GENERAL

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Australian Government Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at 40c each plus postage or on subscription of \$26.00 (full year), \$15.60 (six months), or \$7.80 (three months).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: Special information (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); Proclamations; Legislation (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); Customs; Government departments (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.; Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.; Bankruptcy Act; Private advertisements; Tenders invited; Contracts arranged; Late notices. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 25c each plus postage or on subscription of \$17.50 (full year), \$10.40 (six months), or \$5.20 (three months). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celerants; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 10c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS

DETERMINATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 85 OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH ACT

FOR the purposes of section 85 of the *National Health Act* 1953-1975 and the National Health (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations made under that Act, I, Donald Leslie Chipp, the Minister of State for Health, hereby make the following determination:

'ml' means millilitre;
'oz' means ounce of 437.5 grains;

'S.C.' means subcutaneous;

- 'Sch. 2' means the Second Schedule to this determination.
- 4. Where the strength, type of unit, size of unit or other particulars of form are specified in the column headed 'Form' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation referred to in sub-section (2) of section 85 of the National Health Act 1953-1975 the name of which is specified in that Schedule, those particulars refer to the form or forms of the drug or medicinal preparation that is or are allowable for the purposes of Part VII of that Act to the effect that the drug or medicinal preparation in that form or in each of those forms is a pharmaceutical benefit.
- 5. The purposes set out in the column headed 'Purposes' in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination are the only purposes for which a medical practitioner may prescribe the maximum quantities and number of repeats specified in that part in relation to those pharmaceutical benefits specified in that same part.
- 6. The manner, if any, in which a pharmaceutical benefit specified in the First Schedule to this determination is to be administered in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit is set out in that Schedule in the column headed 'Manner of Administration'.
- 7. The maximum quantity or number of units of a pharmaceutical benefit that may, in one prescription, be directed to be supplied on any one occasion is:
 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified-
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, if any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or

- (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column headed 'Purposes'—the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the columns headed 'Maximum Quantity' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
- (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Maximum Quantity' column of the First Schedule the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit; or
- (b) in any other case—the quantity or number. if any, specified in the column headed 'Maximum Quantity' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.
- 8. The maximum number of occasions, if any, on which the supply of a pharmaceutical benefit may, in one prescription, be directed to be repeated is:
 - (a) where the name of the pharmaceutical benefit is specified-
 - (i) in Part 1 of the First Schedule to this determination—the quantity or number, it any, specified in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit: or
 - (ii) in Part 2 of the First Schedule to this determination and the pharmaceutical benefit is prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the column 'Purposes'the quantity or number, if any, in that part of the Schedule in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit; or
 - (iii) if reference is made to the Second Schedule in the 'Number of Repeats' column of the First Schedule, the quantity or number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in the Second Schedule to this determination in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit:
 - (b) in any other case—the number, if any, specified in the column headed 'Number of Repeats' in that Second Schedule in relation to the form of the pharmaceutical benefit.
- 9. The name of the manufacturer, or the names of manufacturers denoted, in accordance with the following table, by letters appearing in the column headed 'Brand' in the First Schedule to this determination in relation to a drug or medicinal preparation, the name of which is specified in that Schedule, is the brand or brands, under which the drug or medicinal preparation may be supplied under Part VII of the National Health Act 1953-1975 as a pharmaceutical benefit:

COMMONWEALTH TEACHING SERVICE

Commonwealth Teaching Service Act 1972-1973

DETERMINATION No. 35

I, CORNELIUS JOHN LENIHAN, Commissioner, Commonwealth Teaching Service, in pursuance of Sections 20 and 23 of the Commonwealth Teaching Service Act 1972-1973, determine that the following provisions regarding holidays and recreation leave entitlement are applicable to members of the Commonwealth Teaching Service performing teaching duties in Australia and to teachers on secondment to the Commonwealth Teaching Service who are performing teaching duties in Australia.

