Australian Government Gazette is published sectionally in accordance with the arrangements set out below:

Public Service issues contain notices concerning administrative matters, including examinations, vacancies, transfers and promotions within the Australian Public Service. These issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Thursday, and are sold at 40c each plus postage or on subscription of \$26.00 (full year), \$15.60 (six months), or \$7.80 (three months).

General issues contain notices under the following headings: *Special information* (i.e. notices in connection with the Office of the Governor-General; the Federal Executive Council; the Parliament; the Judiciary; the Executive Government; and honours, decorations and awards); *Proclamations*; *Legislation* (Acts of Parliament assented to; Statutory Rules; Ordinances; Regulations); *Customs*; *Government departments* (i.e. notices not placed in other categories, alphabetically listed under departments administering particular legislation or functions); *Defence Force appointments, promotions, etc.*; *Teaching Service vacancies, promotions, etc.*; *Bankruptcy Act*; *Private advertisements*; *Tenders invited*; *Contracts arranged*; *Late notices*. Copies of each week's Special issues are also attached. General issues are published weekly at 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday and are sold at 25c each plus postage or on subscription of \$17.50 (full year), \$10.40 (six months), or \$5.20 (three months). Annual subscription includes quarterly index issues.

Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrities; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 10c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance and, unless otherwise requested, commence from the first issue of the month following the placement of an order. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 111 of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* of the Northern Territory of Australia, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Town of Adelaide River which was constituted by Proclamation dated the thirteenth day of April 1975 and published in *Australian Government Gazette* No. G 18 of 13 May 1975 to those boundaries defined in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE

All that piece of land in the Hundreds of Playford and Waterhouse County of Palmerston Northern Territory of Australia containing an area of 626.8 hectares more or less: Commencing at the southern corner of Section 104 Hundred of Playford; thence northeasterly by part of a southeastern boundary of the said section to a western corner of Section 3; thence generally northeasterly, northerly, generally southeasterly and easterly by southeastern, eastern and southwestern boundaries and by part of a southern boundary of the said section to the northern prolongation of the most easterly eastern boundary of Section 18; thence southerly, generally south-westerly and again southerly by the said prolongation and by eastern, southeastern and eastern boundaries of the said section to the northeastern corner of Section 114; thence southwesterly by southeastern boundaries of Section 114 to the southeastern corner of the said section; thence easterly by the eastern prolongation of the southern boundary of Section 114 to a northwestern corner of Pastoral Lease 561 (Mount Bunday); thence southerly by a western boundary of the said Pastoral Lease and its southerly prolongation to a southern boundary of the North Australia Railway Reserve as notified in *South Australian Government Gazette* No. 52 of 20 December 1894; thence westerly, southerly, again westerly, northerly, again westerly and northwesterly by southern, eastern, southern, western, southern and south-western boundaries of the said Railway Reserve to a northern corner of Pastoral Lease 561 (Mount Bunday); thence southwesterly by a northwestern boundary of the said Pastoral Lease to a northeastern corner of Section 112; thence westerly and generally northwesterly by northern and northeastern boundaries of the said section to the western boundary of the Hundred of Playford; thence northerly by the said boundary to the southeastern corner of Section 113 Hundred of Waterhouse; thence southwesterly, northerly, easterly and southeasterly by southeastern, western, northern and northeastern boundaries of the

said section to the most eastern northeastern corner of the said section; thence northerly by the boundary of the Hundred of Playford to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by Proclamation under the provisions of the *Water Conservation Act 1886* (an Act of the State of South Australia in force in the Northern Territory) published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on 12 September 1914 certain portion of Crown Lands in the Northern Territory described and named Frances Well Reserve in the Schedule hereto, has been dedicated for the purposes of a Water Conservation Reserve:

AND WHEREAS the said land is no longer required for the purposes of a Water Conservation Reserve;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the said land be used for the benefit of the Aboriginal inhabitants of the Northern Territory;

NOW THEREFORE I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 142 of the *Water Conservation Act 1886* (as amended) of the State of South Australia, hereby revoke the reservation of Crown Lands made by the said Proclamation.

I, SIR JOHN ROBERT KERR, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of my powers under section 103 of the *Crown Lands Ordinance* of the Northern Territory of Australia, do hereby revoke the reservation of land for the purpose of recreation and amusement of the public made by Proclamation made on the twenty-third day of December 1955 and published

at page 400 of *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* No. 7 of 9 February 1956 insofar as it applies to the land described in the Schedule hereto.

THE Minister of State for Business and Consumer Affairs, the Honourable J. W. Howard, in pursuance of Section 273B of the *Customs Act 1901-1975*, notifies that determinations have been made under Part XVI of that Act in favour of specific importers in respect of the goods indicated in the table appended hereto and limited to the quantities set out in the respective determinations.

