Special issues are made on urgent matters as required. Single copies are available on the day of issue at various prices according to size, and they are also provided at no extra charge with weekly General issues. Special issues are not available on separate subscription.

Periodic issues contain lengthy notices of a non-urgent nature, including the following: Certificates of Australian Citizenship; Registered Tax Agents; Authorised Celebrities; Australian Capital Territory Health Registers; Unclaimed moneys; Consolidated Customs by-laws, etc.; Consolidated notices of Australian Public Service appointment, recruitment and examination conditions; Appointments to the Australian Public Service. Issues are made at irregular intervals as required, at individual prices according to size. Advice of availability is given in the contents list of the General and Public Service issues immediately following the day of publication. Periodic issues are not available on subscription, but standing orders are accepted for all or selected issues.

Index issues contain an index of a limited number of entries in certain sections of Public Service issues, and all entries in the General issues except names in the Bankruptcy Act section. Index issues are published quarterly and are sold at 10c each plus postage. They are supplied without charge to annual subscribers to the General issues, but are not otherwise available on subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable in advance and, unless otherwise requested, commence from the first issue of the month following the placement of an order. Rates include surface postage in Australia and overseas. Other carriage rates are available on application.

Surveyors Ordinance 1967-1975

SURVEY PRACTICE DIRECTIONS 1976

PURSUANT to Section 34A of the *Surveyors Ordinance* 1967-1975, the Surveyors Board of the Australian Capital Territory hereby issues the Survey Practice Directions 1976 as set out hereunder with respect to the practice to be followed by surveyors in making land surveys and preparing plans showing the results of such surveys, the purposes of which are contained in Section 34 of the *Surveyors Ordinance* 1967-1975. The Survey Practice Directions 1976 are to come into effect on 27 July 1976 and the Survey Practice Directions 1970 as gazetted on 4 June 1970 and as amended by the Survey Practice Directions 1970 Amendment No. 1 as gazetted on 21 January 1971 and the Survey Practice Directions 1972 as gazetted on 17 August 1972 and as amended by the Survey Practice Directions 1972 Amendment No. 1 as gazetted on 29 November 1973 shall cease to be in force at midnight on 26 July 1976.

Survey Practice Directions 1976

Part 1—Preliminary

1. These Directions may be cited as the Survey Practice Directions 1976.
2. These Directions are divided into parts as follows:
 - Part I—Preliminary (Directions 1-3)
 - Part II—Supervision (Directions 4-5)
 - Part III—Survey Practice (Directions 6-17)
 - Part IV—Re-determination of Boundaries (Directions 18-23)
 - Part V—Irregular Boundaries (Directions 24-25)
 - Part VI—Nature and Position of Marks (Directions 26-28)
 - Part VII—Accuracy of Surveys (Directions 29-33)
 - Part VIII—Identification Surveys and Remarking (Directions 34-35)
 - Part IX—Field Notes (Directions 36-42)
 - Part X—Plans (Directions 43-49)

3. In these Directions, unless the contrary intention appears:

'Appropriate' accuracy means such accuracy as is reasonably possible of attainment in any particular survey.

'Control mark' means a survey mark of a durable nature which forms part of a control survey placed and maintained by a government authority and shown on a plan signed by a registered surveyor and available from a government authority.

'Control survey' means a survey of either first order accuracy or a breakdown of a first order survey established for the purpose of setting out any other survey or to which any existing survey can be related and is shown on a plan signed by a registered surveyor and available from a government authority.

'Monument' means a natural or artificial object or point thereon or mark which object, point or mark is used for the purpose of locating or relocating a boundary or a point therein.

'Plan' means a representation or a drawing of land surveyed, prepared from particulars recorded in the field book of the survey and executed for delivery to or lodgment with any government authority or persons as evidence of survey.

'Reference mark' means a survey mark of a durable nature placed or situated near and connected by measurement to a corner, angle or tangent point of any survey.

'Rural Survey' means a survey, other than an urban survey, of land in the Territory for a purpose specified in Section 34 of the Ordinance.

'Surveyor-General' means the person occupying the position currently designated by the Public Service Board as Surveyor-General for Australia.

