General issues contain notices under the following headings: Special information (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); Proclamations: Legislation (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); Customs; Government departments (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.; Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.; Bankruptcy Act; Private advertisements; Tenders invited; Contracts arranged; Late notices. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 25c each plus postage or on subscription of \$17.50 (full year), \$10.40 (six months), or \$5.20 (three months). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day os issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names)in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 10c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance and, unless otherwise requested, commence from the first issue of the month following the placement of an order. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

SCHEDULE 1

By-law No. F1379

I, JAMES LUKE CAVANAGH, Minister of State for Police and Customs, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Part XVI of the Customs Act 1901-1975, and all other enabling powers, hereby make the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto.

In the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto a reference to:

- (a) an item;
- (b) a sub-item;
- (c) a paragraph; or
- (d) a sub-paragraph

shall be read as a reference to that item, sub-item, paragraph or sub-paragraph as the case may be in Part II of Schedule 1 to the *Customs Tariff* 1966-1974 as amended or proposed to be amended.

Unless the context otherwise requires, where a description of goods is specified in the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto, the goods that fall within that by-law by virtue of that description are such goods as would fall within that description if it were specified in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff 1966-1974 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods.

Unless the context otherwise requires, any word or phrase used in a reference in the by-law set out in the Schedule hereto has the same meaning as if it were used in the tariff classification in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Customs Tariff 1966-1974 as amended or proposed to be amended that applies to those goods to which that reference in the by-law applies.

THE SCHEDULE By-law No. F1379

Sub-item 92.11.2

1. This by-law may be cited as Customs By-law No. F1379.

- 2. For the purposes of sub-item 92.11.2 'dictating machines' means machines that are:
 - (a) designed solely for use as dictating machines;
 - (b) transcribing machines designed solely for use with dictating machines; or
 - (c) designed principally for use as dictating machines and possess, unless the Comptroller-General otherwise determines, the following characteristics:
 - (i) the machine contains a control which can be operated at the microphone;
 - (ii) the machine is supplied with earphones for playback;
 - (iii) the machine is supplied with a foot con-
 - trol for use by the typist in playback;
 (iv) the machine contains provision for identi-
 - fication of any word on the tape, wire or other recording medium; and
 - (v) the machine contains a speed control which allows operating within a close range of standard settings.
- 3. Customs By-law No. F1367 published in Gazette No. 81 A dated 3 October 1974 is hereby revoked.

forge hammermen. forgemen. locksmiths. drop-hammer stampers, forging strikers. machine workers, forge, iron, and brass furnacemen, ship's plumbers, fitters, turners, grinders, whetstone grinders and glaziers, seagoing engineers, shift engineers, roll turners, patternmakers, model makers, millwrights, mechanical draughtsmen, technical assistants, planers, borers, slotters, machine drillers, milling machine workers, shapers, machinists, brass founders, brass finishers, brass smiths and operators of machines in connection with same, coppersmiths, armature winders, equipment examiners, and electrical engineers generally, radio workers, mechanical and scientific instrument makers and optical glassmakers, linotype mechanics, press mechanics, machine joiners employed in the construction of cotton, silk, flax, woollen or other machines, die sinkers, press tool makers and stampers, electroplaters, polishers, electroplate makers up, sheet metal spinners, assemblers, skilled acetylene and electrical welders, aero mechanics, duralium workers including forgers, fitters, and all other aircraft workers who are employed on the fuselage or engine work, and all workers engaged in the engineering, shipbuilding and kindred trades.