FISHERIES NOTICE No. 64

PROHIBITION RELATING TO THE TAKING OF SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA FROM WATERS OFF THE EASTERN AND SOUTHERN COASTS OF AUSTRALIA

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 8 of the *Fisheries Act 1952-1975*, I, Ian McCahon Sinclair, the Minister of State for Primary Industry:

- (a) prohibit the taking, from the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1 or 2, of fish included in the class of fish specified in Schedule 3, by means of pole and live bait fishing;
- (b) exempt from the prohibition contained in paragraph (a), the taking of fish with the use of a boat in respect of which there is a licence under section 9 of the *Fisheries Act 1952-1975* that, by virtue of an endorsement under sub-section 9 (4) of that Act, extends to authorizing the fishing prohibited by paragraph (c);
- (c) prohibit fishing in the area of proclaimed waters specified in Schedule 1 or 2 in respect of fish included in the class of fish specified in Schedule 3, other than—
- (i) traditional fishing; or
- (ii) fishing that consists of taking, processing or carrying fish of that class with the use of a boat in respect of which there is a licence under section 9 of the *Fisheries Act 1952-1975* that, by virtue of an endorsement under sub-section 9 (4) of that Act, extends to authorizing that taking, processing or carrying, as the case may be; and
- (d) exempt from the prohibition contained in paragraph (c), fishing with the use of a boat, other than a boat equipped for pole and live bait fishing.

All that area of proclaimed waters contained within the area bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the parallel 28 degrees 38 minutes 24 seconds south latitude with the eastern shore of Australia at high-water mark; thence proceeding east along that parallel to its intersection with the meridian 159 degrees 37 minutes 10 seconds east longitude; thence proceeding south-east along a straight line drawn to the point 29 degrees south latitude, 160 degrees 5 minutes east longitude; thence proceeding south along the meridian 160 degrees 5 minutes east longitude to its intersection with the parallel 32 degrees 25 minutes south latitude; thence proceeding south-west in a straight line to the point 34 degrees south latitude, 155 degrees 50 minutes east longitude; thence proceeding south along a straight line drawn to the point 40 degrees 26 minutes south latitude, 153 degrees 53 minutes 20 seconds east longitude; thence proceeding west along the parallel 40 degrees 26 minutes south latitude to its intersection with the eastern shore of Cape Barren Island at high-water mark; thence following the eastern shore of

Cape Barren Island at high-water mark to its intersection with the meridian 148 degrees 19 minutes 30 seconds east longitude; thence proceeding north along a straight line drawn to the intersection of the parallel 40 degrees 12 minutes 30 seconds with the eastern shore of Flinders Island at high-water mark; thence following the eastern shore of Flinders Island at high-water mark to its intersection with the parallel 39 degrees 43 minutes south latitude; thence proceeding north-east along a straight line drawn to the intersection of the meridian 146 degrees 22 minutes 30 seconds east longitude with the southern shore of Australia at high-water mark; thence following the eastern shore of Australia at high-water mark to the point of commencement.

Area of Proclaimed Waters

PETITION

1. The abovenamed petitioner was a person who was
qualified to vote within the meaning of Section
185(c) of the said Act at the said election.

2. It has been the practice of Registrars in the State
of South Australia (during the period of five years at
least preceding the date for closing the Rolls prior to

the said election) contrary to the provisions of *inter alia* Section 47 (1) (h) of the said Act, either at the direction of or in concurrence with the various Divisional Returning Officers in South Australia, and/or the Commonwealth Electoral Officer in that State and/or the Chief Electoral Officer for the Commonwealth to remove the names of electors from the various Sub-Divisional Rolls in the following circumstances:

- (a) Where an elector's name was notified to a Divisional Returning Officer as a woman over the age of eighteen years or upwards whose marriage had been registered in the State during the month preceding such notification.
- (b) Following each election for either the Parliament of South Australia or for any of the Houses of the Commonwealth Parliament they were electors who had failed to vote at the preceding elections and had not responded to a letter or letters from the Electoral Office seeking an explanation as to why such elector or electors had failed to vote.
- (c) Whenever the Electoral Office discovers that an elector has changed his or her address notwithstanding that they may either—
 - (i) continue to reside in the same Sub-Division as prior to such change of address, or
 - (ii) continue to reside in the same Division for the purpose of Sections 39 (3) and 39a of the said Act.

3. That as a consequence of the practice referred to in paragraph 2 hereof:

- (a) Not less than 30 000 names of women electors have been removed from the various Sub-Divisional Electoral Rolls in the said State during the five year period there referred to.
- (b) Not less than 60 000 other names of electors have been removed contrary to the provision of Section 47 (1) (h) of the said Act as afore-said.