'The Ordinance' means the *Surveyors Ordinance 1967-1975*.

'Urban Survey' means a survey of land in the Territory for urban development for a purpose specified in Section 34 of the Ordinance and shall include leases for residential, commercial, industrial and special purposes of an urban character.

Part II—Supervision

4. No requirement of these Directions shall be construed as to prevent any survey being made under the supervision of a surveyor.

5. The character and extent of supervision to be exercised by a surveyor over a survey made under his supervision shall be as follows:

He shall personally attend on the ground for such time during the making of a survey and shall exercise such immediate oversight and personal direction of the work as shall ensure that the survey is carried out in accordance with these Directions.

Part III—Survey Practices

6. Where a surveyor undertakes to make a survey he shall in accordance with these Directions:

- (a) (i) make and where required, mark the same;
- (ii) locate or relocate with appropriate accuracy the boundaries of the land surveyed;
- (iii) ascertain with appropriate accuracy the positions of monuments relevant to the survey including where applicable connections to kerbs as laid;
- (b) make complete field notes of the survey; and
- (c) if so required prepare a plan of the land surveyed.

7. A surveyor shall procure all information accessible to him necessary to locate or relocate the boundaries of any land he surveys.

8. Where a surveyor makes a survey he shall ensure that the theodolite and steel or invar band or other distance measuring equipment used are in accurate adjustment, standardised and properly calibrated. Such measuring bands and distance measuring equipment shall be regularly checked against a standard established by and under the control of the Surveyor-General.

9. A surveyor shall, before adopting a line as the datum line of the azimuth of a survey, specially determine the position of the marks defining such line and the bearing used for such azimuth shall be taken from a survey, a plan or description of which is filed or recorded in a government authority or from astronomical observations.

10. If the land being surveyed is not connected by survey with a control survey a surveyor shall connect the survey with a control mark by either direct measurement or well conditioned bearings if such a control mark is within reasonable access of such land.

11. A surveyor shall measure all boundaries and lines by the most direct method that is reasonable and practicable.

12. If a survey embraces only part of the land in a document of title the surveyor shall connect such part by actual measurement to a monument or point having a known relation to a corner of the land in the document.

13. Where a survey includes land which is or is to be subject to or which has or is to have as appurtenant a right of way or other easement, the site of the right of way or other easement shall be connected by the surveyor by measurement to essential relevant monuments and where reasonably practicable to corners of the parcel in which the site is, and he shall show in the plan the essential dimensions of the site and shall note it thereon as 'site of easement' or 'site of proposed easement', as shall be appropriate, provided that the essential dimensions to be shown on the plan need not be determined by measurement of the boundaries of the right of way or easement unless the circumstances so require.

4 *Government departments*

14. Where a surveyor makes any survey other than those specified in Directions 34 and 35 he shall wherever possible firmly mark each corner thereof (including corners of each parcel of land in a subdivision) with a peg or mark of the nature prescribed in Direction 26. Provided that where it is not practicable to place such peg or mark or where existing structures would render such peg or mark of little value for fencing or building purposes such peg or mark need not be placed for any specific corner if a line peg or mark of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 is situated or placed along a boundary or its prolongation as near as practicable to that corner and its position shown on the plan.

15. Where a surveyor makes an urban survey for the purpose of any disposition of land or of any interest in land or for an acquisition or resumption of land under the authority of any Act or Ordinance or for the purpose of subdividing the surveyed land into parcels of land or blocks and the land surveyed:

- (a) abuts a road or street in which, within the limits of the frontage of the land surveyed, reference marks have not been placed, or have been disturbed, the surveyor shall:
 - (i) place a reference mark near each extremity of the boundary of the land where it abuts on the road or street, and
 - (ii) place reference marks at intervals of not more than two hundred metres throughout the length of the frontage of the land surveyed.

Provided that where the road or street frontage is less than fifty metres one reference mark only need be placed if an azimuth line of not less than fifty metres is shown from that reference mark to some other suitable reference mark or control mark or suitable fixed object, otherwise a second reference mark shall be placed not less than fifty metres from the first reference mark.