- (b) (i) Persons other than boilermakers' helpers and laborers engaged in marking off, making templates, making jigs (except precision work associated therewith), plating, bolting (temporary or otherwise). hand and/or machine riveting, caulking, chipping, flanging, furnaceing, levelling, angle or boiler-smithing, welding staying, tapping, reaming, drilling (other than on stationary drilling machines), tube staying, tubing, operating machines for punching and shearing, rolling, bending, angle or plate straightening, hydraulic presses (except helpers and laborers to boilermakers), nipping and notching machines, operators of all gas welding and cutting plants, Anglo-Swedish or electric arc welding processes in connection with the making and/or repairing and/or demolition of iron, steel, aluminium, copper, or other metal or alloys, boilers, vats, digesters, receivers, retorts, ships, vessels other than ships, tanks, waggons, trucks, rolling-stock, bridges, girders, principals (roof or otherwise) pontoons, gasometers, pipes, mining plates, and structural iron and steel work used in connection with buildings and assemblers. Provided that assistants or laborers, general or special employed in connection with the work of a boilermaker or other mechanic shall not be eligible for membership in the Union; provided further that such making and/or repairing and/or demolition of classes of work as enumerated herein, of aluminium, copper and other metal or alloys shall not extend beyond established trade practice where work is being performed by members of other organisations registered in or in connection with the Engineering and/or metal working industries.
 - (ii) Agricultural smiths, coach smiths, engine smiths, farrier smiths, floorman farriers, general smiths, implement smiths, ship smiths, tool smiths, heat treaters, heat treater operatives, angle-iron smiths, motor smiths, rolling stock smiths, wheel-wright

smiths, oliver smiths, forgers, forgers on hot pressers, setters and spring smiths, chain makers, tool sharpeners, finn cutting machinists, profile cutters, bolt, nut and/or rivet machinists and men in charge of bull dozers, swadging, upsetting and other machines used for Blacksmiths work, oxy acetylene welders, electric welders, carbonarc welders, cutters and all other welders, ornamental gate, fence and balustrade smiths.

- (iii) The provisions of subclauses (i) and (ii) of this clause (b) shall apply to all industries associated with the processes of boilermaking and blacksmithing except as to the industry of agricultural implement making in Victoria and South Australia other than those employees who were members of the Boilermakers & Blacksmiths Society at the date of its amalgamation in 1965.
- (iv) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclauses (i) (ii) and (iii) of this clause (b) all persons employed in the industries or occupations within the callings covered by the constitution of the Australian Workers' Union as registered on the 1st day of September, 1965 shall not be eligible for membership within the scope of this clause (b).
- (c) (i) Producing, making, completing by any process such as oxidising or electroplating, or vitreous enamelling, or repairing, or assisting to produce, make or repair any articles, goods or chattels in or in connection with the tinplate, tinsmithing, sheet metal working, gas meter making, motor car building or repairing so far as panel beating or sheet metal work is concerned, sheet metal trunk and box making, or canister making industries; and shall include spinners, draw moulders, ceiling fixers, welders, metal polishers and revolving shutter machinists engaged in or on or about sheet metal work.
 - (ii) Producing plastic articles in the industries set forth in sub-clause (i) hereof in a factory or in a section of a factory where the major portion of the work performed in such factory or section is work usually performed in a sheet metal and/or canister making factory and where such articles are used as substitutes for products covered by this constitution.
 - (iii) In finishing as completed, repaired markable articles, goods or chattels including painting, japanning, tinning, galvanising, sheradising, lacquering, oxidising or electroplating, or vitreous enamelling any articles, goods or chattels, in any wise relating to, or in connection with, the industries set forth in sub-clause (i).
 - (iv) All employees in any establishments connected with manufacture, assembling, dismantling, erecting, replacing, or repairing of agricultural implements, machinery, utensils, flax making machinery, waggon building and irrigation plant; the trades connected with white and black sheet metal working blacksmiths, general blacksmiths farriers; the manufactories of iron, copper, tin or galvanised iron utensils, stoves ranges, grates, registers, copper casings, or other heating apparatus,

- domestic appliances made of metal fireproof or other iron doors, bed-steads, wire-mattresses, or other iron work used in connection with beds, coppersmith wares or parts thereof; porcelain enamelling of steel and iron plates and hollow-ware, baths, sinks, cisterns, household utensils and builders' material or in the manufacture of frit.