In this Determination the following definitions are applicable:

- (i) 'member' means a person to whom this Determination applies.
- (ii) 'Authority' means an organisation to whom members have been made available.
- (iii) 'month' means any calendar month (or any of the twelve months of the year).

For the purposes of Clause 2 only, the following definitions are applicable:

'school' means the place at which the member ordinarily performs his duties or, in the case of a member who does not ordinarily perform his duties at any one place, the place at which he is ordinarily required to report for duty.

'school year' means the period from the first day a school is open in a particular calendar year to the last day it is open in the same year.

HOLIDAYS

1.1 The same days shall be observed as public holidays by members in any place, as are observed as public holidays for schools in that place.

2. RECREATION LEAVE

- 2.1 Subject to the provisions of this Section, on the day succeeding the last day on which a member's school is open, in any calendar year there accrues to the member who commenced employment or was employed on or before the opening of the members' school in that year on a continuous basis, a recreation leave credit equivalent to his ordinary hours of duty during a period of four weeks.
- 2.2 A member working on a continuous basis who commenced duty after the opening of the member's school in that calendar year shall accrue on the day succeeding the last day on which the member's school is open in that year a pro-rata recreation leave credit. The amount of such leave shall be calculated on the basis of the proportion that the number of completed calendar months between the member's commencement and the end of the calendar year bears to twelve months, provided that the member has commenced not less than one month prior to the date of accrual. For the purposes of this computation, service for part of a month shall be counted as service for the whole month.
- 2.3 An Authority may direct a member to take, at such time as is convenient to the working of the Authority, recreation leave due to him, whether or not application for leave has been made by the member.
- 2.4 Unless otherwise directed by an Authority pursuant to the last succeeding clause, all members shall be deemed to be on recreation leave from the day succeeding the last day on which a member's school is open in a calendar year. The period of recreation leave shall be to the limit of available credits, or to the day preceding the first day on which a member's school is open in a calendar year.
- 2.5 Periods of leave of absence without pay shall not normally count as service for the purpose of accrual of recreation leave credits. Where leave of absence without pay is granted, the Commissioner shall determine whether the period during which the member is absent on that leave is to form part of a period of service for any purpose and if so the purposes for which it is to form part of service.
- 2.6 On resignation or retirement, a member, (or in the case of the member's death, dependants) will be entitled to pro-rata payment and payment in lieu of recreation leave, calculated in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs 2.1, 2.2 and 2.3 above, provided that the accrual of the leave under paragraph 2.2 shall be computed as at the time of the termination of service and shall be calculated on the basis of the proportion that the number of completed calendar months between the members commencement and the date of termination bears to twelve months. If the member's service did not commence in the year of separation, the proportion that the number of completed calendar months between the commencement of the year and the date of separation bears to twelve months, shall be the proportion used in calculating pro rata payment.
- 2.7 Recreation leave credits accrued in one year shall not be carried over beyond 31 December in the next succeeding year without the direction of the Commissioner. Only in the case where illness has prevented a member from availing of recreation leave shall a credit accruing in one year be carried over beyond 31 December in the second succeeding year, at the direction of the Commissioner.

3. SCHOOL VACATIONS—STAND DOWN

3.1 During school vacations or at other times when schools are closed for other reasons the Authority may grant teachers at those schools leave of absence with pay subject to the approval of the Commissioner.

4. RECREATION LEAVE—TEACHERS STATIONED IN ISOLATED DISTRICTS

- 4.1 Where a member serves in a prescribed isolated district he will be entitled to recreation leave as follows:
 - (a) the period of his ordinary hours of duty during a period of four weeks; and
 - (b) an additional period in a year as set out in the schedule to this Determination.
- 4.2 Additional leave for the purpose of sub-paragraph 4.1 (b) above, in respect of each month of service in an isolated district, is one twelfth of the ordinary hours of duty for the period specified in the heading to the column in the schedule in which the name of the isolated district is specified.