- (b) does not front a road or street the surveyor shall place two reference marks suitable for azimuth.

16. Where a surveyor makes an urban survey solely for the establishment or redefinition of a road or street and reference marks have not been placed, or have been disturbed, the surveyor shall:

- (a) place a reference mark near each extremity of the survey and on one side of the road or street, and
- (b) place reference marks at intervals of not more than two hundred metres throughout the length of the road or street surveyed, and
- (c) in addition, place reference marks at all intermediate angles or tangent points provided that any such intermediate mark may be omitted if it would be less than twenty-five metres from any other reference mark.

17. Where a surveyor makes a rural survey he shall:

- (a) mark definitely and durably all lines which form or are to form the boundaries between parcels held by different owners and between parcels held by the same owner in different rights,
- (i) with a peg or mark of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 together with lockspits cut in the direction of each unfenced boundary from each corner and angle, and

- (ii) on unfenced boundaries, with pegs or marks and lockspits of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 placed at intervals of not more than two hundred metres;
- (b) (i) where the land surveyed is not being subdivided, place two reference marks in selected positions suitable for redefinition of the survey;
- (ii) where the land surveyed is being subdivided into separate parcels of less than four hectares, place at least one reference mark in respect of each such parcel;
- (iii) where the land surveyed is being subdivided into separate parcels of four hectares or more, place at least two reference marks in respect of each such parcel;
- (iv) where a boundary other than a road frontage exceeds two thousand five hundred metres, place additional reference marks or mark additional reference trees or objects at intervals of not more than one thousand five hundred metres; and
- (v) where a boundary required to be marked in accordance with these Directions is a road frontage, place pairs of reference marks suitable for azimuth at intervals of not more than one thousand metres along such boundary and one reference mark at each extremity thereof.
- (c) where the land is being surveyed for a reserved road,
 - (i) measure and mark definitely and durably all lines which are to form the boundary of one side of the reserved road with pegs or marks and lockspits of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 placed at each angle along the surveyed boundary and at intervals of not more than two hundred metres along the surveyed boundaries in excess of two hundred metres between angles provided that where the marks are intervisible the interval should not be more than three hundred metres;
 - (ii) mark with pegs or marks of the nature prescribed in Direction 26 each angle of the unsurveyed boundary; and
 - (iii) place pairs of reference marks suitable for azimuth at intervals of not more than one thousand metres along the surveyed boundary and one reference mark at each extremity thereof.

Part IV—Re-determination of Boundaries

18. Where a surveyor makes a resurvey of land in a Crown Grant or Crown Lease or part thereof he shall adopt the boundaries as originally marked on the ground as the true boundaries, though the bearings and lengths appearing in a relevant plan or document do not agree with those between the corresponding monuments.

19. Where a corner peg and reference mark or control mark are found a surveyor shall determine the bearing and distance between them, and if a difference from the original reference is disclosed he shall decide from other evidence which of the monuments to adopt, and shall note details of such evidence and such difference on the plan.

20. Where monuments of an original survey are missing, a surveyor shall determine the boundaries and corners of the land of which he is making a survey by measurement in correct relation to boundaries of adjacent parcels of land and parcels of

land on opposite sides of roads, and to fences, and to such other evidence of correct location as may be found after full investigation and inquiry.

21. Where a measurement discloses a boundary of land surveyed to be longer than is indicated in the document of title to such land the surveyor shall verify the length of such boundary and make appropriate entries in his field notes, and show in such notes and in any plan of the survey the monuments adopted. In the absence of monuments defining the land surveyed he shall indicate whether there is sufficient land available to permit the adoption of such measurement without causing any encroachment upon any road street or land or upon any adjoining or adjacent parcel of land.

22. A surveyor shall indicate in his field notes and in any plan of the survey the nature and position of all monuments found by him. A monument shall not be recorded as missing, lost, or destroyed unless a thorough search for it has been made, and when it is so recorded measurements to its probable site shall be entered in the field notes. Where a surveyor ascertains during the making of a survey that a previously established reference mark or control mark is missing he shall report that fact to the Surveyor-General.