4. That there is no evidence that the electors referred to in paragraph 3 hereof ceased to be qualified to continue to remain on their various Sub-Divisional Electoral Rolls pursuant to Section 41 (1) of the said Act or otherwise become disqualified within the meaning of Section 39 (1) of the said Act. Similarly there is no evidence that such electors have been dealt with pursuant to Regulation 27 and 28 of the Regulation made pursuant to the said Act.

5. That there is no evidence that the electors referred to in paragraph 3 hereof were at any time since their removal from their Sub-Divisional Electoral Rolls re-enrolled on other Sub-Divisional Electoral Rolls or the same Sub-Divisional Electoral Rolls from which they had been removed.

6. That there is no evidence that the electors referred to in paragraph 3 hereof voted at the said elections.

7. That the prohibition from voting or the otherwise absence of persons from voting in the said election due to their non-enrolment in the order set out in paragraph 3 hereof would:

- (a) Significantly alter the quotas needed for the election of each Senator.
- (b) Significantly affect the majority needed by the last Senator to be elected who failed to achieve a quota, and
- (c) Would be likely to significantly affect the voting strength of unsuccessful candidates whose preferences were distributed to other candidates.

QUARANTINE PROCLAMATION NO. 87A

Commonwealth of
Australia
JOHN R. KERR
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the

the Commonwealth
of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 13 (1) of the *Quarantine Act* 1908-1973, amongst other things, that the Governor-General may, by proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia of any animals or plants, or any parts of animals or plants:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section 13 (2) of that Act that the power of prohibition under section 13 of that Act shall extend to authorize prohibition generally or with limitations as to place and subject-matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

AND WHEREAS by Quarantine Proclamation No. 81A published in the *Gazette* on 10 February 1969 the importation into Australia of cattle was prohibited subject to specified conditions and restrictions:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke that Proclamation and make other provision in its stead:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir John Robert Kerr, the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) revoke Quarantine Proclamation No. 81A;
- (b) prohibit the importation into Australia of cattle from a country other than New Zealand unless the Minister or an officer authorized by the Minister—
 - (i) is satisfied that the cattle are being imported for scientific purposes, for immediate slaughter or in other special circumstances; and
 - (ii) has, by instrument in writing, consented to the importation of the cattle,and that instrument is produced to a quarantine officer or a Collector within the meaning of the *Customs Act* 1901-1975;

(c) prohibit the importation into Australia of cattle from New Zealand unless—

(i) the Director of Quarantine or an officer authorized by him has, by instrument in writing, consented to the importation of the cattle and that instrument is produced to a quarantine officer or a Collector within the meaning of the *Customs Act* 1901-1975; and

(ii) such certificates, declarations, notices, permits and other documents as may be required by the Quarantine (Animals) Regulations to be furnished in respect of the cattle are furnished in accordance with those Regulations;

and

(d) prohibit the importation into Australia of cattle from New Zealand on a vessel used in navigation by sea unless—

(i) the vessel is a vessel that trades exclusively between Australia and New Zealand; or

(ii) no animals, other than animals of Australian or New Zealand origin, have been carried on the vessel during the voyage in the course of which the cattle are carried to Australia and the Director of Quarantine or an officer authorized by him has, by instrument in writing, consented to the cattle being carried to Australia on that vessel and that instrument is produced to a quarantine officer or a Collector within the meaning of the *Customs Act* 1901-1975.

3. increases in the prices of goods supplied by the Company in the same condition as received from manufacturers or suppliers where such increases are due entirely to and reflect not more than the money amount of increases in the prices charged to the Company for such goods

Provided that where the manufacturers or suppliers of such goods are subject to section 18 of the Act, such increases in prices have been approved by the Tribunal pursuant to the Prices Justification Act or are in accordance with exemptions granted to such manufacturers or suppliers pursuant to the said Act, and

4. increases in the prices of goods manufactured and supplied by the Company where such increases are due entirely to and reflect not more than the money amount of increases in the prices charged to the Company for copper, lead aluminium used in the manufacture of such goods

Provided that the Tribunal is advised within 21 days of the effective date of any variations in prices made by the Company pursuant to this clause together with particulars setting out the bases of calculation used in arriving at the said variations

Provided further that audited financial statements of the Company, together with detailed manufacturing, trading and profit and loss statements, are forwarded to the Tribunal annually.

 - (c) gross profit
 - (d) selling and distribution expenses
 - (e) administration expenses
 - (f) finance expenses
 - (g) net profit before income tax;
2. there is no increase in budget rates of profit as reported to the Tribunal without prior notification and approval of the Tribunal in accordance with the Act, and
 3. audited financial statements, including trading and profit and loss statements are forwarded to the Tribunal annually.