- 4.3 The additional recreation leave entitlement under paragraph 4.1 shall be calculated on a calendar monthly basis according to the number of months the member has been stationed in that district during the year, since recreation leave last accrued. For the purposes of this computation, service for part of a month in an isolated district is to be counted as service in that district for the whole of that month and the period of recreation leave granted will also be deemed to be service in that isolated district for the purposes of this clause.
- 4.4 Where a member transfers from one isolated district to another he may be regarded as having spent the whole of the month in which the transfer occurs in the isolated district which has the greater entitlement.

5. ANNUAL LEAVE (BONUS) PAYMENT

- 5.1 A member shall be entitled in respect of recreation leave which accrued on or after 1 January 1974 and before 1 January 1976 for an annual leave (bonus) payment of an amount equal to the Australian Government Statistician's average weekly earnings per employed male unit (original—Australia) for the September quarter of the year preceding the year in which the date of accrual occurs.
- 5.2 For the purposes of computation of the amount payable as an annual leave bonus, an accrual of recreation leave made under clause 2.1 and 2.2 above on a day before the end of the calendar year shall be deemed to have been made on the next succeeding First day of January. (The purpose here is to provide the appropriate leave bonus to the year to which the leave accrual relates).
- 5.3 Payment of an entitlement under paragraph 5.1 above shall be made no later than 31 December of the year in which the recreation leave accrues.
- 5.4 Where a member accrues less than a full year's recreation leave credits, the maximum amount payable is reduced to an amount equivalent to the maximum recreation leave bonus entitlement multiplied by the proportion of the number of months of service for which the leave is credited bears to twelve months.
- 5.5 A member whose services terminate for any reason and who is entitled to payment in lieu of recreation leave or in lieu of recreation leave on a pro-rata basis shall be paid in accordance with paragraph 5.4 above, in respect of leave calculated on a pro-rata basis for the number of completed months of continuous service since the commencement of employment or the previous first day of January (whichever is appropriate) and the date on which his service terminates provided that the maximum payment shall be in proportion that such number of completed months bears to twelve months.

Prices Regulation Ordinance 1949-1974

PRICES ORDER No. 20 OF 1975

I, ANTHONY STUART BLUNN, Controller of Prices, in pursuance of Section 20 of the *Prices Regulation Ordinance* 1949-1974, hereby order as follows:

- 1. This Order takes effect on 4 December 1975.
- 2. Prices Order No. 15 of 1975 dated twenty-second day of September 1975 and notified in the Australian Government Gazette on 24 September 1975 is revoked.
 - 3. In this Order-

'bread' means a product obtained by baking a yeast leavened dough prepared with flour and water with or without ingredients:

water with or without ingredients;
'foil-wrapped' means in relation to the sale of
any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior
to delivery to the place at which the bread is
sold by retail, in aluminium or other foils, and
that such bread was so enclosed when sold;

'milk bread' means bread which is made into loaves and which contains not less than four parts per centum by weight of non-fat milk solids calculated on the water-free substance; 'ordinary bread' means bread made into loaves other than starch-reduced bread, protein-increased

other than starch-reduced bread, protein-increased bread or milk bread as defined in this order of fancy bread;

'starch-reduced bread' or 'protein-increased bread' means bread which is made into loaves and which contains not less than two and seventenths parts per centum by weight of nitrogen calculated on the water-free substance;

'toast-sliced' means in relation to the sale of any bread, foil-wrapped or wrapped bread which has marked on the wrapper enclosing the bread the words 'toast', 'toast-sliced', 'thick-sliced' or words of like effect;

'wrapped' means in relation to the sale of any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior to delivery to the place at which the bread is sold by retail, in waxed or grease-proof paper, cellulose film, polythene or other similar wrapping and that such bread was so enclosed when sold;

'unwrapped' in relation to the sale of any bread means that such bread is not wrapped as defined in this Order.

4. The maximum price at which bread included in a category specified and described in the First Column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Australian Capital Territory is fixed at and declared to be a price specified in the Second Column of that Schedule opposite and in relation to the description of the bread included in that category.