23. (a) Where since the date of any survey there has been a change in the position of any non-tidal stream forming a boundary of land to be surveyed caused otherwise than by gradual and imperceptible accretion or erosion, then in any subsequent survey, the position of such bank as it was immediately before such change shall be relocated after examination of all relevant accessible information.

(b) The middle line of a stream shall not be determined by offsets nor marked unless the purpose for which the survey is made so requires.

Part V—Irrregular Boundaries

24. Where the land surveyed has an irregular natural feature as a boundary a surveyor shall take such measurements as may be necessary to accurately determine each change of course or direction of the boundary.

25. (a) Where a crooked fence must be used to define a boundary a surveyor shall carefully traverse it and place the angle points of the boundary in such a way that the boundary shall not leave the material of the fence at the surface of the ground.

(b) Angle points shall be substantially marked by him, and the nature thereof shown on the plan.

(c) He shall connect corners or angles placed within a post to the centre of such post as at the surface of the ground and shall note the measurements on the plan.

Part VI—Nature and Position of Marks

26. (a) Where any line or corner of any portion of a survey is required to be marked in accordance with these Directions, the points to be marked shall be firmly marked with a peg, drill hole in rock, concrete, or other similar material, a chisel mark or nail in fixed timber, or otherwise suitably marked.

(b) In surveys of blocks of five thousand square metres or more, all pegs shall be of sound durable wood at least three hundred and

fifty millimetres long and not less than seventy-five millimetres by seventy-five millimetres section at the top end.

(c) In surveys of blocks of less than five thousand square metres all pegs shall be of sound durable wood at least three hundred millimetres long and not less than seventy-five millimetres by forty millimetres section at the top end.

(d) Angles and tangent points along road or street frontages shall be marked with pegs of sound durable wood at least three hundred and fifty millimetres long and not less than seventy-five millimetres by seventy-five millimetres section at the top.

(e) Where it is not practicable to place a peg or mark for any specific corner and a line peg or mark is to be placed along a boundary or its prolongation as near as practicable to that corner the points to be marked shall be firmly marked with a peg of sound durable wood at least three hundred millimetres long and not less than fifty millimetres by fifty millimetres section at the top end, drill hole in rock, concrete, or other similar material, a chisel mark or nail in fixed timber, or otherwise suitably marked.

(f) All pegs shall be pointed for approximately two-thirds of their length and shall be bevelled at the top.

(g) The centre of the top of all pegs shall represent the survey point, provided that where conditions prevent the correct centering of pegs a tack shall be placed eccentrically to represent the survey point.

(h) All pegs are to be placed upright in the ground point downwards so that the top is not more than seventy-five millimetres above the ground level and the surrounding earth shall be securely rammed.

(i) Lockspits shall consist of trenches one point five metres long, two hundred millimetres wide at the surface and one hundred and fifty millimetres deep dug in the direction of the boundary lines and commencing three hundred millimetres from each peg or may consist of packed stones of similar dimensions.

(j) Where any corner or angle is marked with a drill hole, chisel mark or galvanised iron nail in fixed timber, where practicable wings shall be cut in solid rock, concrete or fixed timber seventy-five millimetres long, twenty millimetres wide and ten millimetres deep commencing fifty millimetres from the corner or where the surface renders it desirable lines may be painted at least three hundred millimetres long and twenty millimetres wide.

27. (a) Where a surveyor is required to place reference marks in accordance with these Directions they shall consist of:

(i) a reinforced concrete block in the form of a truncated pyramid at least three hundred and seventy-five millimetres long one hundred and fifty millimetres square at the lower end and one hundred millimetres square at the upper end with a galvanised nail or other suitable metal plug not less than seventy five millimetres long inserted therein, or

(ii) a galvanised iron pipe at least three hundred millimetres long and ten milli-

metres internal diameter with a wall thickness of not less than three millimetres thick, or

