draglines, mechanical shovels, excavators, scrapers, bull-dozers) and parts thereof.
 - (b) Tractors, road rollers and parts thereof.
 - (c) Materials handling equipment (e.g. cranes, forklift trucks) and parts thereof.
 - (d) Other vehicles being used or secondhand four-wheel drive vehicles, excluding public service type passenger vehicles, falling within items 87.02, 87.03 and 87.04 of the *Customs Tariff 1966-1973*.
- (ii) Men's and boys' knitted shirts, the produce or manufacture of the Republic of Korea or of the province of Taiwan falling within sub-item 60.04.1 in Schedule 1.
- (iii) Knitted coats, jumpers, cardigans, sweaters, blouses, shirts and the like, knitted dresses, tracksuits, playsuits and rompersuits, the produce or manufacture of the Republic of Korea or of the province of Taiwan falling within sub-item 60.05.1 in Schedule 1.

This notice shall have effect from the eighteenth day of September 1974.

NOTICE No. 43 (1974)

WHEREAS it is provided in sub-section (1) of Section 7 of the *Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1961-1973* that the Minister for Customs and Excise may, after inquiry and report by the Tariff Board, cause a notice to be published in the *Gazette* specifying the goods as to which he is satisfied that—

- (a) the export price of any of those goods that have been exported to Australia is less than the normal value of the goods so exported; and
- (b) the exportation of those goods is causing or threatening injury to an Australian industry producing or manufacturing like or directly competitive goods or may hinder the establishment of an Australian industry in connexion with the production or manufacture of like or directly competitive goods; and

WHEREAS inquiry by the Tariff Board and report by the Industries Assistance Commission in respect to the goods specified in this Notice have been made.

NOW, therefore, I, Lionel Keith Murphy, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of sub-section (1) of Section 7 and sub-section (1) of

Section 16 of the *Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act* 1961-1973, and all other enabling powers specify:

Glass fibre rovings which were exported to Australia on or after 2 November 1972 and entered for home consumption on or before 31 December 1973, to be the class or kind of goods as to which I am so satisfied.

This Notice may be cited as *Dumping and Subsidies Act Notice No. 43 (1974)*.

SCHEDULE 2

By-law No. S2430

I, LIONEL KEITH MURPHY, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI. of the *Customs Act* 1901-1974, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto—

- (i) 'security' means that security shall be given to and to the satisfaction of the Collector and that the giving of such security is a condition subject to which that by-law item applies to the goods or the class or kind of goods so conditioned; and
- (ii) a reference to:
 - (a) an item;
 - (b) a sub-item;
 - (c) a paragraph; or
 - (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff* 1966-1973 as altered or proposed to be altered.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff* 1966-1973 as altered or proposed to be altered that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff* 1966-1973 as altered or proposed to be altered that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

THE SCHEDULE

By-law No. S2430

Item No. 36
Schedule 2

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. S2430.

2. Subject to paragraphs 3 and 4, Item 36 in Schedule 2 to the *Customs Tariff* 1966-1973, as proposed to be altered, applies to handicrafts, being goods that are—

- (1) the produce or manufacture of a developing country;
- (2) of a kind to which, if they had been entered for home consumption on 30 June 1974, Item 46 in Part 1 of the Second Schedule to the *Customs Tariff* 1966-1973, as proposed to be altered, would have applied; and
- (3) entered for home consumption on or before 31 December 1974.

3. This by-law does not apply to goods to which paragraph 2 would, but for this paragraph, apply that—

- (1) are goods to which a tariff classification specified in column 1 of the Table hereto applies; and
- (2) are goods included in a class of goods specified in Column 2 of that Table opposite that classification

4. Paragraph 3 shall not have effect in respect to goods that are—

- (1) in transit to Australia on 1 October 1974 and are entered for home consumption within 21 days after importation; or
- (2) in transit to Australia on 1 October 1974 and are entered for home consumption within 28 days after that date.

5. Customs By-law No. 32426 published in *Gazette* No. 53 E dated 1 July 1974 is hereby revoked.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS

DETERMINATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 85 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT
FOR the purposes of section 85 of the *National Health Act 1953-1973* and the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations made under that Act, I, Douglas Nixon Everingham, the Minister of State for Health, hereby make the following determination:

1. This determination shall come into operation on the first day of August 1974.

2. The determinations of 1 April, 1 May, 1 June and 1 July 1974, made under section 85 of the National Health Act are revoked.

3. In the Schedules to this determination:

'amp.' means ampoule;

'fl oz' means fluid ounce of 480 minims;

'g' means gram;

'gr' means grain;

'hypo. tab' means hypodermic tablet;

'I.M.' means intramuscular;

'I.V.' means intravenous;

'kg' means kilogram;

'lb' means pound of 16 ounces;

'M.' means million of organisms;

'mg' means milligram;

'ml' means millilitre;

'oz' means ounce of 437.5 grains;

'S.C.' means subcutaneous;

'Sch. 2' means the Second Schedule to this determination.

4. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medical preparation referred to in sub-section (2) of section 85 of the *National Health Act 1953-1973* the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medical preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit.

5. The purposes set out in the column headed 'Purposes' in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination are the only purposes for which a medical practitioner may prescribe the maximum quantities and number of repeats specified in that part in relation to those pharmaceutical benefits specified in that same part.

6. The manner, if any, in which a pharmaceutical benefit specified in the First Schedule to this determination is to be administered in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit is set out in that Schedule in the column headed 'Manner of Administration'.

7. The maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may, in one prescription, be directed to be supplied on any one occasion is:

(a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified—

(i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column headed 'Pur-

poses'—the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the columns headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Maximum Quantity' column of the First Schedule the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(b) in any other case—the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.

8. The maximum number of occasions, if any, on which the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit may, in one prescription, be directed to be repeated is:

(a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified—

(i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column 'Purposes'—the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Number of Repeats' column of the First Schedule, the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(b) in any other case—the number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.

9. The name of the manufacturer, or the names of manufacturers denoted, in accordance with the following table, by letters appearing in the column headed 'Brand' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation, the name of which is specified in that Schedule, is the brand or brands, under which the drug or medicinal preparation may be supplied under Part VII of the *National Health Act 1953-1973* as a pharmaceutical benefit:

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in a by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff* 1966-1973 as altered or proposed to be altered that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.
