GENERAL

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Australian Government Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at 40c each plus postage or on subscription of \$26.00 (full year), \$15.60 (six months), or \$7.80 (three months).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); *Customs*; *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private advertisements*; *Tenders invited*; *Contracts arranged*; *Lute notices*. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 25c each plus postage or on subscription of \$17.50 (full year), \$10.40 (six months), or \$5.20 (three months). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names) in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 10c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

WHEREAS it is provided by section three of the *Commons and Public Reserves Ordinance* 1936 of Norfolk Island that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, declare any Crown land to be a common or public reserve, and any such common or public reserve shall be under the care and control of the Administrator:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the land described in the Schedule hereto be reserved for the purposes of a public reserve.

NOW THEREFORE, I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto be reserved for the purposes of a public reserve.

THE SCHEDULE

Description of the land referred to

All that piece of land situated in Norfolk Island being portion 152d1 containing an area of 4,047 m² more or less commencing at a point on a north-western side of Mission Road being the eastern corner of Portion 152e and bounded thence by the north-eastern boundary of that Portion bearing 306 degrees 55 minutes 57 seconds 100.91 metres thence by part of a south-eastern boundary of Portion 152d3 bearing 71 degrees 44 minutes 30 seconds 54.29 metres thence by the south-western boundary of Portion 152d2 bearing 126 degrees 55 minutes 57 seconds 80.74 metres to the aforementioned north-western side of Mission Road thence by that side of that Road bearing 230 degrees 35 minutes 27 seconds 45.87 metres to the point of commencement.

ORDER No. 2 (1975)

I, LIONEL KEITH MURPHY, Minister of State for Customs and Excise, in pursuance of Section 11 of the *Customs Tariff 1966-1974*, as proposed to be altered, and all other enabling powers, declare that:

- (a) subject to the succeeding paragraphs, Taiwan, Israel or the Colony of Hong Kong shall be treated as a developing country for the purposes of the *Customs Tariff 1966-1974*, as proposed to be altered

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS

DETERMINATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 85 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT

FOR the purposes of section 85 of the *National Health Act 1953-1974* and the *National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations* made under that Act, I, Moses Henry Cass, Minister of State for Environment and Conservation, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Health, hereby make the following determination:

1. This determination shall come into operation on the first day of December 1974.

2. The determinations of 1 August, 1 September, 1 October and 1 November 1974, made under section 85 of the *National Health Act* are revoked.

3. In the Schedules to this determination:

'amp.' means ampoule;

'fl oz' means fluid ounce of 480 minims;

'g' means gram;

'gr' means grain;

'hypo. tab' means hypodermic tablet;

'I.M.' means intramuscular;

'I.V.' means intravenous;

'kg' means kilogram;

'lb' means pound of 16 ounces;

'M.' means million of organisms;

'mg' means milligram;

'ml' means millilitre;

'oz' means ounce of 437.5 grains;

'S.C.' means subcutaneous;

'Sch. 2' means the Second Schedule to this determination.

4. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medical preparation referred to in sub-section (2) of section 85 of the *National Health Act 1953-1974* the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medical preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit.

5. The purposes set out in the column headed 'Purposes' in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination are the only purposes for which a medical practitioner may prescribe the maximum quantities and number of repeats specified in that part in relation to those pharmaceutical benefits specified in that same part.

6. The manner, if any, in which a pharmaceutical benefit specified in the First Schedule to this determination is to be administered in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit is set out in that Schedule in the column headed 'Manner of Administration'.

7. The maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may, in one prescription, be directed to be supplied on any one occasion is:

(a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified—

(i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column headed 'Purposes'—the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the columns headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Maximum Quantity' column of the First Schedule the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(b) in any other case—the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.

8. The maximum number of occasions, if any, on which the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit may, in one prescription, be directed to be repeated is:

(a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified—

(i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column 'Purposes'—the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Number of Repeats' column of the First Schedule, the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or

(b) in any other case—the number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS

DETERMINATION UNDER SECTION 93 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT

I, MOSES HENRY CASS, Acting Minister of State for Health pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 93 of the *National Health Act 1953-1974*, HEREBY REVOKE all previous Determinations made pursuant to Section 93 of the *National Health Act* and HEREBY DETERMINE that:

- (1) This Determination shall come into operation on the first day of December 1974.
- (2) The Pharmaceutical Benefits referred to in this Determination shall be those contained in the Schedule attached to this Determination.
- (3) A medical practitioner is authorised for the purposes of Section 93 of the Act, to supply any of the pharmaceutical benefits obtained by him, or by another medical practitioner for whom he is temporarily acting as a locum, in pursuance to this Determination.
- (4) Subject to this Determination, the maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may be obtained by a medical practitioner in any one month for the purpose of Section 93 of the Act is the number or quantity specified in the Schedule to this Determination in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit.
- (5) Where a medical practitioner has obtained a pharmaceutical benefit for the purpose of Section 93 of the Act, he is not entitled to obtain a further quantity or number of units of that pharmaceutical benefit for that purpose while he has in his possession a quantity or number of units of the pharmaceutical benefits obtained by him equal to or greater than the maximum quantity or number of units allowed for the pharmaceutical benefit by the last preceding clause.
- (6) A medical practitioner is not entitled to obtain a pharmaceutical benefit for the purposes of Section 93 of the Act more often than twice in any two months.

Rural Division of Biologicals
Pharmaceuticals Division of Biologicals
Plastics
Nobel, and
Organic Chemical

as of the month of July 1973 and as of February 1974 and thereafter at six monthly intervals

Provided further that:

- (a) the Companies notify the Tribunal pursuant to section 18 of the Act of any increases in prices which the Companies forecast would, either collectively or individually have the effect of increasing by 2½ per cent or more for a six monthly period the selling price index for the products manufactured by any of the above Divisions, and
- (b) audited financial statements of ICI Australia Limited and including detailed manufacturing trading and profit and loss statements are forwarded to the Tribunal annually.

The Table of Precedence notified in *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* No. 25, dated 30 April 1953, and amended by notifications in *Commonwealth of Australia Gazettes* No. 36 dated 26 June 1958 and No. 90 dated 9 November 1961, is hereby cancelled.

TABLE OF PRECEDENCE FOR AUSTRALIA

January 1975

1. The Governor-General.
 2. (a) The Governor of the State.
(b) Governors of the other States according to the date of appointment.
- Note: A Lieutenant-Governor of a State who is not also Chief Justice shall, when not administering the Government of the State, have within the State precedence immediately after the Chief Justice of the State.
3. The Prime Minister.
 4. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives according to the date of appointment; if they are appointed at the same time, the President shall have precedence.
 5. The Chief Justice.
 6. (a) Ambassadors and High Commissioners according to the date of presentation of their Letters of Credence or Commission, or, in the case of High Commissioners who do not present Letters of Commission, according to the date of arrival in Canberra.
(b) Charges d'Affaires *en pied* or *en titre* according to the date of presentation of their Letters of Credence.
(c) Charges d'Affaires and Acting High Commissioners according to the date of assumption of duties.
 7. Members of the Executive Council under summons.
 8. The Leader of the Opposition.
 9. (a) Former Governors-General according to the date of leaving office.
(b) Former Prime Ministers according to the date of leaving office.
(c) Former Chief Justices according to the date of leaving office.
 10. The Premier of the State and, after him, the Premiers of the other States according to the population of their States.
 11. The Lord Mayor within his City.
 12. Justices of the High Court according to seniority.
 13. The Chief Justice of the State and, after him, the other Chief Justices according to seniority.
 14. The Chief of the Defence Force Staff.
 15. Chief Justices and Chief Judges of Australian Courts and Presidents of the Inter-State Com-

mission and the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission according to the date of first appointment to one of those offices.

16. Members of the Australian Parliament.
17. Other Judges of Australian Courts, including the Deputy Presidents of the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission, according to the date of first appointment to one of those offices.
18. The Administrator of the Northern Territory.
19. Lord Mayors of capital cities according to population.
20. Heads of religious communities according to the date of assuming office in Australia.
21. Presiding officer or officers of the State legislature and after him or them the presiding officers of the other State legislatures according to the date of appointment.
22. Members of the State Executive Council under summons to the Council and, after them, the members of the other State Executive Councils according to the population of their States.
23. Judges of State and Territory Supreme Courts according to seniority.
24. Members of the Executive Council not under summons.
25. Members of the State legislature and, after them, members of the other State legislatures according to the population of their States.
26. Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Capital Territory.
27. Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Northern Territory.
28. The Permanent Heads of Departments of the Australian Public Service and their peers and the Chiefs of the Australian Naval, General and Air Staffs, according to the date of first appointment to an office within this group.
29. Consuls-General, consuls and vice-consuls according to the date on which recognition was granted.

Note: A person acting on behalf of any of the foregoing shall enjoy the precedence of the person for whom he is acting with the understanding that, where there is more than one person in the class, the person acting on behalf of another will take precedence after other persons in that class who are attending in their own right.

A married couple shall enjoy the precedence of the spouse with the higher precedence and a husband or wife shall enjoy the precedence of the spouse.