- (iii) a galvanised iron spike at least one hundred millimetres long driven into fixed timber with a wing seventy-five millimetres long cut into the timber and directed thereto, or
 - (iv) a drill hole cut into a kerb or other substantial structure at least five millimetres in diameter and ten millimetres deep with a wing seventy-five millimetres long and directed thereto, or
 - (v) a drill hole at least ten millimetres in diameter and twenty-five millimetres deep cut into bedrock with a wing seventy-five millimetres long and directed thereto where such bedrock exists within three hundred millimetres of the natural surface of the ground, or
 - (vi) an appropriate chisel mark cut into the sound wood of a suitable tree, or
 - (vii) a mark of a durable character or a specific point on a permanent or substantial structure.
- (b) The marks referred to in sub-clauses (a) (i) and (a) (ii) of this Direction shall be placed vertically with the upper surface thereof at least one hundred millimetres below the natural surface of the ground, or where placed on a boundary upon which netting fence is likely to be erected, sufficiently deep to permit the erection of the fence without disturbance of the mark.
- (c) Where a surveyor is required to place a reference mark the requirement shall include the connection by measurement from the mark to the survey made by him.
- (d) Where a surveyor has placed or has found a reference mark referred to in sub-clauses (a) (i) and (a) (ii) of this Direction or a control mark substantially more than three hundred millimetres below the natural surface of the ground the depth shall be indicated on the plan.
28. (a) Where these Directions require a surveyor to place reference marks he shall place them adjacent to a corner, angle or line mark, in selected positions designed to preserve them from disturbance, excepting that where a tree or monument is used it should not be more than twenty-five metres from the corner, angle or line mark to which it is connected.
- (b) Where a reference mark is placed in a road it shall be placed at a suitable distance from the existing road boundary; such distance shall be determined at the discretion of the surveyor having regard to the existence of any water, lighting or other service for which provision is or has to be made.

Part VII—Accuracy of Surveys

29. Areas of land of irregular form shall be computed by the method of double longitudes. Where it is necessary to adjust the latitudes and departures for the computation of the area Bowditch's Rule shall be used.

30. A surveyor who makes a survey which exceeds a length of ten kilometres on level or undulating country, eight kilometres on steep country or six kilometres on mountainous country shall check his

angular work by astronomical observations or by a complete angular close and shall not, for this purpose, interpolate any angular measurement made by another surveyor.

31. Wherever practical a complete angular close shall be obtained. The observed angular misclose shall not exceed 30 seconds plus $20\sqrt{n}$ seconds where 'n' is the number of traverse angular stations either for the whole surround or between and including stations at which astronomical observations for azimuth have been made; provided always that any misclose shall not exceed three minutes.

32. A surveyor shall check all measurements and where the nature of the survey permits the check shall be by the closure of the latitudes and departures of the lines in all surrounds in the survey computed to three places of decimals of a metre in the case of an urban survey or at least two places of decimals in the case of a rural survey. The accuracy of the survey shall be such that the ratio of the misclose to the perimeter shall not exceed for boundaries and parts of boundaries crossing:

- (a) level country one part in 8000
- (b) undulating country one part in 6000
- (c) steep country one part in 4000
- (d) mountainous country one part in 3000

The misclose shall be determined as $\sqrt{(a^2 + b^2)}$ where 'a' is the error in latitude and 'b' is the error in departure.

33. (a) A surveyor shall in making a survey, measure all lengths to a degree of accuracy so that the probable error of such measurements shall not exceed, for lines crossing:

- (i) level country one part in 12000
- (ii) undulating country one part in 9000
- (iii) steep country one part in 6000
- (iv) mountainous country one part in 4500

(b) Where lines in a survey are so short that the above standard would demand precision ordinarily unattainable such lines shall be so measured as to maintain the best possible standard consistent with the nature of the land measured over.

(c) For the purpose of this Direction and of Directions 30 and 32, country shall be deemed to be:

- (i) level, where slopes do not exceed 3 degrees;
- (ii) undulating, where slopes vary between 3 and 10 degrees;
- (iii) steep, where slopes vary between 10 and 15 degrees; and
- (iv) mountainous, where slopes are greater than 15 degrees.