- (c) (i) Producing, making, completing by any process such as oxidising or electroplating, or vitreous enamelling, or repairing, or assisting to produce, make or repair any articles, goods or chattels, in or in connection with the tinplate, tinsmithing, sheet metal working, gas meter making, motor car building or repairing so far as panel beating or sheet metal work is concerned, sheet metal trunk and box making, or canister making industries; and shall include spinners, draw moulders, ceiling fixers, welders, metal polishers and revolving shutter machinists engaged in or about sheet metal work.
 - (ii) Producing plastic articles in the industries set forth in sub-clause (i) hereof in a factory or in a section of a factory where the major portion of the work performed in such factory or section is work usually performed in a sheet metal and/or canister making factory and where such articles are used as substitutes for products covered by this constitution.
 - (iii) In finishing as completed, repaired markable articles, goods or chattels, including painting, japanning, tinning, galvanising, sheradising, lacquering, oxidising or electroplating, or vitreous enamelling any articles, goods or chattels, in any wise relating to, or in connection with, the industries set forth in sub-clause (i).
 - (iv) All employees in any establishments connected with manufacture, assembling, dismantling, erecting, replacing, or repairing of agricultural implements, machinery, utensils, flax making machinery, waggon building and irrigation plant; the trades connected with white and bloak sheet metal working, blacksmiths, general blacksmiths, farriers; the manufactories of iron, copper, tin or galvanised iron utensils, stoves, ranges, grates, registers, copper casings or other hearing apparatus,

domestic appliances made of metal, fireproof or other iron doors, bedsteads, wiremattresses, or other iron work used in connection with beds, coppersmith wares or parts thereof; porcelain enamelling of steel and iron plates and hollow-ware, baths, sinks, cisterns, household utensils and builders' material or in the manufacture of frit.

(d) An unlimited number of employees engaged or usually engaged in the process, trade or business connected with or incidental to the manufacture, construction or repair of iron, steel, wooden or concrete ships, boats, vessels, punts, pontoons, floating stages, targets, preventers and torpedo netting booms and such like constructions, balsa rafts, lifesaving rafts, dock gates, caissons and cofferdam gates, air-craft, sea-planes (where work on such air-craft or sea-planes is done in an establishment the principal business of which is work of the other classes hereinbefore mentioned) or any other floating structure being persons employed or usually employed as shipwrights, naval architects, ship's draughtsmen, boatbuilders, or air-craft constructors in such

WHEREAS there is a need to mark the great constitutional change that will result in the independence of Papua New Guinea:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that certain selected distinguished persons should be honoured in recognition of that important event:

NOW THEREFORE We do, by this Warrant, institute and create a new Medal for Papua New Guinea to be styled the Papua New Guinea Independence Medal:

AND WE DO ordain that the award of the Medal shall be governed by the rules set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Rules for the Papua New Guinea Independence Medal

Description

1. The Medal shall be circular in shape, of cupronickel and shall bear on the obverse side Our Royal Effigy Crowned and on the reverse side the Papua New Guinea National emblem with the inscriptions 'Papua New Guinea' in the upper circumference and 'Independence 1975' in the lower circumference.

Eligibility

2. (1) Distinguished residents and former residents of Papua New Guinea, including persons serving on

the day of independence of Papua New Guinea in the Papua New Guinea legislature, Defence Force, Public Service, Corrective Institutions Service or Fire Service or in the Royal Papua New Guinea Constabulary, who have given outstanding and meritorious public service to Papua and New Guinea are eligible for the award of the Medal.

(2) Other distinguished persons are eligible for the award of the Medal if it is desirable that they be honoured on the occasion of the independence of Papua New Guinea.

Awards

3. The award of the Medal shall be made by instrument signed by the Governor-General.

Registration

- 4. (1) There shall be a Registrar who shall be appointed by the Governor-General.
- (2) The Registrar shall keep a register in Port Moresby of the names of all those to whom the Medal is awarded.

The Ribbon

5. The Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a ribbon consisting of a red central part bordered on each side by narrow stripes of black, white and gold, in that order, from each edge.

Order of Wearing

6. The Medal shall be worn after all Efficiency and Long Service Decorations and Medals and in front of the Service Medal of the Order of St John.

Cancellation

- 7. (1) The Governor-General may cancel the award to a person of the Medal, and may restore the Medal an award of which was so cancelled.
- (2) Where an award of the Medal is cancelled, the name of the person to whom it was awarded shall be erased from the register maintained under rule 4, and that person shall return the Medal to the Registrar appointed under that rule.
- (3) Where an award that has been cancelled is restored, the Registrar shall restore the entry in the register maintained by him.