Part VIII—Identification Surveys and Remarkings

34. (a) A surveyor may make:

- (i) a survey (commonly known as an Identification Survey) of a previously measured parcel of land for the purpose of re-identification of the boundaries thereof, or of its location in relation to adjoining interests in such a manner as may be required by the nature of such survey;

(ii) a survey requiring the remarking of a previously surveyed parcel of land in such a manner and with such marks in such position as may be specially required by the client, but such survey shall not

- include one required in connection with any disposition of land or of any interest in land.
- (b) Where such a survey is made in accordance with this Direction, the provision of Direction 5 and of sub-clauses (ii) and (iii) of clause (a) and of clause (b) of Direction 6 and of Directions 33 and 36 to 42 both inclusive (but no other provision of these Directions) shall apply in respect thereof.
35. (a) A surveyor may make a survey for a purpose not requiring strict accuracy under arrangements made between himself and his client and in such a manner and with such marking as may be agreed upon between them. A sketch made in accordance with this Direction shall show monuments as approximately located.
- (b) The surveyor making such a survey shall endorse on the sketch a certificate in or to the effect of Form 2 in the Schedule to these Directions.
- (c) Where a survey is made in accordance with this Direction no other provision of these Directions shall apply in respect thereof.

Part IX—Field Notes

36. A surveyor shall make neat, precise, complete, and readily intelligible field notes of every survey in accordance with the usage of surveyors, with indices and cross references in such manner as would facilitate the preparation of a complete and accurate plan therefrom without recourse to any other records and without verbal explanation. No erasures shall be made. Amendments shall be initialised by the surveyor.
37. A surveyor shall record in the field notes all the facts, readings and observations immediately they are ascertained by him, together with co-efficients of standardisation and calibration of measuring equipment.
38. A surveyor shall enter in the field notes the date, station and latitude thereof, and full particulars of all astronomical observations made in the course of the survey.
39. A surveyor shall clearly indicate in the field notes the datum line of the survey and the origin of the azimuth adopted by him.
40. A surveyor shall observe and record all angles or bearings in the field notes in degrees, minutes, and decimal parts of minutes or seconds of arc and all bearings shall be reckoned and expressed clockwise from zero to three hundred and sixty degrees.
41. A surveyor shall enter in the field notes the names of estates, houses, roads, streets, lanes, rivers, creeks, lakes and the like, and house numbers as far as material to the survey and ascertainable by him.
42. A surveyor shall sign as evidence that the work shown in the field book was performed by him or under his supervision as defined in these Directions, each page or sheet of the field notes in ink and shall indicate thereon the date on which the work recorded on such page was performed.
45. A surveyor shall show the datum line of the azimuth of a survey in the plan by distinguishing letters placed at the terminals thereof and the nature of the marks defining the datum line shall be noted therein.
46. A surveyor shall indicate on the plan of a survey the nature of any corner, angle or line mark placed by him which is not a peg and the nature of any reference mark placed by him or tree or object or monument with the essential measurements therefrom to the nearest corner, angle or line mark.
47. A surveyor shall show in a plan of a re-survey or of a subdivision:
- (a) the nature of the boundaries at the time of the re-survey or the subdivision whether defined by marks, pegs, lockspits, lines, fences, roads, streets, lanes, ways, natural or artificial features, buildings or walls. If a wall is on a boundary, the boundary shall be described in the plan as 'face of wall' or 'passing through wall', or otherwise appropriately. A wall shall not be described as a 'party wall' except in accordance with Section 32 *City Area Leases Ordinance* 1936-1976, and
- (b) the width of all walls used in common and the position of the boundary therein, and
- (c) offsets to all physical objects relevant to the survey and within three metres of the boundaries.
48. (a) Where a surveyor furnishes a plan of a survey made by him or under his supervision, he shall endorse thereon a certificate in or to the effect of Form 1 in the Schedule to these Directions.
- (b) Such certificate may be incorporated in any certificate required by Regulation made under any other Ordinance to be endorsed on such plan.
49. On receipt of a requisition from the Surveyor-General or the Registrar of Titles to amend a survey plan or to supply information concerning a survey or plan and which amendment or information is necessary to complete the plan in terms of these Directions, the surveyor concerned shall promptly comply with the requisition.
